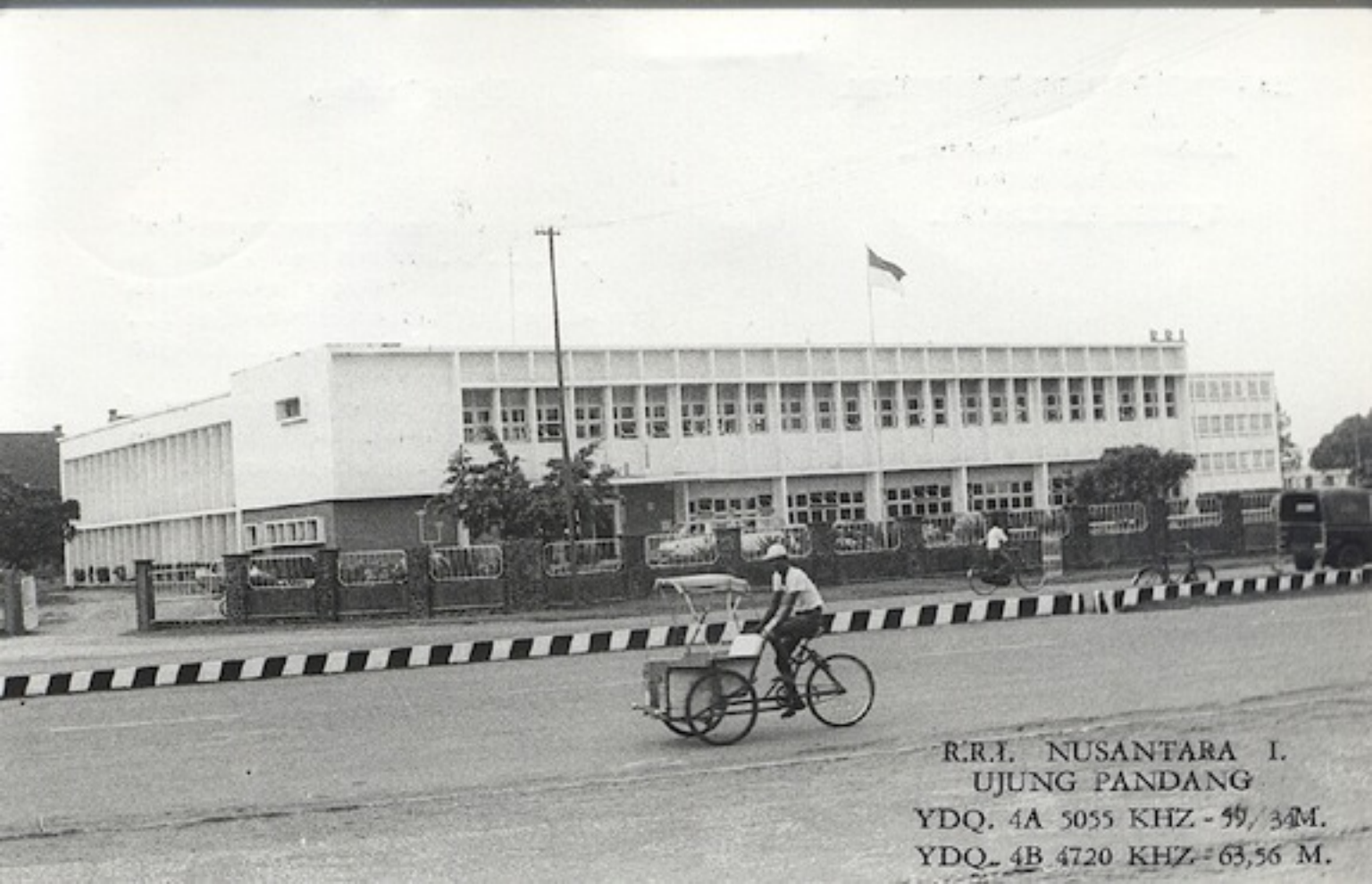


First of all I would like to thank you very much for your long letter, mentioning your reception of our transmissions on December 1st and 16th, 1973.

We have checked the details and we are happy to inform you that they correspond wholly with our station-log. We have been receiving so many reports in the last 4 months, so that we are a little bit exhausted to answer them. But really, we appreciate very much all the reports, because from these we are able to imagine in which countries our transmissions can be heard clearly, although the main aim of our broadcast is to cover East -- Indonesia.

Well, Indonesia is so far from your country, but I can tell you that tourism has grown very rapidly in the last few years. The number of hotels appropriate for foreign tourists and the number of travel bureaus have both increased. Ujung-Pandang, formerly known as Makassar, possesses certain advantages in the form of good tourist potentials like many places of interest, both from the point of cultural expression and natural beauty.

The city is populated with 650.000 people. It has a beautiful harbour, which is the chief port of East Indonesia. The climate is hot but is tempered by sea-winds which reach every part. Temperature ranges between 72 and 86 degrees Fahrenheit with extremes of 94 and 66 degrees, but it falls below 50 degrees at high altitudes on the mountains. At Ujung Pandang rainfall averages 116.11 inches with an average of 132 rainy days annually. Last but not least we would like to thank you once again for the report and hope that you will continue listening to our programmes.



Dear Sir,

First of all I would like to thank you very much for your letter of December 9th, 1974, mentioning, that you had listened to RRI Sorong on September 16th, 1974 on approximately 4872, but did not get any reply. After checking the details, you wrote in the letter to RRI - Sorong, I am convinced, that you had really listened to its programmes, because they correspond wholly with their Station-log, they sent to us.

They were outlets of RRI Sorong's Transmitter, operating on 4872,5 KHz or 61,57 metres, a 10 Kilowatt Transmitter for regional service. It is important to know, that not every regional station in Indonesia is allowed to answer letters from abroad, especially those stations, which have no English speaking officials. Letters received from abroad by these stations should be sent to the Development and International Cooperation division of the Radio Republik Indonesia in Jakarta. Its address is: Development and International Cooperation Division, Directorate of Radio c/o Department of Information of the Republic of Indonesia, Jalan Merdeka Barat 9 Postbox 157, Jakarta. This division undertakes audience research, cultural research (transcription) and the development of radio programmes. It maintains also relations with listeners and broadcasting organisations abroad for programme-exchange. It promotes International cooperation with other countries in the field of broadcasting. It also takes care of the implementation of foreign aid concerning broadcasting matters.

I hope this information will be of any use to you.

Last but not least, I would like to thank you once again for the reception report of RRI Sorong, which/ indeed under our direct control. To end this letter I would like wish you all the best.
