Eastern Standard Time on 24 meters, and tell your friends to do the same. A happy, inspiring message from "Uncle John" and Mrs. Meredith of the Family Bible League every day (exc. Monday) along with music from the Staff members. Special souvenirs announced during this broadcast.

The typical music of Ecuador and her sister Latin American Republics is featured daily Tuesdays thru Saturdays by HCJB in its "Andean Serenaders" program at 6:20 P. M. EST. Knowing that our listeners appreciate hearing the distinctive features characteristic of the life and people of this part of the world. "The Voice of the Andes" attempts faithfully to introduce and interpret the nations of the Americas" to each other.

Listen for the "pasillos", "san juanitos", and "yaravis" of the "Andean Serenaders" and see if the peculiar but most interesting rhythms and melodies don't intrigue you to tune in again!

SWEDISH AND RUSSIAN PROGRAMS FROM HCJB.

Beginning Sunday, June 22nd, the Pioneer Missionary Broadcaster increased the scope of its ministry by introducing Gospel programs in two new foreign languages, Swedish and Russian. A Staff member of HCJB, Mr. Reuben E. Larson, Co-Director, preaches for Scandinavian Listeners at 5 P. M. EST. each Sunday.

Cooperating with HCJB, the Russian Gospel Association, Peter Deyneka, General Director, of Chicago, Ill., is transcribing special programs of Russian music and messages in this language to be broadcast regularly from "The Voice of the Andes", It is hoped that this new venture will provide a means

for thousands of Russian refugees scattered around the world to hear the Gospel story.

The Russian program is on the air Sunday at 5:15 P. M., EST.

In addition to the Staff programs "Heralding Christ Jesus' Blessings" from the ancient Inca capital of Quito, several of the outstanding Gospel programs of North America are heard regularly thru this South American outlet, reaching the four corners of the earth. "The Old Fashioned Revival Hour" of Charles E. Fuller, Los Angeles is "on the air" from HCJB Sunday nights at 9:30 EST. "The Lutheran Hour" with Dr. Walter A. Maier at the microphone is broadcast Wednesdays at 9:30 P. M. EST. In addition the Spanish version of both these prominent and popular programs is sent out thru HCJB at other hours.

Dr. "Bob" Jones, of Bob Jones College, Cleveland, Tenn., has been often heard thru "The Voice of the Andes"; as well as C. L. Eicher, D. Paul Hoffman, Howard W. Ferrin, and many other radio preachers of the States and Canada. The Moody Bible Institute presents its program, "Miracles and Melodies" thru HCJB Saturday nights.

Bible Broadcasters St. Louis, Mo., Wheaton College have been offering its musical groups along with other educational institutions by transcription from Quito. These records are forwarded by train

to Miami, from which point they travel air express, completing the full three thousand mile journey in a few days.
