Radio Station CFGP was established November 2, 1937, in Grande Prairie, Alberta.

The new studio and office building located at 10008 - 103 Avenue and pictured on this card, was occupied December 29, 1963 with the official opening scheduled on July 20, 1964 to coincide with the celebration of the City of Grande Prairie's Golden Anniversary Jubilee.

The CFGP building is 66 feet square and provides 4356 sq. ft. of office and studio space. The cement block structure is air conditioned and houses 3 studios, 2 identically equipped control rooms, 9 offices, a staff room and a 250 watt Gates stand-by transmitter with its own generator for emergency power supply. The front of the building features the official City of Grande Prairie emblem, the Trumpeter Swan.

CGFP operates at a power of 10,000 watts on a frequency of 1050 Kcs. 24 hours daily, serving a population of 110,000 people in the Alberta and British Columbia Peace River area. It is an affiliate of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation network.

Design of the new building was by Rhone and Iredale, Architects of Vancouver, B.C., with construction by Turner and Son Contractors of Grande Prairie.

Thank you for taking part in the Sunshine Radio Network radio test on December 11, 1994.

Our network runs CKQR 760 AM (25kW) in Castlegar BC, CKGF 1340 AM (1000 watts) in Grand Forks BC, and 4 low-power FM repeaters.

As a ham radio operator, I have developed a great interest in receiving DX reports. I routinely use my truck and home radios to see "who's out there" and I have had stations as far away from Castlegar as Utah, California, and Montana, using just a whip antenna.

Our satellite company was good enough to provide complete logs for the duration of the test, and comparing these with our studio logs, I am happy to confirm your reception.



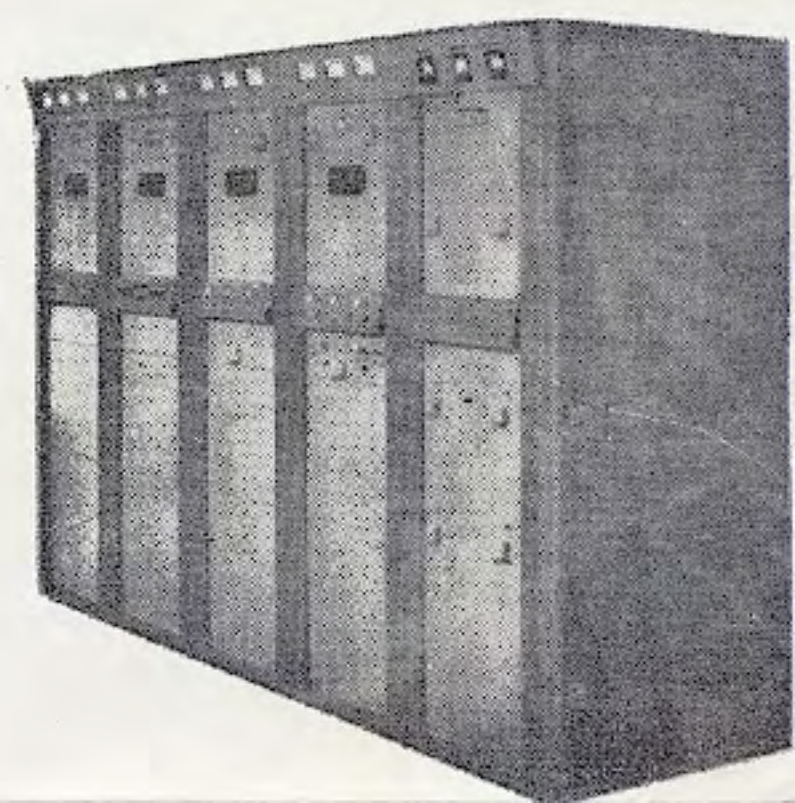
