Afghanistan. Radio Kabul now to Europe in English 1900-1930 on
9705 kc/s. Good strength but under heavy interferences.
(A.J.Francis, Bradford on Avon, Wiltshire, England.)

Bulgaria. Radio Sofia, now on Winter schedule, in German 2005-
2055 on 6070 and 12150 kc/s. (Ginter Seifert, Zwickau/Sachs.Germ)

The Congo. Radio Congo, B.p. 3171, Leopoldville, has now been
heard testing at 1700-1900 and 2200-2400 hrs on 11755 kc/s,
although announcing 11795 kc/s, according to many reports.

Ethiopia. Radio Addis Abeba, P.O.Box 1364, Addis Abeba, was
before the coup d'état heard testing 1820-1850 on 11955 and
17775 kc/s, and until 2045 on 17775 kc/s. At earlier occasions
also around 2020 on 15335 kc/s. (Dieter Unger, Aachen, Reinland,
Germany, and B.E.Bassey, Ilorin, North Nigeria.) Also heard
recently 1820-1840 on 11875 kc/s. (Horst H.Emker, Münchener Str.
40, Bremen, Germany.)

Italy. The station at Caltanissetta mentioned last week, relays
the night programme "Notturmo Dall'Italia" at 2235-0530, which
is broadcast over Roma II on 845 kc/s and Caltanissetta A on 0515
kc/s. The news is read in English and Italian on the hour and in
French and German on ½ hour, acc. to a letter from London.

On Dec. 8th Radio Roma started Italian lessons for 10
minutes in the German service Tuesdays and Fridays 2040-2100 hrs
on 5960 and 7275 kc/s. (Franz Beitelmaier, Marchtrenk, Austria.)

Katanga. Acc. to a letter confirming an earlier reports from
Radio Katanga, Elisabethville, they now use low power, but 20
and 50 kW transmitters are expected soon. Then R.Katanga will
begin transmissions in foreign languages, with special emphasis
on English. In the mean time, reception reports are very much
welcomed. Proper address is: Radio Katanga, B.P. 1152, Elisabeth-
ville, Katanga State, via Brussels and Usumbura. Excellent now
on 11865 kc/s from 1730 to 2000 hrs and thereafter. (Jerry Berg,
W.Hartford, Conn., USA, H. Van der Laan, Rijssen, Netherlands,
and N.J.Jensen, Frederikshavn, Denmark.) Also in the mornings at
0510-0530. (Richard Orcutt, 2807 SW 15th Ave, Ft.Lauderdale,
Florida, USA.)

Liberia. On Dec. 12th ELWA commenced tests towards N.America in
French at 2015-2100 hrs, in Arabic at 2100-2130, in Portuguese at
2130-2200 hrs, and in an unknown language at 2200-2230, probably
English, over the 50 kW outlet on 15085 kc/s, acc. to a letter
from ELWA. (N.J.Jensen.)

Netherlands. From January there will be a couple of fq.-changes
in the English transmissions of Radio Nederland, Hilversum, viz.
at 1400-1450 when 15445 kc/s replaces 15425 kc/s, and at 2115-

2205 when 9950 kc/s replaces 15220 kc/s. (Stewart MacKenzie, Long Beach, Calif., USA.)

Nicaragua. On Boxing Day, Dec. 26th, there will be a special programme in English for the American Shortwave Listeners Club, broadcast by YNOL on 825 kc/s, featuring Drayton Cooper and Kenneth R. Boord. Time 0600-0630.

Senegal. Radio Senegal, Dakar, now testing to Europe 1745-1800 on 15115 kc/s. Announcements in French, German and English. Reports to Radio Senegal, B. 1765, Dakar, Senegal. (A.J. Francis)

Thailand. Radio Thailand, Bangkok, can now be heard on 11910 kc/s during the afternoons. (Horst H. Emker.)

