FM STATIONS RECEIVE DISTINCTIVE CALLS

BROADCASTING by FM has passed the experimental stage and is now recording. and is now recognized as a definite commercial broadcast service. FM broadcasts provide noiseand static-free reception of an extremely high-fidelity character. FM broadcasts can be received only over limited areas; therefore hundreds of FM stations, properly spaced in relation to each other, can operate on the same frequency FM broadcasts take place on ultrahigh frequencies and can not be received on ordinary receivers. Simple converters are now available which, when used in conjunction with your present set, make it possible to receive these broadcasts. Receivers for FM reception only and receivers that will receive both FM and present-type broadcasts are now available from the majority of radio dealers at fairly moderate prices.

To provide distinctive calls for FM broadcast stations, the FCC has adopted a new system of callletters with interposed numbers.

Under international agreement the first letter of a call indicates the nationality of a station, thus, the United States is assigned the use of three letters-N, K and W Calls beginning with N are reserved for the use of the Navy and Coast Guard. Those beginning with K are assigned to broadcast stations west of the Mississippi River: those beginning with W are assigned to stations east of the Mississippi River.

Consequently the first call-letter of an FM station must be K or W, depending upon its geographical location.

A second letter for an FM station will be assigned in alphabetical order to each station on a given frequency as licensed, thus providing twenty-five stations in each area for a given frequency. Where it is possible the city or area also will be indicated by the second letter or combination of second and

third letters. Thus stations in Boston will terminate with the letter B, while stations in New York City will terminate with NY, etc.

However, between the initial letter and supplemental letter (or letters) two numbers will be utilized. These numbers will indicate the frequency assignment. This is possible because all FM stations are in the 42,000-50,000 kilocycle band, and because all FM frequencies are assigned on the odd hundreds in kilocycles. Thus the first figure and the last two figures of the frequency assignment can be dropped (glance at the frequency chart given here and you can easily see by the italic numbers how this works out).

In brief, here is how the system works: W41B would indicate an FM station in the eastern section of the country (Boston) operating on 44,100 kilocycles. By the same token, K43SF would apply to an FM station in the western part of the United States (San Francisco) on the 44,300 kilocycle frequency

AUSTRALIA ON THE SHORT WAVES

BEFORE the outbreak of war, short-wave radio in Australia was mainly for the benefit of listeners in the far-out back country and in the islands around the coast of the continent. Since the war, however, Australia's short-wave radio activities have grown until eleven transmissions are now broadcast daily in English, French, Dutch and Spanish.

Summaries of Australian and Pacific news are heard morning and evening daily throughout America, separate transmissions being directed to eastern and western regions of the United States and Canada. Programs for listeners in the eastern part of North America are broadcast daily at 4:20 a.m. over VLQ5 (9.68) and at 1:55 p.m. PST over VLQ7 (11.88). The morning transmission is much the better received of the two. Broadcasts for listeners on the Pacific Coast are radiated daily at 7:25 a.m. and at 9:55 p.m. PST over VLQ7 (11.88). In addition to English news summaries which are heard near the beginning of each transmission, special discussions of significant phases of the news are featured on the Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday morning broadcasts. On Monday and Friday mornings Richard Qua, a Canadian newspaperman now living in Australia, talks about aspects of Australian life he finds interesting and unusual. The evening programs, on the other hand, are designed to give American listeners a clear picture of Australian war effort and potentialities, and her feelings about the course of the war and the trend of events in the south Pacific. The transmissions for Pacific Coast listeners broadcast Friday evenings at 9:55 p.m. PST,

contains a special feature entitled "The Truth of It Is . . ." American listeners who have heard this broadcast say that the Australian commentaries are probably the saltiest in the world. When they really "go to town" they are even more pungent than the Germans.

The object of these Australian broadcasts, which are prepared by the Government Department of Information, is to strengthen and extend the existing bonds of interest and friendship between the United States and its fellow democracy in the southwestern Pacific.

