Was your name here? Perhaps it was, most likely it wasn't. My big task that lies ahead is trying to promote more of you, the members of our club to participate in this the LETTERS SECTION.

DX'ing is your hobby, isn't it? How far from you does your closest DX'ing neighbor live? Next door? Probably not. If you are not living in a large metropolitan area, the chances are that the nearest active DX'er that you know of may be hundreds of miles from you. Who is this DX'er anyway? Many of you no doubt have asked this question many times. Surely you have seen his name on a number of occasions in the bulletin, but other than his DX reporting, you probably know very little about him. Haven't you often wondered what some of these other DX'ers are doing for a living, what equipment they use, what kind of people they are? How are you to know? You probably never write to them!

In any hobby, especially one that is as near and dear to us as DX'ing, contact and correspondence with others engaged in the same hobby is to be desired. We not only learn by reading what others have written, but we learn by making these direct contacts. In all, what I am trying to drive at, is that not enough of us as members of URDXC know others in the organization, and what their activities are. Some of us evidently regard the receiving of the bulletin from the mailman as "another information sheet." I don't know how many of us have ever thought about it, but a club is supposed to mean an association of persons for some common object. The common objective is there, but where does the association come in? How many of us really associate?

The purpose of the LETTERS SECTION is to promote association between the members. We have no regular club meetings, banquets, or conventions, and because of this and other factors, many of our members may never meet another member personally. The only method available to promote this association is "to get the ball rolling" in a Letters Section. I would like to see three things happen: 1) more active participation on the part of ALL the members. 2) more letter-writing and corresponding between members, not only to develop friendship and strengthen the DX fraternity, but to stimulate new ideas; and lastly 3) of paramount concern to me at present is the building of this section.

But please designate what you wish to go into print. Just to give you an idea in getting started why not let the others know what you think about jamming, for instance? Any solutions? What do you think is the most effective antenna? What stations have incurred your "wrath" by not answering you after the third try? What is your "most wanted" station in Africa? How does that new job affect your DX'ing hours? These are just a few of the ideas that you can use! There are many others.

This was not intended to exactly be a sermon, moreover, it is an appeal. Yes, I meant it just that way - an appeal for your participation in this section. I hope that I have gotten my point across to you. So, now, how about some letters? Let's see what you, the URDXC members can contribute. 73 and best of summer DX.

- 4.950 JAMAICA. ZQI, Kingston, tuned 0135 with cmcls and records, "Mid-weekly Sports Report" at 0145; gave id at 0345 recheck. (GF) Good sig to 0405A s/o with "GSTQ." (BB, EV)
- 4.995 BRAZIL. ZYY2, Radio Brasil Central, Goiania, strong at 0030. (EB)
- 5.040 VENEZUELA. YVMA, Maracaibo, noted with full id and s/off at 0430. (BB)
- 5.047 DUTCH NEW GUINEA. RONG, Biak, logged at 1100 with music. (EB)
- 5.993M SPAIN. RNE, Madrid, hrd 0000 with news in Sp.; s/off at 0004. (GF)
- 6.020 GUATEMALA. TGDA, La Voz de Occidente, Quetzaltenango, hrd around 0330. (EB)

- 6.554M CLANDESTINE (ALBANIA?) "La Voce Italiana dell' Istria" noted at good level around 1910 with id. This xmtr is now thought to be located in Albania rather than Trieste; perhaps it is significant that this freq is quite near Radio Tirana's 6.560-70 channel. (JF)
- 7.270 JAVA (INDONESIA). YDB3, Djakarta, fair around 1105 with organ music and choral singing. (Ed.)
- 7.590M NICARAGUA. YNRM, Matagalpa, hrd to 0257 s/off, when ancd in Spanish and played march. (GF)
- 7.790M NICARAGUA. YNRA, Bluefields, hrd 0300 with records, Sp. ancts. (GF)
- 8.036 LEBANON. FXE, Beirut, hrd with time-sig 1800; continued in Arabic. (BB)
- 9.513 MADAGASCAR. FIQA, Tananarive, noted 0328 with native music int-sig, "La Marseillaise" at 0329, opening ancts 0330 in French by man. (Ed.)
- 9.515 ITALY. RAI, Caltanissetta, noted with piano music at 1800. (BB)
- 9.515 TURKEY. TAT, Ankara, hrd with ENG. at 2315-0000. (BA)

- 9.540 NEW ZEALAND. ZL2, Wellington, tuned 1115 with sports news, followed by music; ancd at 1122 and s/off. (GF)