U.S.A. WRUL, New York, has been heard at 2000 hrs with new programmes on the new fq. of 11780 kc/s. Still announces 15380, 17750 and also 11830 kc/s. (Alain Descrières, pce.pte. Champerret 11, Paris 17, France.)

Unidentified. Spanish speaking station on 11700 kc/s heard at 2230 to past 0100 hrs. Sounds like Radio Nacional, Guatemala. Probably TGQB. (Stewart MacKenzie.)

World Radio Handbook 1961, received here last week, - Lists Radio Vigo, Guayaquil, Ecuador, which we mentioned last week as a "Nibi-Nibi".

"Sweden Calling DX-ers!" will not be on the air next week, and there will be no English version of "Sweden Calling DX-ers!" on January 2nd.

Brazil. R. Mayrink Veiga can now be heard as early as 2030 on 9575 and 1175 kc/s. Heard around 2200 hrs on 25 m. are R. Difusora Sao Paulo on 11765 kc/s, R. Guaiba on 11785 kc/s, and R. Sociedad da Bahia on 11915 kc/s. (Peter Filmore, Hadleigh, Essex, England.)

Cambodia. Phnom-Penh audible at 0700 hrs on 17713 kc/s. Ann. in English, French and Cambodian, acc. to a rpt from London.

Costa Rica. Acc. to a current sched. TIFC, Faro del Caribe, San José, broadcasts on 1075, 6037 and 9645 kc/s, weekdays in Span. 1200-0400 hrs and English 0400-0500 hrs, Sundays in Spanish at 1230-2000, English 2000-2100, Spanish 2100-0400 and English at 0400-0500 hrs. (Bernard J.C. Brown, Derby, England.)

Cuba. R. Progreso, Havana, which hasn't been heard for several months, is audible on 9360 kc/s during late afternoons. (Richard Orcutt, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, USA.)

Fiji Islands. Suva Radio heard nightly on the new fq. 4755 kc/s at 0700 hrs. Programs in local language and commercials in pidgin English. (Pat McRodden, Naenae, New Zealand.)

Germany. On Jan. 1st "Deutschlandfunk" will commence broadcasts to E. Germany from Mainflingen near Frankfurt/Main. 50 kW on MW 1538 kc/s at 1500-2400 hrs, acc. to a German newspaper. (Wim Vijfvinkel, Rotterdam, Holland.)

Ghana. Acc. to a letter of Nov, 29th, R. Ghana now has solved the difficulty in keeping constant fq. on 6070 and 21545 kc/s. Invites reports especially on the 6070 and 17740 kc/s outlets. (Lawrence Amon Kotey, Engchi, W.R., Ghana.) R. Ghana heard in English at 2100-2130 on approx. 11740 kc/s. (Miss Shirley F. Salmon, Penzance, Cornwall, England.)

Israel. Kol Zion now on 11920 kc/s in parallel with 9009 kc/s to Europe in French and English. (C.J. Danpure.) Programs to S. Africa on 9009 kc/s in English at 1630-1700 hrs. Programs in French at 1945-2015. (Richard Ginbey, Vanderbijlpark, Transvaal, S. Africa. Manfred Koch, Calden, Germany.) Has a new verification card. (Jan Zwarteveen, Enschede, Holland.)

Jordan. Amman heard on 11810 kc/s with H.S. at 2200 hrs. On Dec. 24th there will be a transmission from the midnight mass in the Betlehem Church. Begins at 2200 hrs on 7155 kc/s. (Hans Grosser, E.-Berlin, Germany.)

Monaco. Trans World R. heard testing in English at 1845-1900 hrs on approx. 5920 kc/s. (P.C. Hunt, Edinburgh, Scotland.) In German now at 1130-1140, 1635-1705 and 1900-1925 on approx. 5933 kc/s. (Wim Vijfvinkel, Rotterdam, Holland.)

