



Using three transmitters for its regular programs, (and occasionally HC-1JB, too, on 14, 420 kc) HCJB broadcasts simultaneously on the following frequencies: 8831 kc.; 4107 kc.; 974 kc. This service reaches world-wide, national and local listeners daily (exc. Mon.) on the following schedule: 7 to 8:15 AM.; 11:30 AM. to 2:30 PM.; 4:45 to 10:15 PM. All time noted is Eastern Standard.

Details on HCIJB will be found on other pages. Power in the antennae on above HCJB frequencies respectively is 1 KW.: 200 watts; 50 watts.
