We trust that the signals of Radio Cordac will be adequate so that you can be instructed and blessed by the programs.





# MIRACLE PROPERTY (Part I)

They came to a place which God told them of." Genesis 22:9.

In October of 1962, God told us of "a place" where He was going to establish a radio and literature ministry which would reach and bless many people. In this vision, we saw both missionaries and nationals learning radio and broadcasting from AM and FM stations. Radio receivers were sold and serviced. The printing, publication and distribution of Christian literature was also included. I thought then that this place was in southern Texas; now we see He has directed to "a place" in the heart of Africa! (Burundi is shaped like a heart.) Ministries now established in the center of the capitol city, Bujumbura, have the potential of touching a hundred million souls for Jesus Christ!

The primary, physical reason for these ministries being known around the world in three years' time is due to a miracle property. As the former European owners caught the vision, they exclaimed, "We have been building this property for nearly thirty years for CORDAC!" It is a miracle story of a miracle property — Radio CORDAC Center!

Arriving in Burundi, February 24, 1963, we immediately formed an Executive Board with an African majority, and began negotiations with the Burundi Government for a radio franchise. After six months, all response indicated positively that a franchise would be granted, but only under certain conditions. One was that the administration and programming of the radio stations must be in the capitol city of Bujumbura, under the watchful eye and ear of the various government departments which regulate broadcasting.

This was a shock to everyone. We had hoped to begin operations with a nominal outlay of funds, using existing mission property, electric power and buildings located in a different province in the interior of Burundi. In fact, we had already filed with the Justice Department for Incorporation at this place, Kibimba.

Our government advisors and the leading of the Lord indicated that "the place" must be changed to Bujumbura. The CORDAC (Continued on page 7)

# MEET THE STAFF OF RADIO CORDAC

"... for thou shalt go to all that I send thee, and whatsoever I command thee, thou shalt speak."

Ieremiah 1:7

I am very thankful to God for my parents who knew their responsibility to their children; not only

for material but also spiritual needs. On my eighth birthday, my parents gave me a Book containing all the Bible that had been printed in Kirundi at that time — the Gospels and some of Paul's Epistles. Father told me that this was my own Book and that I should read it every day, beginning with the Gospel of John.

I obeyed, and at the age of eleven, I discovered the secret that Jesus told Nicodemus about in John 3:3. "If a man is not born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." I was born again, my life was changed; and several years later, I was sanctified by the Holy Spirit. From the time of my conversion, God gave me a vision of many souls perishing, and that I must win them to Christ.

After my own schooling, I started teaching in a primary school. I liked this work, but I believe that my best year as a tecaher was when fourteen of my class gave their hearts to Christ.

Just as I boarded the plane in Bujumbura to fly to Europe for further study, Bob and Esther Kellum hurriedly arrived at the airport with the Radio CORDAC franchise which they had just got in the Post. I had learned of their request for a station authorization from members of the CORDAC Executive Board. Who would ever have believed that within two years God would change my plans, change my course of study, and send me back to Bujumbura — to Radio CORDAC!

In Denmark studying for a career in social sciences, every morning I would pray for those items upon my prayer list. One morning the Lord said, "Do you want to do My Will?" I answered, "Yes, Lord, I want to do Thy Will!" The Lord said, 'I want you to change from studies in Social Sciences, to studies of radio broadcasting. You must prepare yourself to return to work at Radio CORDAC." I answered, "No, Lord, how can I do this?" He warned, "I cannot bless you if you refuse to obey my voice. But if you obey I will greatly bless and use you!" After some days of struggle, I obeyed the voice of God, and (Continued on page 6)

"What hath God wrought!" These are the words that come to our minds as we think of the twenty-one years of missionary service God has graciously granted us in Africa.

Sixteen years were spent in general missionary work in Burundi and Rwanda. We think especially of the rich revival blessings we witnessed in

Rwanda. The Holy Spirit was mightily out-poured, and we had the great joy of witnessing the conversion of hundreds of pagans. The scripture that literally lived in our hearts those days was, "Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit, saith the Lord."

Then came the call and challenge of the literature ministry. For five years we had the joy of seeing God work through our evangelistic, literature ministry. We had the privilege of doing the Every Home Crusade in Rwanda during the tribal war there. In the midst of fighting on all sides, God enabled us to distribute a half-million Gospel tracts. This gave the country a potent challenge at that critical period. We remember the words especially of one man when he said that after reading the tract, he dare not go and burn down any more huts. God's convicting arrow went deep.

We will never forget our move up into Uganda. A tremendous open door lay before us. Refugees by the thousands were pouring into Uganda from Rwanda. We were able to minister to these desperately needy people. We never witnessed such heart hunger for the Gospel before. God gave wonderful results. We will not forget one camp where we preached. After clearly explaining the way of salvation, we asked for those who wanted to be saved to raise their hands. They all raised their hands and many cried out loud, "We all want to be saved!" Then we remember those eager hands that reached out for the Gospels of John that we distributed. They treated these Gospels like pieces of gold!! World Gospel Crusades had made it possible for us to distribute 50,000 Gospels in that momentous time. Eternity alone will reveal the full results.

Executive Board quickly complied, filing a revision for Incorporation in the capitol city of Bujumbura, with a request for a secondary, shortwave transmitter site at Kibimba. This was submitted on August 30, 1963, with our Request for Authorization (franchise) for the Radio stations. Promised in ten days, the franchise was granted in three! The next day we went to the government offices to express our appreciation. An attorney in the Justice Department declared, "You would never have received the franchise without changing the CORDAC headquarters from Kibimba to Bujumbura!"

As the change of "place" for CORDAC headquarters began to be realized, we began to ask the Lord and His missionaries, "Where in Bujumbura is the Lord's property?" This was first a spiritual question, because had not the Lord provided every direction and every person necessary for His radio project up to that time? Most assuredly He had! So it was only reasonable that the Lord would not order us to the beautiful city of Bujumbura and leave us, and His equipment which had just arrived, sitting under the tropical sun and rain without a roof!

We first looked for land where new buildings could be built, but such a thought soon ended: building materials were extremely limited. Missionary builders were either on furlough or had other building jobs ahead of them. Belgian contractors had returned home, because commercial building ended with independence. Facing such facts as these, the questions came: "How could we build? And, if we could not, what property could we rent, lease or purchase?"

These were serious questions. For a year all building had ceased; many Europeans locked up their properties before independence and returned to Europe. But now, six months after independence, they came back to Bujumbura. With them came United Nations and embassy families, all requiring houses and offices. A house or office building to rent, or buy, was a rare thing — and expensive. (This is still true today!) But when the franchise would be granted we must get "on the air" quickly in order to retain it: within ninety days if possible; six months was the absolute deadline. Where would be the CORDAC studios? Where the transmitters housed? Where was land for antennas? Where was housing for our family — and for the other families planning to come as soon as the franchise was in hand? Where was the property the Lord had prepared for CORDAC? How would He reveal it? How would it be paid for? Our God knows all the answers: He must quickly provide a miracle property!

(How God answered will be told in the next issue.)