INTERESTING NEW SHORT-WAVE STATIONS TO TEST LISTENER'S TUNING SKILL

REGULAR readers of this de-partment in Movie-Radio Guide have by this time undoubtedly become quite proficient at tuning in the ordinary powerful short-wave stations such as London, Berlin, Rome, Tokyo and Sydney, Australia. Today I propose to lead you a little farther afield in some of the fascinating by-ways of short-wave reception; to give you information about some new and interesting broadcasters that can be tuned in if you are patient and persistent. To land one of these far-away and bizarre stations has never ceased to be a thrill to the writer. I think you will get a kick out of it also.

First let's try for Greece. SVM (9.935) is a commercial wireless station at Athens. Ordinarily it does not broadcast program material. At present it is broadcasting twenty minutes each day. This short period, which consists of a resume of latest Italo-Albanian war news in English, is on the air from 2:40 to 3:00 p.m. EST. The broadcast, which is put on pri-marily for London press sources, opens with the Greek anthem and "God Save the King." The identification is "This is Athens calling." According to Robert Skyten of East Brookfield, Massachusetts, the news bulletin is also rebroadcast by an unidentified station operating on 7.075 megs.

Press and radio get much of their first-hand information about the war in Libya from broadcasts of the North African short-wave network. The principal stations in this group are: TPZ (12.12) and TPZ2 (8.96), identified as "Radio Alger," in Alger, Algeria, and CNR (12.83) and CNR2 (11.94), identified as "Radio Maroc," in Rabat, Morocco. The Alger stations broadcast daily from approximately 1:30 to 3:15 a.m., the Morocco stations from 6:00 to 8:00 a.m. and all stations in the network from 1:45 to 4:00 p.m. or later EST. At 2:45 p.m. EST the official war communique is broadcast in French. General Weygand's recent message to his

French troops was broadcast over the Alger stations and carried by the network.

If you would like to hear Egypt direct, watch for an evening network pick-up from Cairo, then turn your dial to SUX (7.865). This Cairo station is ordinarily engaged in commercial telephone service with London.

ZNR, Aden, Arabia, is on the air daily from 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m. EST with an Arabic program of music and news. Occasionally the following identification in English is made, "You are listening to short-wave station ZNR, operating on 12.12 megacycles, in Aden, Arabia." Note the frequency of ZNR, that is 12.12 megs, is the same as

that of TPZ, Algeria.

General DeGaulle, leader of the Free France forces, is putting as many stations on the air in the interests of Free France as possible. The most notable of these thus far has been FZI (11.97), "Radio Brazzaville," at Brazzaville, French Equatorial Africa, which I have dealt with at length in the past and which can still be heard with excellent signal strength each afternoon from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. EST. 'Radio Français Libre D' Orient" (Free France radio of the Orient), located in Syria, is operating on 9.045 megs, daily from 12:30 to 1:10 p.m. EST. Other Free France stations are being heard irregularly and operating from unidenti-

Tough ones to receive in this country but which are being re-ported occasionally are Salisbury and Bulawayo, in Southern Rhodesia, operating on 7.21 and 6.757 megs respectively. These stations broadcast simultaneously daily from 4:00 to 4:30, 6:00 to 6:15, 10:55 to 11:30 a.m. and from 12:55 to 3:00 p.m. EST.

NBC'S INTERNATIONAL ENGLISH HOURS

ODAY the international stations of the United States of America are practically the only sources for accurate information, encouragement and entertainment that eager listeners of besieged Britain and the conquered states of Europe have. Thus, a real responsibility rests with our international broadcasters. To be convinced that they are fulfilling these obligations in a splendid manner you have only to listen to such heart-warming programs as "Friendship Bridge," broadcast regularly over WRUL (about which I will report more fully in an early issue), and the popular "English Hours" of NBC, broadcast daily over WNBI.

The English Hours, broadcast daily over WNBI (17.78), New York City, from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. CST, are designed primarily to furnish accurate information and cheery entertainment to our friends in Great Britain and the Empire, and to NBC's vast English-speaking audience in all parts of the world.

The most important function of the English Hours is the regular daily presentation (at 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. CST) of unbiased news. Brilliantly edited by Hudson Hawley, news editor of NBC's International Division, and read by Tom Carey and Ken Smith, the daily fifteen-minute news periods of the English Hours are probably the most complete and impartial reports of any on the short waves in that language today. According to letters received at NBC, thousands of listeners abroad-and at homestate that they tune in WNBI to get the latest and the most accurate news. Unhampered by censorship these news flashes often reach foreign listeners long before they are able to read about them in their local newspapers.