- 9.710 JAVA (INDONESIA). YDF6, Djakarta, hrd opening ENG. at 1100, gal ancr; 100% QRK; news in ENG. at 1118-1126; talk and music to 1158 closedown. (GF)
- 9.745 BRAZIL. ZYR57, Radio Cultura de São Paulo, hrd 2245 in Portuguese. (EB)
- 9.775 TAIWAN. Air Force Station BEC32, Taipeh, fair at 1115 with weird Chinese music. (Ed.)
- 11.100M CHINA. In parallel with 11.453M, 11.511M and 11.600M, these outlets SEEMED to be Commies, but had different pgm from Peking on 11.651. (GF)
- 11.670 THAILAND. HSK9, Bangkok, tuned 1107, when man was ancg for stn; talk in ENG. at 1115-1120; native music to 1130, when ancd news in Malay. (GF)
- 11.740 AUSTRALIA. VLC11 hrd to E.N.A. at 1214-1345; good sig, but picks up heterodyne and CW QRM after opening. (GF,EB)
- 11.795 GERMANY. DMR40, Köln, duals with 5.980 for ENG. news at 0230-0240A. (BA)
- 11.800M PAKISTAN. APK, Karachi, powerful sig during ENG. around 2000; ancs parallels of 7.010/9.645, but THESE ARE ACTUALLY 7.008/9.640 WHEN MEASURED. (JF)
- 11.880 SWEDEN. Stockholm is hrd with ENG. news, music at 0100-0230. (BA)
- 11.943 JAVA (INDONESIA). Radio Angkatan Udara (Indonesian Air Force Station), Djakarta, hrd very well around 1110 with Hawaiian-type music. (Ed.)
- ✓ 11.995M TANGIER. Intercontinental Radio Corporation (IRCO) xmsn of Radio Tangier noted with good sigs at 1920 tune-in; had "Swedish Rhapsody" and ancts in Swedish at 1930; closed 1932. NOTE: IRCO carries DUX-Radio and Philips ("Provprogrammet") xmsns over a Radio Tanger xmtr. Radio Tangier belongs to "Sociedad Africana Radiodifusión," which also operates WTAN, "The Evangelical Voice of Tangier." This group should not be confused with IBRA-Radio, whose xmsns belong to Radio-África-Tangier and come under the subtitle of "Radio Eurafrica" (SW svc for Europe). Guess there must be more SW xmtrs per square yard in Tangier than in any other place! (JF) -- Now THAT'S all cleared up: let's go to bed! Hi! (Ed.)
- 15.020 TANGIER (Oh NO, not again?!) IBRA-Radio hrd at fine level 2100 with relig pgm; parallel on 14.975. (EB)
- 15.024 VIET NAM, NORTH. VOV, Hanoi, hrd 1000-1014 with ENG. news by man & gal, followed by anct and native music, and talk on Hanoi; gal closed ENG. at 1028. (GF)
- 15.081M MOZAMBIQUE. CR7BG, Lourenço Marques, hrd s/off at 0600. (EB) Good at 1600 after Moscow closes; is actually on the air WELL BEFORE 1600, but both stns were heterodyning and difficult to copy on 5/22. (JF) Is a "regular" around 1800 with (mostly) request records, ancts in Portuguese. (BB)
- 15.100 IRAN. EPB, Teheran, sometimes good around 2000. (EB) Very strong at 2015 with news in ENG.; classical music at 2025. (BB)
- 15.120 ITALY. Rome noted 1045 with talk in ENG. (BB)
- 15.140 PHILIPPINES. Northern Luzon VOA noted 1200 with usual id; into lingo. (GF)
- 15.155 SWEDEN. Stockholm noted 0245-0300 with ENG. to Southeast Asia. (BA)
- 15.160 AUSTRALIA. RA's beam to Europe noted from around 0600. (EB,BB)
- 15.165M SYRIA. Damascus first hrd on this channel on 6/12 at 0140 with strong sig in lingo, Arabic music; at 0200, ancd in Arabic and Spanish, saying that beam was to Latin America and would "be back tomorrow"; off at 0202. (GF)
- 15.210 AUSTRALIA. VLB15, Shepparton/Melbourne, hrd closing at 1345; dual VLA15, 15.315, continued past 1345. (EB)