Mongolia. R. Ulan Bator transmits 1st Program on 227, 5067.5, 5960 and 10910 kc/s at 2255-1505, and 2nd Program on 5232.5 and 6383 kc/s at 0900-1405. On Mondays at 0600 hrs also a Russian transmission in the 2nd Program. Besides Mongolian

there are transmissions in Russian, Chinese and Kazakh, acc. to recent schedule received. (A. Farmer, Edinburgh, Scotland.)

Sarawak. Present sched. of R. Sarawak, Kuching, includes Early Morning Service at 2255-0015 on 730, 4950 and 7160 kc/s in English, Malay, Chinese and Dayark. Schools Broadcasting Serv. during school term time at 0100-0230 Monday-Friday on 730, 7160 and 9565 kc/s in English, and Dayark. Mid-day Service at 0400-0630 on 730, 7160 and 9565 kc/s in Malay, Chinese, Dayark, Biatak and English. Malay Service at 0830-1030 and 1245-1400 hrs, and a Dayark Service at 1100-1245 both on 850 and 4835 kc/s. A Chinese Service at 0830-1030 and 1200-1300, and an English Service at 1030-1200 and 1300-1430, Saturdays until 1500 hrs, both on 730 and 4950 kc/s. (Hans Jansson, Västerås, Sweden.)

Clandestine. R. Free Russia, N.T.S., has again been heard after some months of absence on approx. 12000 kc/s. Supposed to be located in Sprendlingen, near Frankfurt, Germany. (Benelux DX-Club.) Transmits from a mobile unit illegally somewhere in Central Europe. Changing location every day. Transmitting for 10 hours daily on 6424, 6787 and 10714 kc/s, acc. to the Norw. weekly "Nå" (Now). (Ellmann Ellingsen, Hamar, Norway.)

Unidentified. Sponsored programs in Spanish with some English tunes heard at 1930-2030 on approx. 11800 kc/s. (R. Holway, Taunton, Somerset, England.)

English Bank Rates heard on 15440 kc/s at 1010, s.off at 1015. (Frank C.P. Yin, Taipei, Taiwan.)

European station on 21720 kc/s with European records at 1000 hrs. (Frank C.P. Yin.)

When R. Brazzaville s.off in English at 0200 hrs a Spanish station "R. Victoria" can be heard on 11725 kc/s. Probably R. Victoria El Salvador, listed in W.R.H. as 1 kW and inactive. (Peter Filmore.)

A station, probably Russian, on 4500 kc/s heard around 2200 hrs. Id. 3 chimes. (Richard Orcutt, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. USA)

English speaking station around 0325 on approx. 6150, 9640 and 11790 kc/s. (Allen Tobin, Eau Claire, Wisconsin, USA.)

Club news. In a recent survey by the Short Wave Messenger, 5064 $\frac{1}{2}$ Narragansett Street, San Diego 7, Calif., USA, in regard to which DX programs were listened to regularly by the subscribers, 80% declared that they listen regularly to Australian DX-ers Calling Then followed the DX-programs from Berne 50%, HCJB Quito 30%, Sweden, Japan, 4VEH Haiti, and Netherlands 20%, New Zealand, Denmark and Deutsche Welle 10%.

Afghanistan. R. Kabul uses 5087 kc/s for H.S. and for India, Pak! and Iran. (Fritz Bittner, Göppingen, Germany.) Also heard on 9610 kc/s in French to Europe 1830-1900 hrs. (Ellmann Ellingsen, Hamar Norway, Uzarowicz Zdzislaw, Lowicz, Poland. and a report from Surrey, England.)

Argentina. R. Splendid, Buenos Aires, is audible on 9740 kc/s from 0757 until past 0830. QRM HCJB. (Mike Kander.)

Austria. Acc. to announcement, Vienna now uses 9610 kc/s only at 0600-0700 hrs. The transmission 0700-0900 hrs is therefore on 11785 kc/s. At 1000-1200 hrs on 21670 kc/s. The rest of the sched is unchanged. (Gunther Fischer, Sobernheim, W.-Germany.)

