Dear Sir,

I wish to thank you very much for your reception report on transmissions from our new transmitter operating from Manila.

The Manila Plant is operating purely as a relay unit for the United States "Voice of America" transmitters on Far East coverage. Operating hours at present are from 0900 to 1505 GMT on the following language and beam schedules.

1130 - 1200	Korean	Manchuria
1200 - 1300	Chinese	China

1345 - 1400	Siamese	Burma
1400 - 1505	English	N. E. I.

Our transmitter operates on 11840 kilocycles at a rated carrier power output of 50 kilowatts and is fed into rhombics for coverage to the various areas.

I wish I had more time to give you a complete description of the plant, but as we have so many listener's reports to answer, I am afraid it is rather impossible at the moment.

Future reports on the reception conditions in your area from our transmissions would be appreciated.
