CLANDESTINE---

The most famous of the clandestines has not been heard since May 1. It has been officially disclosed that DEUTSCHER KURZWELLESENDER ATLANTIK was Allied-operated as was suspected. Before this station went off the air was heard with terrific signals in late April on 6212, 7075, 7420 and 9800. Just before it ceased operations it had also added another frequency which had not been used for several months, namely 9930, which was a pre-war Athens channel, and was used for this service soon after the British took Athens. These stations were in parallel with medium wave stations "Soldaten Sender Calais" on since 1945 began "Soldaten Sender West." Newscasters and entertainers on ATLANTIK were frequently refugees from Germany. So ends a chapter in the Radio War. (Howe, Va.; Balbi, Calif.; Baxter, Calif.; Juett, Ind.; Green; Emerson, D.C.; Ferguson, N.C.; Yates, Barre-N.Y.; Cooper-Ont.; Wilson-Del.). With the fall of Berlin all the German-operated clandestines such as DEBUNK, and WHITE RAGEL 7215 went off the air. (Jones, Fla.; Howe).

Don Brewer, Tulsa, Oklahoma: Since writing last April, I've received veries from WMBD WHB KVOR WROL WMAZ KFEQ KHQ KTMS KMBC KWTO KLRA KXOK WGAR KGKO WKAR WBAP KGGF KVOA WKY CKLW CKTB ZNS; also SW veries from XEQQ and KRHO. Have reports out to KTBC KMTR WHKK WLBW KTHS WCSC KOAM KOMA WHK KAND KCMO WCOC WFAA KFH KGNC XEQ XEMC XEB CMBL KGU and KGMB. 4/7 was my best DX night in a long time, as I logged KTMS KHQ KTBC KMTR KGU and KGMB, the latter two being my farthest BCB stations. (ED: Don recently attempted to get your editor a veri from KOMA, after I sent him a copy of my unanswered report. Although no veri has been received yet, his efforts are really appreciated. If any of you fellows had trouble verifying KOMA, maybe Don can do something for you. His address in Tulsa is 425 South College Ave.). Received the May 1 edition of the bulletin and liked it better than any other issues yet received. I was very pleased with all the letters in the BCB Section, as it's interesting to know the DXing experiences of the

other members of the club. I was especially interested in the letter from Doctor Kirk. How does he pick up CKRC at noon? (ED: And how does he verify them; hi, Doc). I've written their SW call (CKRX) twice and never got an answer. To KRUSE: I used to live in Glendale and feel I should defend KIEV. They may have poor studios but they used to put on some swell recorded musical programs. Of all the stations in the Los Angeles area, I used to find myself listening to KIEV more than any other daytime stations. (ED: Maybe Len has since had a chance to observe the studios of WCAP in Asbury Park, and is willing to admit that KIEV only has the second worst studios of any BCB stations he's seen. All they used to have was a room off the boardwalk with 3 turntables in it). Since my last letter I've verified WING WNAD KRIC KFBI KTHS WHK KAND WHBF KFJZ KDYL KGNC CMX TGW, and have reports to KRBC KMAC WMC KTBS WAIT WGST KDFN KPRC WDOD WSPA and WTAD. I now have an even 300 stations logged on BCB, with 125 verified; also 25 SW veries. On March 18, as listed in my last report, I logged XEAC, Tijuana, Mexico, and wrote them a letter the next day. I haven't as yet received a verie, but possibly I haven't given them enough time. I noticed on the URDXC letterhead that XEAC is one of the Official stations of the club. I'd like to verify this station very much and would appreciate it if someone could furnish me with the name of the chief engineer or some other reliable person to whom I could address my request. (ED: Send report to San Diego, Calif. and not to Mexico). Well, the night of May 4 was a pretty fair night for me. I have never heard XERB before. I'm going to send them a report and I sure hope they answer. It was the first time I've heard CBF in Tulsa (I've lived here a year and a quarter. I used to live in Illinois near Chicago). I never did write them although I used to be able to hear them almost nightly. I will expect an answer from them.