Bechuanaland. ZNB, Mafeking, 5900 kc/s, well heard around 0600-0800 hrs with messages to villages and outposts in the Kalahari Desert. (Raymond Mohr, Cape Town, South Africa.)

Belgium. During May 7th - Sept. 3rd ORU, B.P. 26, Brussels 1, broadcasts daily 1000-1200 hrs on 15335, 17845 and 17860 kc/s, 1215-1300 on 11850, 15335 and 17860 kc/s, Sundays and Saturdays 1330-1600 hrs on 15335, 17845 and 17860 kc/s, daily 1600-1645 on 11850 and 17860 kc/s, 1700-2100 hrs on 9745, 11850 and 15335 kc/s 2115-2300 on 6000, 11805 and 11850 kc/s, and 2315-0100 on 6000, 9705 and 9745 kc/s. English at 2030-2050 and 0000-0100 hrs except Mondays and Fridays when in Flemish to N. America at 0015-0100. (Roland Jonckheere, Ghent, Belgium. Fred Weidema, Arnhem, Holland and a schedule from B.R.T. direct.)

Congo. R. Katanga Nationale logged on approx. 5890 kc/s, QRM Mafeking on 5900 kc/s, at 0400 hrs broadcasting African jazz requests, continental music and news in French. In evenings 1600-2200 hrs there are news in French at 1700 and 1830 and in English at 2020. (Raymond Mohr.)

Czechoslovakia. On April 30th Prague made some fq. changes in the morning transmissions to Europe. German at 0900-1030 now on 6055 and 9505 kc/s, Swedish 1000-1030 on 7235, 9550 and 11725 kc/s, German for Austria 1030-1110 on 6055, 7235 and 9505 kc/s, French 1115-1140 on 7235, 9505 and 11725 kc/s. (Gerard Peet, Hilversum, Holland.)

Germany. On May 6th Die Deutsche Welle changed fq:s at 0945-1245 to 17815 and 21705 kc/s, 1600-1900 hrs to 11795 and 15405 and 0800-0930 to 17815 and 21705 kc/s. (Fred Weidema.)

Since some weeks back, the A.F.N. broadcasts a night progr. at 0000-0500 hrs on 935 kc/s and 99.75 mc/s. (Gerard Peet.)

Poland. R. Warsaw now to Africa at 1200-1400 in English, French, English and French on 7125, 11840 and 15120 kc/s. German at 1700-1730 and 1830-1900 hrs on 1205, 7285 and 9675 kc/s; 1930-2000 and 2100-2130 on 7285 and 9675 kc/s, and 2245-2315 on 227 kc/s. (Gerard Peet. Manfred Koch, Calden, Germany.)

U.S.A. WRUL, World Wide Broadcasting System, New York, now affiliated with the American Broadcasting Co., and broadcasts the A.B.C. news at 5 minutes before the hour, plus the WRUL news at 1530, 1730, 1930, 2130 and 2330. Sched. now Monday-Friday 1500-1830 on 15380, 15440, 17760, 17845 and until 1800 hrs also 21460 kc/s, daily 1830-2300 hrs on 15385, 15440, 17760 and 17845 kc/s, and 2315-0300 hrs on 9555, 9695, 11855 and 15390 kc/s. Sundays in Russian at 1830 and Spanish 1845-1905. Daily Spanish 0000-0300 hrs. New Verification card. (Allen Tobin, Eau Claire, Wisconsin, USA. Roy Patrick, Derby, England. WRUL.)

Trans World Radio, now broadcasting from Monaco, will operate from a transmitter site near Vega Baja, Puerto Rico, with 250 kW directed to N. Africa, Europe and S. America, acc. to application filed by the F.C.C., Washington, on March 1st. On Jan. 22nd application was filed for International Communications, Inc., for a 50 kW transmitter at Maury Island, Wash., with studios on the World Fair Grounds, for shortwave broadcasts to Mexico and C. & S. America. (Mike Kander.)

Unidentified. Brazilian, probably a new one, on 3285 kc/s, s. off at 0200 hrs. (Pentti Stenman, Tuomarila, Finland.)

