SALUTATION!

Owners of all-wave receivers, beware of turning these pages for within lurks that bug called "short-wave enthusiasm." Unless on your guard, it will bite you in the end—that is, eventually—and, once bitten, the fever must run its course. Read on at your peril.

Economists teach that it is business acumen to seek the greatest return, with the least risk, from an investment. With no risk, your radio investment yields pleasure—an abundance of pleasure—at your command merely by turning the knob! Be not content to listen only to local entertainment, but venture farther afield! Explore the short-wave spectrum! The pleasant surprises there to be discovered are infinite!

The Quixote Radio Club, now in its fourth year, was conceived in Habana—Cubita bella—where American programs, free of local interference, could be heard only by short-wave. Our interest remains perhaps even as yours, primarily in distant reception of program value. Hence we prefer to style ourselves "mildly DXers," DX being the telegraphic symbol for "distance."

A rule inviolate of the Club is, therefore, that members shall sleep at least every third night! Members are they who subscribe to this magazine, each subscriber being assigned a distinctive number in evidence of such membership. It is due to the enthusiastic cooperation of the QRC Members that the publication of this magazine has been possible. We take pride in the fact that the features developed by this Club are unique! Comparison with others, even remotely similar, will at once reveal their superlative merit! Precision and accuracy are our watch-words! To your enjoyment, the following is dedicated:

THE "F. B." LOG

In this feature, you have the most useful and accurate log anywhere to be found. Without fear of successful contradiction we say this, because it is no ordinary list of authorized frequencies in desuetude. Instead, it is a list of stations really in operation whose frequencies have been checked with precision instruments. With absolute confidence in its accuracy, you can set your calibration by it. This is but the first instalment. Other instalments will follow until the whole is complete from 5,600 to 21,600 kc. The sta-

tions are spaced in exactly the same relative position in which they will be found on the dial of your receiver. The frequencies given are actual frequencies, regardless of assignments or announcements. Be not confused if these be at variance with other published logs. These are correct! This log is the result of several years of careful observation—it is highly accurate—in a word, it is the best, and you should by all means have the best!

STATION DATA

Alphabetically listed by call signals, for your convenience, you have here authentic details helpful in identifying the stations you log. The frequencies shown in this section are generally the assigned or announced frequencies. A few stations, unlikely to be heard in America, have been omitted purposely!

BROADCAST SCHEDULE

This section shows graphically, in Eastern Standard Time, the hours of usual operation. Since the publication of schedules in several standards of time is not feasible, it is recommended that you simplify the conversion by moving your clock to E. S. T. Until officially checked by the QRC, the frequencies used here are those assigned or announced. Upon being checked, if habitually off-frequency, they may be so shown. This graphic form of composition is expensive, but, we believe, most convenient for you, and your convenience is our objective. That you may find it most helpful is our wish!

THE CONNOISSEUR PLAN!

This QRC feature, of proven popularity, has already produced more than 25,000 reports. It is not a contest with prizes for a favored few, but constructive cooperative effort with awards for everyone entitled to them. You render a useful service while amusing yourself. Briefly, it is this:

For ten reports each, on the reception of any thirty short-wave broadcast stations, submitted on QRC forms, the QRC will confer the title "Connoisseur of Short-Wave Reception," and award, as a prize, the listener's choice of any National Geographic Society map, mounted on linen, or, if preferred, any prize of like value.

The name of a musical selection, part of an announcement, or the name of a product advertised is a sufficient log. Listeners tune when, as and if they please, reporting upon any number of stations, but, to earn an award, their reports on at least thirty stations must total ten each. "Broadcast" does not include point-to-point relays, commercial telephone, special services nor amateurs. These do not, as a rule, request reports of casual listeners. For uniformity and convenience in handling, the use of QRC Forms for all Connoisseur Reports, including those for verification, is prerequisite. Sufficient forms for 100 reports will be supplied post-paid for 10c. With each report entered, remit $\frac{1}{2}c$. Of this sum $\frac{1}{4}c$ applies to the prize to be received
