THE STORY OF K S D

(Written in April, 1924)

With the advent of 1924, Radio Station KSD, the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, approached the beginning of its third year of activity in the broadcasting field. In the time which has elapsed since KSD obtained the first "Class B" license issued in the United States it has kept in step with the progress of radio transmission and has given service, entertainment, amusement and instruction to an uncounted multitude of hearers in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Central and South America and on the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. The voice of KSD has been heard also in England and Scotland, not only in the international tests made in the closing week of 1923, but at other times.

The fundamental idea in the establishment of Station KSD was public service—to give the best in broadcasting that could be provided. And here should be recorded an expression of sincere thanks to the host of vocalists, instrumentalists, speakers and entertainers who, in the spirit of community service, have so generously contributed their time and talents in providing the varied programs broadcast by this station.

It can be said of KSD that it has been unceasing and untiring in the giving of service. Some who listen to its concerts at night may know nothing of its daylight activities, but many thousands of others in the great Middle West know that the station in the daylight hours is no less busy than at night and that it broadcasts seven times daily, market reports of great value to farmers, millers and merchants throughout the Mississippi Valley.

Although KSD is equipped with the standard transmission instruments used by most other broadcasting stations, its installation, including aerial and ground, appear to have given it unusual range. It has been heard in every Canadian province, in remote parts of Alaska and on the Aleutian Islands, 4008 miles northwest of St. Louis; all over Mexico and Central America and the West Indies and a point in the Pacific Ocean, 2000 miles off the coast of Peru, 840 miles below the equator and 3744 miles south of St. Louis.

In the last year there have been some notable achievements in daylight broadcasting and in the transmission of special features apart from the regular programs. An event of real historical importance was the successful broadcasting of President Coolidge's message to Congress, delivered by him in the Capitol at Washington, December 6, 1923, at the hour of noon.

The President's words were carried by telephone wires from the Capitol to the KSD transmitting station on the roof of the Post-Dispatch building and from there sent out on the air by radio. Letters received by the Post-Dispatch showed that this broadcasting of the President's entire message was heard by radio listeners in many states. This was the first time the voice of a President addressing Congress had ever been put on the air.

On the night of June 21, 1923, President Harding, starting on that fateful journey from which he was destined never to return, delivered his now famous speech in the St. Louis Coliseum on the World Court. This speech in its entirety was broadcast by Station KSD—the first time radio had ever been used to transmit a President's address to the people on a great public question. Though this speech was made less than an hour after sunset on the longest day in the year it was heard by KSD listeners in 28 states.

The speech of Lloyd George in St. Louis, October 19, 1923, was also broadcast by KSD and it was from this station that Gen. Pershing and Former Vice-President Marshall made their first radio addresses.

In keeping with its priority as the first licensed 400 meter station, KSD has blazed a trail for other stations to follow and has inaugurated broadcasting customs which have become general. This station, for instance, was the first to give the hour and minute when signing off. It was the first station to give midnight concerts and the first to broadcast modern dramas and comedies direct from the theaters during regular performances.

The inauguration of the midnight concert by KSD, September 12, 1922, was a revelation of the range possibilities of radio transmission under those favorable atmospheric conditions which prevail in the early morning hours. The result of this broadcasting was astonishing. It was heard in every state in the Union, in Canada and on the Pacific and Atlantic oceans. So far as investigation shows this was the first time and, in all likelihood, the only time a broadcasting station was ever heard over so wide an area in a single night.

The quality of the entertainment provided through the regular programs and on special occasions has been unsurpassed in the radio field. The "log" of Station KSD reads like a list of most of the notable attractions, celebrities and personalities that have passed in review in the last two years.

St. Louis is proud of its Municipal Opera, staged each season in the open air theater in Forest Park on a scale of magnificence, the like of which is not to be found elsewhere in the United States. For two seasons KSD has been broadcasting these operatic performances in their entirety and sending the beautiful music and sprightly dialogue into thousands of homes scattered over a large area.

This alone is an entertainment feature in which any broadcasting station might well take pride and which thus far no other station has equaled. Even the delights of grand opera have been available to KSD listeners, many of whom will never forget the pleasure they derived from the broadcasting of the San Carlo Opera Company's performance of *Aida*, *Martha*, *Rigoletto*, *La Forza del Destino* and *Cavalleria Rusticana* from the Odeon in St. Louis.

The big musical event of each fall and winter season in St. Louis is the series of concerts given by the Symphony Orchestra. The broadcasting of all of these concerts in the last two seasons by KSD has carried music of the highest quality into remote places which it never could have reached except through the magic of radio. The cultural value of this one KSD feature is beyond computation. Soloists who have appeared with the Symphony Orchestra and have been broadcast by KSD are Marguerite Namara, Maria Ivogun and Helen Traubel, sopranos; Carolina Lazzari, contralto; Paul Althouse, tenor; Olga Samaroff, Alfred Cortot, Ethel Leginska, Ignaz Friedman, Marie Kryl, Rudolph Ganz and Ossip Gabrilowitsch, pianists; Joseph Schwartz, baritone; Jacques Thibaud, Michel Gusikoff and Francis Macmillen, violinists; and H. Max Steindel, violoncellist. Other noted musicians broadcast from St. Louis theaters were Sascha Jacobsen, violinist, and Alfred G. Robyn, organist.