Stn coming in with strong signals every day at 1830 to around 1925 on about 11695 kc/s. Lang. probably Urdu. (M. McNamara, Dublin, Ireland.)

Arab heard towards 2200 hrs on approx. 14250 kc/s with strong signals. (Detlef Schüler, Berlin-Pankow, E. Germany.)

 "Der Wellenjäger", published around the 10th and the 25th every month, is a fine DX-magazine edited by Hermann Jäger, Postfach 1230, Recklinghausen, W. Germany. First issue received.

Recordings presented: In English edition: Interview with Eric Gagneur, Vice-President, Finland's DX-Club. At the microphone: Arne Skoog.

In other editions: Radio Americas, recorded on 6000 kc/s at 0400 by Walter R. Wan, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, U.S.A. (Frequency seems to vary between 5990-6005 kc/s in order to avoid interference)

Angola. Rádio Clube do Bie, Silva Porto, now on 4995 kc/s in parallel with CR6EO, 7203 kc/s. Scheduled 0600-0745, 1130-1500 and 1600-2200. (Alex Danilescu, ONUC, Leopoldville, Congo)

Rádio Clube de Angola was heard at fairly good strength on 9632 kc/s until close down at 2203. (Richard Earnhardt, Charlotte, N.C., U.S.A.)

Rádio Clube de Huanbo, Nova Lisboa, is scheduled on shortwave as follows: 0600-0700 (Sun -1000), 1100-1300 (Sun -1330), 1430-1800 on 5060 & 7160 kc/s, 1800-2130 on 3704, 5060 & 7160 kc/s. At 1700-1800 on 3704 kc/s a programme in Umbundo.

Rádio Clube do Sul de Angola, Lobito, noted closing at 0700 on 7155 kc/s.

The new commercial 100 kW station, previously reported to come into operation from Moçâmedes, is scheduled to take the air early next year from Sá da Banderira, beaming programmes to South West Africa. (Richard Ginbey, Vanderbijl Park, Transvaal, South Africa)

Basutoland. This tiny British Protectorate is to be supplied with its own broadcasting station next year. Staff to be trained and the transmitter to be built by the BBC.

ZNE41, Maseru, operates Saturdays only at 0630-0715 on 3830 kc/s with programmes intended for teachers in the Protectorate. (Cf. DX-B. 710 & 711). (Richard Ginbey)

Brazil. The station on 4750 kc/s, referred to as Manaus in DX-B. 717, clearly is Radiodifusora do Maranhão in Sao Luis. (Richard Wood, Newcastle, England)

China. Radio Peking has just introduced new transmissions for West Africa in the Hausa dialect. These transmissions are carried daily on 9860 kc/s from 2030-2100 and again from 2100-2130. A French programme is broadcast at 2130-2230 (sign off). (Michael McGovern, Booterstown, Co. Dublin, Ireland). According to the British newspaper "The Guardian", Radio Peking is using a 100 kW tx in the republic of Guinea for its African Service. (Dennis W. Bradley, Manchester, England)

Congo (Brazzaville). Brazzaville is testing on 9520, 9675 and 11955 kc/s from 1800 onwards. (A. Danilescu). Cf DX-B. 717.

Congo (Leopoldville). Radio UFAC, Elisabethville, is using its old outlet of 4930 kc/s daily at 1545-1930. Transcribed religious programmes in English at 1600-1630 (irregularly) and 1630-1700 (daily). Other programmes consist of light and classical music, announced in French. (Richard Ginbey)

Fiji. VRH9, Suva, 3346 kc/s, is now in regular service in the Fiji Hindi service at 1800-1030. Opens in chain with 4756 kc/s, but later this channel is replaced by 3935 kc/s for evening transmissions. (Arthur T. Cushen, Invercargill, New Zealand)

Germany. Deutsche Welle has commenced a new service to Africa in Kiswahili (Swahili) at 0955-1055 on 15280 and 17870 kc/s. (A. Danilescu; A report from Surrey, England)

Greece. The Greek station previously reported on 7028 and 7000 kc/s at present provides a good signal from 1730 onwards on 7014 kc/s. FBS Serrai? (Ed.)

