Dear Mr. Tuner,

Thank you for your letter of January 9 reporting on special point to point broadcast by the Voice of America Liberia transmitter. This is a special two-way transmission between the VOA African Program Center in Monrovia using a VOA 50 kw mobile transmitter operating on 18515 Kcs with a 20 kw power and presently using normal AM transmitter soon to be transformed to single side band, and the VOA in Washington D.C. using the VOA single\*band transmitter at Greenville, North Carolina operating on 18275 kc with a power of 5 kw. \*side

This transmission normally starts at 1300 GMT and runs no later than 1345 GMT, except on very unusual occasions and may be as short as five minutes. Its purpose is to send program material from the African Program Center to the Voice of America in Washington for broadcast on the African or other Services, and receive program material from VOA Washington for placement on West African radio stations.

We confirm the special broadcast you heard as a report of the inauguration of the new Executive Mansion but our records do not agree on the minute on time. We appreciate very much your report of reception of the Monrovia transmission and hope that you enjoy listening to the regular broadcasts of the VOA European Service.