For the last two years Station KSD has broadcast a religious service of great solemnity and musical beauty, the Christmas midnight mass at the Old Cathedral in St. Louis. The Cathedral, more than 100 years old, has musical as well as religious traditions. Its choir is a noted organization of trained singers, especially skilled in the interpretation of ecclesiastical music. KSD also has broadcast the oratorios, "The Creation" and "The Messiah" from Christ Church Cathedral, and the cantatas, "The Crucifixion" and "The Story of Christmas," from the Westminster Presbyterian Church. The Good Friday "Tre Ore" service, broadcast from St. Francis Xavier's Church, appealed to many as a wonderful piece of daylight broadcasting.

The famous Sistine Choir from Rome was broadcast by KSD for the first and only time, on its American tour.

In broadcasting plays direct from the theater Station KSD has led the way. Among the dramas and comedies put on the air by this station have been "The Fortune Hunter," "Cornered," "The Broken Wing," "Why Men Leave Home," "Dulcy" and "To the Ladies."

Glue clubs of Harvard, Yale, Cornell, Washington University, St. Louis University, Westminster and McKendree colleges and the Ursuline Convent have been broadcast by KSD as have also complete programs by the Pageant Choral Society, the Apollo Club, Knights of Columbus Choral Club and the Welsh Eistedfodd.

This station at various times has broadcast proceedings and banquets of prominent conventions, a notable case in point being the Rotary International convention when the speeches of delegates from eight foreign countries were put on the air.

An annual event of the fall festivity season is the broadcasting of the music of the Veiled Prophet's parade and ball. Another feature is the monthly Saturday afternoon broadcasting of a concert by talented children in a program of music, song and recitations.

In the lines of general service KSD transmits news bulletins of important happenings and sends out information of sporting topics, such as play-by-play accounts of important football final games and world series baseball games and details of other events of interest in the world of sport.

This station had a prominent part in the international tests for radio communication with England in the final week of 1923. It was among the few stations to which special nights were assigned for an effort to reach England and it takes pride in the fact that it was officially notified that "KSD was heard clearly all over England and Scotland."

As an instance of the busy activity of KSD it is interesting to note that in the period between June 26, 1922 and August 21, 1923, the number of individuals taking part in its studio programs was 2667. In these studio programs were 223 vocal soloists, 232 pianists, 40 orchestras, 18 different bands and 178 speakers, many of international prominence.

Broadcasting direct from theater or concert hall, instead of from studio, is the present tendency in radio. It is interesting to note that KSD, in the sixteen weeks from September 1, 1923, to December 1, made eighty such broadcasts.

One final word about the utility of the daylight broadcasting of market news. In the Winter of 1922-23 the Department of Agriculture asked listeners everywhere to write the Department and report as to the value of radio service. Although these queries were sent out by stations from the Atlantic to the Pacific, it is a matter of record that 60 per cent. of the mail received in Washington came from KSD listeners. The great agricultural and livestock regions of the Mississippi Valley were early to recognize the value of radio, and receiving sets of the finest type are there to be found in thousands of farm homes, ranches, mills, country banks and shipping centers.



How the radio towers of K S D, on the roof of the Post-Dispatch Building, dominate the skyline of St. Louis. These towers are 100 feet high (to tip of wooden mast) and 14 feet square at the base. The four legs go through the roof of the building to be anchored upon the steel framework of the structure itself. A powerful winch at the base of each tower makes it possible to stretch the phosphor-bronze aerial as tight as a violin string.

THE St. Louis Post-Dispatch, published in the heart of the great Mississippi Valley, is more than a newspaper—it is an institution. It was founded by the late Joseph Pulitzer in 1878 when he purchased the mere shells of two printing properties and merged them into one daily publication which grew, in the space of a few years, through the editor's indomitable energy and genius, into a daily newspaper of commanding influence. With success won in St. Louis, Mr. Pulitzer went to New York and purchased the morning World, then a derelict on Newspaper Row. As the entire country knows, The World, under Mr. Pulitzer's guidance, achieved an international reputation for editorial independence and news enterprise. The Post-Dispatch in St. Louis shared with the World in New York the matchless direction of their founder until the day of his death and then the duties of management were taken over by sons whom he had trained for a lifelong task.

From a pitiful circulation of some 2500 copies daily, when Joseph Pulitzer first took hold of the Post-Dispatch, it has grown to a position of supremacy, with which, population considered, there are but few, if any equals. At the close of 1923 the daily circulation was more than 200,000 and that of the Sunday in excess of 400,000.

It may be remarked, in closing this brief sketch of the Post-Dispatch, that it was the first newspaper in St. Louis to print a magazine section; the first to print comics in colors; the first to introduce rotogravure printing, and the first to establish and operate its own radio broadcasting station.
