This was ordered to be put in the next Bulletin so that all members sending in DX reports will understand how these reports are to be sent in.

Some months ago I mentioned an item in our Bulletin that was BC from the BBC. This item was quickly noted by our friend Luc' D'Helst LaFere founder and head of the CXC (Card Exchange Club) of Box 38, Bruges Belgium. Here is his reply: O.K. about the "Belgian" language. It is not the first time the BBB made such a mistake. Belgium has three languages: Flemish (which is about the same language as Dutch and Afrikaans which is spoken by 4.5 million people living to the north of a straight line going west to east from the French border midway between Courtrai and Tournai about 20 kilometres south of Brussels (capitol situated in the Flemish part of the country and called Brussels in Flemish and Bruxelles in French) to about 20 kilometres north of Liege (called LUIK in Flemish). Most Flemish people speak French as second language, and many people speak English and German (not to speak of Dutch and Afrikaans which are about the same languages as Flemish).

Wallon or French is spoken southwards of the line mentioned above and by 3,5 million people. Generally they only know their own language but many nevertheless learn Flemish at their schools just as we learn French.

German is spoken in the eastern cantons (Eupen, Malmedy, St. Vith) by about 0,5 million people. They mostly speak French and understand Flemish because Flemish, Dutch, Afrikaans and German are cousin languages.

There is still a nationalist question in Belgium between the Flemish and Wallon extremists. The only solution would be a federated Belgian government. I am not one of the extremists. They are only a small minority. We, Flemish people like the Wallons very much but the Flemish people ask for their rights since the independence of Belgium in 1830. Now we are on the same base as the Walloons but about 25 years ago all administrations used French and most people didn't even understand what was told them or what was written them. Now most Flemish people speak and write French and all administrations in the Flemish part of the country use Flemish only.

"VOICE" - The Courier docked at Athensport, nearby Piraeus on the 18th of August preparatory to beginning bc's to Iron Curtain countries. They remained in Piraeus three days and relayed 8 hrs of Radio Athens as a test bc before departing for the Greek Island of Rhodes in the Mediterranean just west of Turkey. U.S. Officials said the Courier will permanently anchor at Rhodes for bc's. No freqs. were mentioned (Follett)

BELGIUM: - The Int. Goodwill Station has sent along this information; Stations are ORU located at Wavre, 100 kw. and OTC, Leopoldville, Belgian Congo, 50 kw used only as a relay station in beams to No.

America. Sked: 0500-0700 over ORU located on 17.860 and 15.335; 0715-0800 over ORU on 11.850; 1200-1300 over ORU on 9.745 and 11.850; 1300-1630 prog. "Belgium Calling The World" in Dutch, English, and French, News in English at 1430 over ORU on 11.850; 1630-1830 over ORU on 9.745 and 11.850; 1830-1930 Belgium calling the World in Spanish and Portuguese over ORU on 9.745 and 5.970; 1900-2000 "Belgium Calling her Countrymen in the World" and from 2000-2300 "Belgium Calling Canada and the USA" over ORU on 9.745 and 5.970 and relayed by OTC on 6.140. This sked is in effect from Sept. 1st to Nov. 30th, 1952.

Reports welcomed and a very attractive QSL card sent for all correct reports. QRA: TGNA, Box 601, Guatemala City, Central America. Attention of Les Garrison, Tech. in charge.

MALAYA: BFEBS (British Far East BC Service), Singapore is now on the air in English according to announcements as follows: To India, Pakistan and Ceylon 0800-099 on 17.755; 0915-1030 on 15.435 and 1030-1130 on 17.755 and 15.435. To Burma and Thailand 0800-0815 on 11.955 and 7.120, 8.08 15-0900 on 7.12 and 0900-1130 on 11.955 and 7.120. A 15 min. bc to Western Indonesia is at 1100 on 7.26. Reception on 17.55 here in the East has been gud past couple of weeks. A recent card from the Resident Eng. states: "Technical reports, which give detail of how our xsmns are received are very much appreciated here. A report of reception covering a long enough period to indicate that it is not a freak reception or deterioration will always receive a personal reply."

Bustin c/o 4VEH, Box 1, Cap Haitien, Haiti. Mrs. Bustin also states that Paul Shirk, Chief Tech. is returning to the States soon and will be replaced by Mr. Pocazo.

YUGOSLAVIA: "Radio Yugoslavia", Belgrade announces English programs daily on 6.100 and 15.245 at 1100-1115, 1315-1330 and 1645-1700. The NEW 100 kw is on 15.245 and being received well here in the East. Their interval is a trumpet fanfare.

JAPAN: Present sked. of Radio Tokyo as announced by RADX is: 1- to North America 0000-0100 over JOA-5 on 15.235 in parallel with JOB-4 on 11.705, English at 0002; 2- to North China 0600-0700 over JOA-4 on 11.705 and JOB-3 on 9.675; Eng. news at 0602; 3- to Central China 0700-0800 over JOA-4, 11.705 and JOB-3 on 9.675, Eng. AZORES: Recent mimeographed letter verie from "Emissora Regional Dos Azor Ponta Delgada, S. Miguel Azores," stated they are on the air daily from 1500-1600 on a freq. of 11.090 and from 1700-1900 on 4.865.

