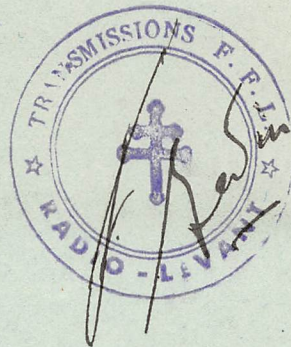
I have to acknowledge receipt with many thanks of your letter dated 30th. September 1944 and I am glad to note the good reception you had on our Radio-Levant transmission.

I am rather surprised of such good results considering our power is only 3 kilowatts and our aerial is directional, pointing North-East, since our propaganda is most concerned with the occupied territories of Eastern Europe.

We are expecting to increase our aerial power to 10 Kw. as soon as we will receive valves type 889 R. from U.S.A. and we will change our wavelength in the 50 meters band.

Perhaps you will be interested to learn that during the Syrian Campaign of June-July 1941, the Original Station was entirely destroyed and then sabotaged. This Actual Station has been entirely built locally with the help of a few "Grand Amateur" Radio Fans including the writer of this letter, EX.-V.U.2AM of India. I am inclosing few snaps which might interest you.

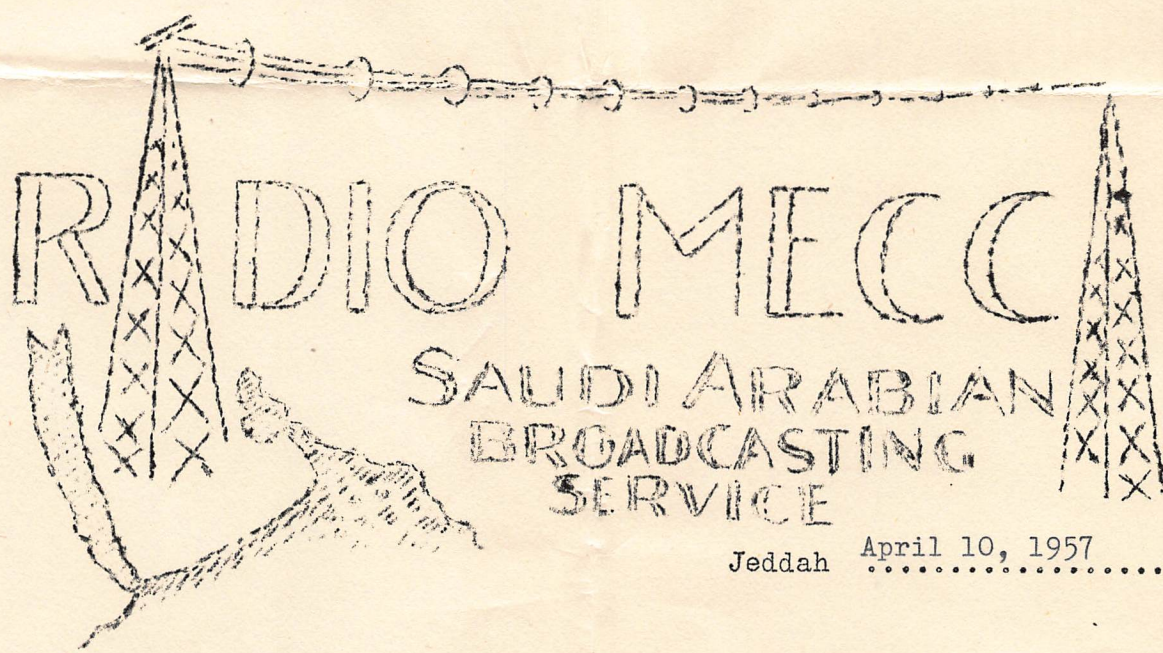
Always at your disposal for any further information you may require and I hope I will receive further reports from you which is always much appreciated.

2. Radio Sarawak transmits daily in four languages. English and Malay sharing one service. Chinese and Iban sharing another. Midday programmes of general interest are also broadcast and a schools broadcasting service will start for an hour each morning in January, 1959. 