Martin Harrison, Victoria, British Columbia: Being a new member of the URDXC, I'm dropping you a line to tell you how things are in the BCB line here. (ED: Martin's ensuing report appears in the current "Kilocycle Kapers," and is a worthy note). Only Eastern Canadian station heard lately is CBL. Does anyone ever report these stations - they have extremely low power and are operated by CBC in British Columbia: 560, CBRA, Revelstoke; 1340, CBRR, Cranbrook; 940, CBRF, Fernie; 900, CBRG, Prince George; 900 CBRK, Kimberly; 940 CBRL, Williams Lake; 730 CBRM, Creston; 800, CBRN, North Bend; 800, CBRQ, Quesnel. I must admit that it's very rarely that I hear one. All my stations were heard on a 2-tube RCA Victor "Little Nipper" with one antenna. I usually use a 16-tube Philco with 75 ft NE-SW inverted "L" antenna 30 feet high. Now that it's back from the repair shop I hope to hear better things. (ED: Our initial report from Martin, and we hope to be favored with many more).

Merton Meade, US Army Overseas: There's not much radio news I know of but the 9th Army has a station relaying the BBC and Armed Forces Network programs on approximately 805 or 810 kcs. They announce as "AFN, 9th Army." There is a German station on approximately 1410 kcs (ED: You mean there was, Merton, hi) relaying AFN programs, but substituting the German version of the news for our own. On 1447 kcs the US 1st Army has a relay station but I have not heard it. I have seen a number of very good home-type radio receivers, but few communications type. Yesterday I was in a German signal repair depot, but practically everything of value had been destroyed.

Harold Hutton, Vallejo, Calif.: Perhaps you would be interested in my present equipment. As I am in the service, I get moved around a lot, so my 41-250 Philco is back in Rome, New York. Right now I have a model 84 4-tube superhet Philco with a small pipe about 20 inches long in the earth for a ground, and a forty foot high, hundred-foot single strand copper wire for an antenna. Consequently, I can't hear as much as our friends Gene Allen and Larry Yarnes, down San Carlos way. The set has little selectivity. For example it is rare that I hear XELO because KGO overlaps about 20 kcs on either side of 810. The same goes for KSFO KERC KPO and practically all the other Bay Area stations of a thousand watts or over. Radio Saipan on 1010 is an everyday occurrence for me. Monday morning, 4/9, KGO was off until 5:45 am and I logged a Jap on 800 kcs with an unusually loud signal. The only time they were interrupted was at 5:00 am when CHAB signed on. By 5:20 CHAB could not be heard and the Jap was on top again. This is my first Asiatic. Have never heard Alaska yet, for KPO covers up 660 for me. I've been a DXer since April, 1938, having been in the CCC's and USMC since then. At this writing my verified log stands at 534. I count only different calls as different veries. For example, if KGO was to change its call; the new call would be a different verification for me. As Gene Allen and

myself live so near each other, we're always comparing notes. To GUSTAFSON: Your Aussie on 820 kcs is 2NA, according to my log. (ED: Glad to hear from Harold, and congratulations on the new addition to the family).

Jules Sussman, Belmont, Mass.: Have recently received veries from WQXR WTOP CHML WHEB and WORK. WTOP sends a very nice looking card that goes well in any veri collection, as does CHML. WOR's daily sked is 7:00 am-12:05 am.

Ted Saling, Estacada, Oregon: Heard KVOS on URDXC program from 3:30-4:00 when they signed off. Just in case you weren't able to pull them thru I'll give you a little info. They announced as a test and never once mentioned DX, requested reports or gave a hint of any kind that they were on for URDXC. The first 15 minutes was band music with no announcements. The last 15 minutes they announced well-known pieces. Have received veries from WWSR CFGP KHMO KGBS CFRN KVCV WMOH CJRL CKWS KVINU KODY and WATW so far this season, with reports still out to KXO KONP KWKW & KVOS. I finally logged WWDC, but only because they had an interesting program. They came in so well that I thought I had KSAN, as KRIC was far in back. Also picked up KNAK CHAB KGFV & XEMC. Joe Lippincott, Moorestown, New Jersey: Looks as if Thomas will take the cake this year and I'm not surprised. Wish I could have some split frequency tuning. Reports out to Sweden, Algeria and some SA's, but doubt if I can get enough veries to win. Latest veri is PRES, with 5 beautiful photo cards of Rio. I have an azimuthal map based on New York which should be quite a help, as I plan a few sky wires. I have a fair amount of solid copper pre-war wire that I have used for antennas for some time, and despite a few kinks in it, I hope it will do. I'll use my old 12-tube GE (1938) and can tune the LW band again. Used to hear TAs regularly in the winter on LW better than BCB, and there's less QRM. Only new US veri in KONP. (ED: Glad to hear that you have moved to the best state in the U.S., and Morty Meehan will back me up on that statement. I'm certain you'll find your new location will offer nothing but the finest DX results, and anxiously await your first report from the good old Garden State).