- 15.245 PHILIPPINES. VOA relay Manila-2 noted strong at 2255 with East Asia beam; usual id at 2300. (JF)
- 15.280 BELGIUM. ORU3, Brussels, hrd on NEW freq on 4/18; parallel 15.335. (EB)
- 15.325 ITALY. RAI, Rome, hrd with ENG. at 0010AV-0030AV, 0230AV-0245AV; this is correct freq, NOT 15.300 as per 5/1 UNIVERSALITE. (BA)
- 15.335 PAKISTAN. APK, Karachi, hrd with ENG. and native music at 0055-0115; ancd for 15.335/17.750; said back "tomorrow at the same time." (GF)
- 15.380M GERMANY. Deutsche Welle, Köln, noted 0100 s/off after ancts in German, Sp., Portuguese; good sig. (GF,EB)
- 15.380 INDIA. AIR, Delhi, hrd in native to 0015; ENG. at around 0045. (EB)
- 17.710 U.S.A. WRUL, Boston, Mass., hrd on this NEW channel during April; strong (with preselection) during ENG. news at 2235 to id at 2245. (JF) -- WRUL's xmtrs are located at Scituate (pronounced SIT-choo-it), Mass., which is next to Cohasset -- which is my dear ole home town! Ach, the breakthrough was AWFUL! (Ed.)
- 17.775 GREECE. Radio Athens, "The Voice of Greece," extremely powerful with French news at 1715; ENG. at 1730; also ancd for 15.345. (JF)
- 17.797A INDIA. AIR, Delhi, noted from 1345 with Eastern music, ENG. ancts. (EB)
- 17.800 SWEDEN. Radio Sweden was on this NEW freq on 4/18 at 1700 with pgm to Middle East; QFM from Rome. (EB)
- 17.845 JAPAN. Tokyo's 0030-0100 beam to E.N.A. hrd well; dual 15.235. (BA,EB,GF)
- 17.850 U.S.A. KCBR, Delano, Cf., hrd in AFRTS relay of baseball game; good level here and on parallels on 15.340/15.315/15.130. (BB)
- 17.860 BELGIUM. ORU3, Brussels, noted 1500 with sports xmsn in lingo. (GF)
- 17.880 PORTUGAL. CSA45, Lisbon, good sigs but hetero-QRMed during magazine pgm at 1520. NOT ON 17.875. (JF)
- 17.895 PORTUGAL. Lisbon tuned at 1125, 1330, 0058 s/off; all-Portuguese. (GF)
- 21.700 PORTUGAL. Emissora Nacional hrd from around 1500; good. (EB,Ed.)

EB would appreciate help on the following sticklers: A Spanish-spkr on 3.415A, possibly in the Dominican Republic, hrd one evening in April. . . . An Ecuador xmtr on 4.070A hrd to 0430. . . . The Brazilian on 4.755 which, although listed as Radio Brasil, Campinas, ancs something like, "Radio . . . de Maranhão." . . . The Latin on 5.975 around 0100, seemingly ZPA1, Paraguay. . . . The Peruvian on 9.420A (just above OAX4W on 9.405) which carries Radio Nacional del Perú news at 0300; might be Iquitos. . . . A NEW Brazilian on 11.855 at 0030 on 4/6. . . . (Your unid on 15.062A is POSITIVELY Mauritius, Ernest: I've been hearing them on that freq.) . . . A station on 15.200, hrd in Spanish around 1830; carried "Gillette" pgm (in Sp.) from 1900; dual with 15.350. . . . An Oriental on 15.225 at 1330; Japan? . . . On 15.455A, an xmtr carrying Far East lingo, some Russian, to 2230; might be Siberian. . . . An Asian hrd on 17.825A around 0030, weak/fair.

GF would like to know: Who is the Chinese-spkr hrd on 11.800M around 1116; ancd in lingo at 1130 and continued. . . . Who is the VOA-type outlet on 15.240, found with lingo and music at 2130; Chinese music at 2145; anct 2200 and more lingo. Moscow was about 10 kc. below.

BB notes a station on 6.600 which he believes to be TAZ, Izmir, Turkey. This one hrd from around 2030 with Turkish songs until 2050, then light music recordings; made long anct at 2100, just before s/off, but was blotted out by strong CW QRM.

