ZNS heard signing off at 10:33 p.m. Jan. 19th. Announced that its Sunday programs commence at 7:35 a.m., 11:45 a.m., and 5 p.m. Final sign-off Sunday is at 10:15 p.m. (V-EDY, N.Y.)

PRF9 was heard with R9 signal at 10:55 p.m. Jan. 19th, in real DX weather with the temperature 10 below. (V-EDY, N.Y.)

840 kcs - Not a peep was heard from VOWN at the time scheduled for its special the other morning. (V-BJK, Ont.)

970 kcs - WHA was heard with a special DX show on Jan. 26th 3:00-3:15 a.m. This was not listed in "DX", and due to interference from WAAT, I was unable to tell who sponsored the program. (V-ONT, Ont.)

FCC NEWS

The FCC has announced the granting of
CP's for six additional new stations.

Two 250 w stations for 1400 kcs have
been authorized, to be operated by Indian
Riber Broadcasting Co., at Fort Pierce,
Fla., and by Fort Lauderdale Broadcasting
Co., at Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

CP's for three daytime stations have
been issued, to Dixie Broadcasting Co.,
Montgomery, Ala. (800 kcs, 1 kw); San
Mateo County Broadcasters, San Mateo,
Cal. (1050 kcs, 250 w); Pekin Broadcast-
ing Co., Pekin, Ill. (1140 kcs, 250 w).

The sixth CP is issued to Oil City
Broadcasting Co. to use 1410 kcs with 1
kw for a regional station at Odessa, Tex.

WFCI, Pawtucket, R.I., will increase
to 5 kw on its present 1420 kcs.

The FCC has also announced results of
two hearings held on competitive applica-
tions. It proposes to grant CP's to
Southern Tier Broadcasting Co., one of
three applicants for 1450 kcs in Bingham-
ton, N.Y., and to Air-Waves, Inc., one of
two applicants for 1400 kcs in Baton
Rouge, La. These two decisions are pro-
posed only, and all applicants may file
exceptions within 15 days. A final de-
cision will be announced by the FCC after
consideration of such exceptions.