NEW ZEALAND: ZL-2 on 9.540 being hrd well arnd 0227 on a recent Wednesday with a prog calling "Hawaii Calling". (Gerran). Call signs and freq. allocated to Radio New Zealand are; ZL-7,6.080; ZL11-6.130, ZL12,7.220, ZL13-7.290; ZL18-9.520; ZL2-9.540; ZL8-9.620; ZL3-11.870 ZL9-11.810; ZL10-15.220; ZL4-17.820; ZL15-21.480; ZL16-21.580; ZL6-25.800; ZL17-26.000. As you will probably have noticed shortwave conditions have deteriorated during the past few years, and naturally we try to do everything technically possible in order to get our broadcasts over to you in the North American continent in the best quality. As you have written before we have your name and address in our files and we take the liberty of writing to you again in order to ask for your kind assistance.

During the first two weeks of September we shall be experimenting with our antennas, and we should be very grateful if during that period you would take the trouble of listening in to our broadcasts from Denmark and report back to us on the results. We are on the air daily from 8.30-9.30 and from 10:00-11.00 p.m. EST and our wavelength is 31.51 m or 9.520 kc/s. Kind regards.

BOORD, SW ED, GERMANY-- Paul Kary, Pa. has just received these current schedules from Nordwestdeutscher Rundfunk, Hamburg- 2300-0100, 6.270 to Southwest Europe, 11.795 to North America and Near East, 15.275 and 17.845 to Near East, 1100-1900, 7.290 to Southeast Europe, 9.735 to North America and Near East, 11.755 to Near East.

BARBADOS--On hursday, Aug. 7, Kary, Pa., intercepted ZNX32, Bridgetown on announced 7.547 at 1650 and heard it to 1708 sign-off with on-the spot broadcast of Turf Club horse race at 1700; recorded music preceded with short commentary at 1655; stated was Barbados Radiodiffusic Service using Cable and Wireless, Ltd., xmtr ZNX32, and said next b/c would be at 1300 Barbados time (1200 EST) on Saturday, Aug. 9. Reportedly this station is heard only a few times a year carrying sports events.

SPAIN-- Kary, Pa. has received a QSL letter from Radio Juventud de Murcia Estacion Escuela Numero 19 del Frente de Juventud, Pasco del Malecon 4, Murcia, Spain; frequency was listed 7.310; regarding "Frentes de Juventudes" the verifying official said: "Their mission is to train people for the different specialties in radio and thereby are called "Estaciones Escuelas". Malaga 7.022 signs off the air at 1830A.

THAILAND -- Balbi, Calif., notes Bangkok at fair level 0800 on 6.24 in parallel with 7.10; some days the 7.10 channel is best; at 0800 is in native; heard to 0915 or later.

SOMALI--(formerly Italian Somaliland) Radio Mogadishu, 7.385.5 (MEASURED) is heard by Catch, England, with light music 1245 and signing off in Italian 1300; plays an item of dance music before leaving the air; should have news in Italian 2225.

TANGIER-- Pan-American Radio is heard on 7.300A at fair level some days to 1903 sign-off; has twelve gongs preceded by multiple chimes at 1901 to signify local (Tangier) time. Identifies in Spanish, ENGLISH, and French.

DUTCH NEW GUINEA--Overseas sources say Radio Hollandia is experimenting (presumably with its NEW projected 5 KW xmtr) on 5.090A; however Radio Hollandia is still using its low powered channel of 7.125 with regular daily programs around 0430-0730 and is heard in Western USA at poor level.

MALAYA-- Gillett, Australia, reports BFEB, Singapore on a new channel of 6.110 to 0615 sign-off.

BOLIVIA-- Radio La Cruz del Sur, CP38, La Paz, 9.505 is scheduled now-- Mon., Sat., 0655-0830, 1030-1345, 1855-2215, (news in Sp. 0800-0815, 1330-1345, 1930-1945, 2200-2215); Sundays 0755-1000, 1200-1730 (no news on Sunday) Officials have informed Bellington, N.Y. that in September the station expects to have some SPECIAL TEST BROADCASTS IN ENGLISH DIRECTED NORTH TO THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA. WOULD LIKE REPORTS. Hours for the tests were uncertain but the officials said they would be sending out a general information circular about the tests to "our long distance listeners in time for all of them to make the necessary plans."

PORTUGAL** Catch, England recently noted Radio Nacional, Lisbon on a NEW channel of MEASURED 17.742 with very strong signal at 1230 in a xsmn directed to Sao Tome, Angola, Mozambique.

PHILIPPINES-- "The Voice of Catholic Philippines" is heard in Australia by Gillett on 9.690 AFTER BFEB, Singapore closes on this channel 0745. QRA is University of Santo Tomas, Manila.

SOUTH AFRICA--Johannesburg, 11.937 is heard by Catch, Britain around 1200 1505; some days has English, others Afrikaans; news is 1200.

ETHIOPIA-- Catch, England notes Radio Addis Ababa, ETAA, 15.053 at good level with native music 1245; this one opens around 1130 and closes 1300; No English heard reported lately.

LIBERIA-- ELBC, Monrovia was noted by Saylor Va., on 6.028 on a recent Saturday at 1715-1850 closedown; fine level until 1830 when there was slight QRM.