India. The million-watt station project, mentioned in DX-B. 715, has already caused much trouble in India. Thus India has asked for the abrogation of a clause in the agreement under which the VOA was to use the transmitter for 3 hours a day. However, U.S.A. considers such a modification out of the question. Instead the transmitter will probably be set up in Thailand. (From "The Guardian", sent in by R.G. Rose, Macclesfield, Cheshire, England)

Iran. Radio Iran, Tehran, now on 7100 kc/s at 1930-2100 in Persian, Turkish, Russian, French and (excl. Fridays) English. (Richard Ginbey)

Japan. Far East Network, Tokyo, is now using 3910 (ex-3800), 6155, 11750 and 15260 kc/s, all 24 hrs a day, except for short breaks when changing antenna beams and for periods of maintenance. Power 1 or 10 kW. (Schedule from the station; Arthur T. Cushen)

Mozambique. Emissor Regional do Norte (R. Clube de Moçambique); Caixa Postal 93, Nampula is scheduled on SW: Portuguese Service: 0700-0830 (sun only) on 4975 kc/s, 0930 (Sun 0900-)-1130 on 4975 and 7190 kc/s, 1530-1800 on 3300 kc 1800-2000 on 3300 and 4975 kc/s. Vernacular Service in Macua at 0600-0800 (Sun only) on 7190 kc/s, 1700-1800 on 4975 kc/s. (Richard Ginbey)

Peru. OCX4G, Radio Mundo, Huancayo, noted on 6160 kc/s until 0600. (Ginbey)
OAX7A, R. Cuzco, now on 6250 kc/s (varies), heard before 2300 until after 0400, loudly. (Richard Wood)

OCX4W, Radio Inca del Peru, 4765 kc/s, noted at 0430. OAX7K, R. Puno, 5830 kc/s sign off at 0500; OAX7Z, R. Juliaca, 5900 kc/s, also sign off at 0500; OAX7C, R. Tahuantisuyo, Cuzco, 6248 kc/s, off at 0510. (A.T. Cushen)

Rhodesias & Nyasaland. On Jan. 1, 1964, the Federation of the Rhodesias & Nyasaland will break up into three separate states, Zambia (N. Rhodesia), Malawi (Nyasaland) and Rhodesia (S. Rhodesia). Each state will operate its own broadcasting network, using existing facilities of the present FBC. (Richard Ginbey)

Solomon Island. Solomon Island Broadcasting Service, Honaira, uses additional station VQ03 on 3995 kc/s, operating Mon-Fri 0730-1100, Sat 0855-1115 and Sun 0855-1100, as well as VQ02, 5960 kc/s, and MW. (Arthur T. Cushen)

U.S.A. - WRUL, Radio New York, has moved from 11955 to 11950 kc/s to avoid interferences. (Roy Patrick, Derby, England)

Venezuela. Unid. station in DX-B. 717 on 6170 kc/s is R. Nacional in Caracas. On 6165 kc/s is Emisora Nueva Granada, Bogotá, Colombia - not on 6160 as listed. (Richard Wood)

Yemen. Has moved to 5980 kc/s. (A. Danilescu). This outlet probably is the one located in Sanaa. Cf. DX-B. 716.

Unidentified. Station mentioned in DX-B. 713 operates on 7940 & 15715 kc/s, not 9740 & 11715 as reported. Often heard announcing "Radio Africa" or "Radi Umbombo, The Voice of Africa" in English, French and Portuguese. Heard on Mon-Fri only, e.g. at 1515-1615. Also with a General Service at 1700-1900 and Overseas Service at 1000-1040 and 1130-1210. One day heard with a test to the Middle East at 1130-1200, never heard since. (Richard Ginbey).