- 6.215 MONACO. This is NOT a true freq; must be parasitic or what-have-you.
- 7.600 SPAIN. "La Voz de España, Gandia," would undoubtedly REALLY be Radio España Independente, which is regularly on this freq. -- Jack, I think the reporter MEANT 7.700, as there IS such a stn operating in that vicinity. (ED.)
- 9.575 TAIWAN. This is BED5, a Radio Liberation outlet of The Voice of Free China.
- 4/15 issue:
- 17.720 SWITZERLAND. This freq was brought into service in June 1955, and the call was HEU7; is not included in the present schedule, so is no doubt inactive again.
- 21.630 U.S.S.R. This Russian Home Svc outlet has been widely reported in Europe, but has proved to be the 3rd harmonic of Khabarovsk on 7.210.

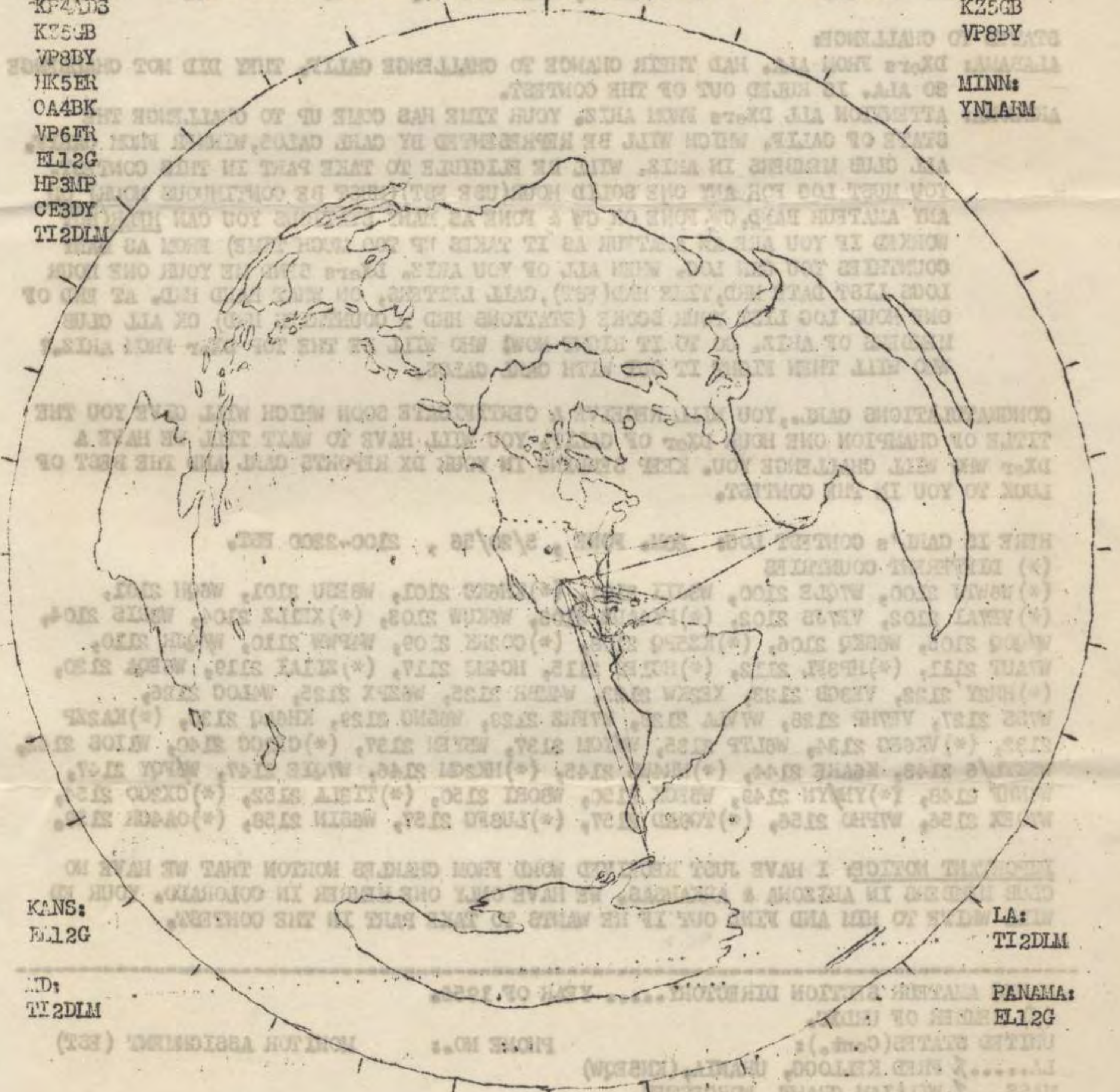
