- [00:52] 810 kHz, December 31, 1975, 1400, New Year message

## 1976

- [01:05] 3910 kHz, Winter 1976, 1700, ID for 3910
- [01:22] 810 kHz, May 12, 1976, 0000, full ID and national anthem

## 1977

- [03:59] 810 kHz, January 21, 1977, 0000, full ID (including Philippine channels)
- [05:11] 810 kHz, January 21, 1977, 1800, "Everybody's Radio, Radio 810, Tokyo," FEN Evening Report
- [05:48] *Please disregard*
- [06:04] 89.1 FM Okinawa, June 5, 1977, 1200, sporadic E reception in Tokyo
- [06:26] 11750 kHz, August 11, 1977, 1500, ID for 11750
- [07:09] 11750 kHz, August 22, 1977, 0606, full ID including Philippine channels

## 1978

- [08:27] 3910 kHz, November 1978, 1900, Kanto FM, closed circuit FM around Tokyo area, relayed on 3910
- [09:09] 1580 kHz Iwakuni, November 22, 1978, 2300, notice of frequency change due to 9 kHz separation
- [09:54] 1575 kHz, November 23, 1978, 0600 - Location not certain
- [10:32] 810 kHz, December 9, 1978, 0005, national anthem and full ID (no Philippine channels)

## 1979

- [12:42] 810 kHz, January 1, 1979, 1500, New Year's message

## 1980

- [13:32] 810 kHz, January 1, 1980, 0000, Happy New Year

## 1984

- [16:55] 810 kHz, July 17, 1984, 0000, full ID

## 1988

- [18:21] 810 kHz, October 6, 1988, 0000, full ID (3910 and 6155 kHz were no longer in use)
