I am very happy to verify your report on the reception of WRCS in your locality on November 11, 1956. The overall broadcast was not the success I had hoped it would be due to QRM from several other stations. The main ones causing interference on 970 KC were WAAT, Newark, New Jersey; WWSW, Pittsburg; KAKC, Tulsa; XEO, Matamoros, Mexico; and after 6:25 am WWIT, Canton, just outside Asheville, North Carolina joined the air waves.

I s/on at 5:46 am hoping that some of you fellows would be able to pick me up before WAAT came on the air.

I hope to make another test broadcast possibly in January or February around 4 am EST. I'll notify your club before the broadcast.
