640 kcs XGAP at Peiping, China can be heard well all nite (till 9 a.m. EST) with strong signals. Occasionally relay XGOB Chungking as let the XGOB announcement go through. KFI is heard in the back ground at times and if silent, A westcoast DXer might hear XGAP.

730 kcs Here is some info from our logs here for a DXer in N.Z.. The powerful Mexican on this frequency is XEX in Mexico City, Mexico with a power of 150 kw. Hope to see you get a verie from them.

NEWS FROM FCC

FLASH!---On October 29th, VRC received a Cuban change list which contained the answer to a question that has been puzzling many DXers in recent weeks. The question: What Cuban station is operating on 660 kcs? The answer: CMBC in Havana, Hav. The change list, dated September 5th, shows CMBC as moving from 1290 to 660. In the general shuffle of August 31st (See "DX", October 22nd, and Cuban list in "DX", October 29th), CMBC was to move from 790 to 1290. It is likely that it moved directly from 790 to 660 kcs. If it operated at all on 1290, it was only for a few days. CMBC is now listed as a daytime station on 660. However most Cuban daytime stations are permitted to operate at night if no interference is caused. CMBC is undoubtedly the station heard during the evenings.

CMCW has been assigned unlimited time on 1290 instead of sharing with CMCB on 1330....CMAX (1500) and CM9RT (1610) are deleted....CMBG (1390) is temporarily using 250 w, pending increase to 1 kw.

FIRST USA CHANGES SINCE OCT. 8TH: KFAB (1110) will increase to 50 kw, moving to Omaha, Neb., from Lincoln....**KTBC** (590) goes to 1000(5)....**KSJB** (600) to 5000.... In Monroe, La., **KMLB**, now on 1230, is to increase to 1 kw, and move to 1440. **KNOE** will take over 1230, instead of its present 1450 when **KMLB** moves.

Three additional 250-watters have been authorized....**WMVG**, Milledgeville, Ga., to be operated on 1450 kcs by Jere N. Moore....**WMOX**, Meridian, Miss., owned by Birney Ines, Jr., to use 1240 kcs....And in Portland, Me., Centennial Broadcasting Company will construct a station to operate on 1450 kcs.

All changes listed above were received in time for inclusion in the monthly change summary which starts on this page.