William Harris, Asheville, North Carolina: I've been able to do some DXing lately and have heard WHLN WDEL WJOB WMAZ WROK WROX WBTM WGBF & WEGO. I wrote WBHD in Petersburg, Virginia, about their network affiliations. About a week later I received a letter from WSSV which said that WBHD had changed their call letters and that they were tied up with Mutual. They said they'd go on the air approximately a week after the date of the letter, which was May 1st. Could you tell me if WWV is broadcasting on a standard frequency, if so where, when and on what frequency. To JOHANNIS: WCPO is not an all-nite station. It signs off at 3:00 AM on Saturday mornings. (ED: WSSV is already on the air, as evidenced by Ralph Johann's report in Kilocycle Kapers, which contains their broadcast schedule).

Erick Johnson, New York City, N.Y.: I'm just wondering what is wrong up there in Highland Falls, as I haven't heard a word from you for quite some time. Can it be that you are still snowbound up there? (ED: Glad to say the snow is gone, Erick, but I've been unable to get at any of my correspondence for weeks. You'll undoubtedly have heard from me before this gets into print). DX is nearly at a standstill except for a few SW stations logged and reported to. (ED: Erick, how about a report to Bill Howe on your SW activities.) I know you are quite adept at this phase of DX, and Bill would appreciate your report). I just wrote the owner of WBAC, Cleveland, Tennessee, 1340 kcs, to find out when they'll begin their equipment tests. Perhaps I'll be able to pull him thru the 1340 mess.

Norm Maguire, Stamford, Conn.: Veries just aren't coming in these days and I haven't had any for a week now. No DXing accomplished either, as I've been on the go too much. Thanks for letting me know how the Foreign BCB Contest of the URDXC is scored, as I was trying to figure it out. I checked against this season's veries and find I have the following: CFRN CFGP CJGX CFPL CFRB CKNW CBR CBH KEAR KGU KGMB TIEP XEHL XEAC (ED: Note this one, Don Brewer) 2YH, Allied Force Radio, Canal Zone, 3HA 2NZ 4QS 6WF 6WB 6GE, giving me 13 points in the scoring. I've verified 4 states or provinces of Australia this year and am mighty proud of those three Western Australia veries (ED: And rightly so, Norm, I guess most of we fellows would settle for any Australian veri, hi).

Ralph Johanns, Buffalo, New York: Well, V-E greetings to all (ED: Delayed communique, hi) and I hope you got many new stations on the all-night programs. I've got a 1935 vintage 10-tube Silvertone, 4 bands but managed to get a few Canadians during the first week of May.

Could have done better with a Hallicrafters. (ED: Ralph was one of the principal contributors to our Kilocycle Kapers this month, and we certainly hope to be favored with many more such fine reports). Carl Horton, Athol, Mass.: Following is an excerpt of a letter received from R. A. Gascoine of the BBC, in reply to my reception reports.

"With reference to reception on the medium wave band we regret that we do not, as a matter of policy, issue verifications, as so many of our transmissions are re-radiated by other organizations throughout the world, but we thank you for your kind cooperation in writing to us and enclose a copy of our European Programmes Bulletin, in which you will find an outline of all our services." QRN is really heavy here now, and not much is being heard. You might care to know that CXA-14, 810 kcs, "El Espectador," and CXA-18, 890 kcs, "Radio Libertad" are on the air from 8:00 am until midnight, and would like reports of reception. Their QTH is Senor Jorge Cubilo, Gerente General, Difusoras Del Uruguay, Montevideo, Uruguay.
