<u>Mcs.</u>	<u>Station, Location, Operating Hours and Other Information</u>
15.105	JLG4, Tokyo, Japan, announced it is sending this program at 7 P.M., ZWT, over JLG4, 15.105; JZJ, 11.80 and the early portion of it over JRHA on 9.565 mcs. This latter station is located at Parao in the Palau group of the Caroline Islands. A new country to try for. JRHA has not been heard here as yet.
12.235	TFJ, Reykjavik, Iceland, heard Tuesdays at 4:30 P.M. talking to New York. Relays program to NBC at 4:45 P.M.
12.125	RADIO FRANCE, no location given, but announces as one of the "Voice of America." All French programs.
11.780	RADIO SAIGON, Saigon, French Indo-China, heard again March 8 after an absence of several weeks. Good signal! News in French at 9 A.M. War Prisoners at 9:45 and news in English at 10 A.M. Usually fades at about 10:30 A.M. Not heard on its regular schedule for North America from 11:30 A.M. to noon.
11.720	CONGO BELGE, Leopoldville, Belgian Congo, has the best signal on this band at 2:30 P.M. They play popular dance music.
	CJRX, Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, again using 11.72 mcs. at 1 P.M. with popular dance music. Good signal but CJRX fades rapidly in and out.
7.280	RADIO TUNIS, the French station on this band, definitely announces as "Radio TUNES" at 7 P.M. just at sign-off. This sounds reasonable as 12 strokes on a clock gong announce the hour as 12 P.M.
7.220	RADIO FRANCE, all French but is using I24011, Rome and announces as the same. Has anyone else further information on this one? Two stations using the same call - one Axis-controlled and the other run by the Allies. The other station on 12.125 mcs. is believed to be in Africa as it begins to fade about the same time as do the other African stations on this band.
7.210	CMZ1, Havana, Cuba, "Voice of Democracy", announces that it is using a frequency of 7.19 mcs. but that is incorrect as I am using an accurate frequency meter; this station actually is on 7.21 mcs. They offer a copy of their Police magazine and picture of Havana to those reporting reception. I'll report if they send me a police club like the one Lloyd Hahn got from their broadcast band station.
7.204	Madrid, Spain, best of the stations in that country, signs off at 7 P.M. with the national anthem.
6.755	WOA, Lawrenceville, N.J., is used for relays to Europe for the Columbia Broadcasting System.
