Since March 29th when President Coolidge in the White House pressed the button starting operation of the 10,000 watt transmitter of the National Battery Station, the KSTP daily schedule has grown steadily. Today the National Battery Station has the largest staff of any station west of New York and is producing the heaviest schedule (103 hours per week) of any station outside of New York and Chicago.

KSTP is broadcasting on an exclusive channel, 220.4 meters wave length, 1360 kilocycles frequency. We would like very much to know what kind of entertainment and service features you prefer, and particularly, which of our entertainment programs are the most interesting to you.

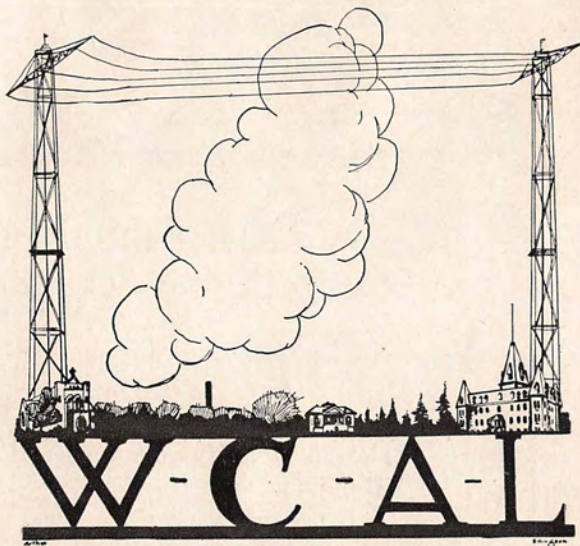