There is, however, a lighter side to the English Hours. They include entertainment programs consisting of the best in recorded music, both classical and dance, together with numerous talks on various phases of American life and customs which have proved most popular with English listeners. The period from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. CST is devoted to music, plays, special features and brief news bulletins. The feature portion of the English Hours opens at 11:00 a.m. CST with the "Star-Spangled Banner," followed by fifteen minutes of the latest news. Then there is a fifteen-minute period of music, followed, from

Three times a week (Mondays, Thursday, Fridays) this talk is the Mail Bag, or answers by microphone to letters received during the week, conducted by Tom Carey Once a week (Saturdays at 9:45 a.m. CST) Mr. Carey presents his very popular Highlights from Hollywood, a sort of Hollywood gossip column with a little music thrown in for good measure. Finally, the Hour winds up with fifteen minutes of Classical Gems, and three or four of the latest news bulletins sandwiched in at the end.

Tom Carey, writer and announcer of the English Hours, twenty-five years old, a graduate of Lawrenceville and Princeton, is the enthusiastic and friendly personality that has done much to make the English Hours one of the most outstanding international programs of the day Mr. Carey understands the tastes of the British listener since he has spent considerable time there Mr Carey is always pleased to hear from listeners (each communication is answered personally and usually read over the air as well) and letters should be addressed to him in care of the English Hours, International Division of NBC, RCA Building, Radio City, New York, New York.

"FRIENDSHIP BRIDGE"

NE of the finest examples of what our broadcasters are doing to send cheer and encouragement to our British friends overseas is the program "Friendship Bridge," which first went on the air Monday, August 19, and is now broadcast daily except Saturdays and Sundays at 4:00 p.m. EST (9:00 p.m. in London) over the international station WRUL of Boston, Mass. The programs generally originate in one of the studios of WMCA in New York City and are then carried by land wire to WRUL in Boston from which point they are radiated simultaneously on frequencies of 11.79 and 15.35 mega-

"Friendship Bridge," developed by the British-American Ambulance Corps in cooperation with the World Wide Broadcasting Foundation, consists of messages, greetings, songs, words of friend-ship and good cheer from those here to friends or relatives in Britain. All kinds of people come before the mike of "Friendship Bridge," each to say his or her little "two bits' worth" for the cause. Sometimes it is sons or daughters, evacuees saying "Hello" to daddy and mother; sometimes radio's own, such as Eddie Cantor or Raymond Gram Swing; from time to time celebrities such as Mrs. F. D. Roosevelt or General Pershing speak, but more often it is just plain Mr. or Mrs. America expressing in simple—sometimes faltering-words their sincere admiration for brave hearts who, at the other end of "Friendship Bridge," are upholding the stand-ards of democracy.

Despite the horrors of total war, despite endless defense duties, and despite difficulties of reception and irregularities of mail service, hundreds of letters continue to pour in to "Friendship Bridge" from Britain's listeners in homes, in factories, in air-raid shelters. Some are sad, some humorous, some thrilling chronicles of bravery but all are filled with heart-warming words of appreciation for such programs as "Friendship Bridge." Here

are random extracts: SALOP, ENGLAND: "We have it on the highest authority that thistles do not produce figs and that few thorns produce grapes - but it seems that beyond a hedge of thorns, the fruit may grow . . . we find this war thorny enough, but there's a warmth of feeling of which, if I may say so, station WRUL's 'Friendship Bridge' is a

particularly fine cluster. I should like to thank you. Please carry on. Our ability to stick it out depends very largely on you" . . . London, England: "Sitting here in our airraid post on the southeast outskirts of London, we find great encouragement and inspiration in listening to your commentators. see, my wife, who is sitting here with me, is a Bostonian. We were married in the U.S.A. in April, 1939, and every day I feel more glad we did. Came the war, and my business returned me to London. Our little house here in the suburbs was just heaven to us-still is-but the blitz has disturbed all our routine. Kae and I are both air-raid wardens. Pardon the pencil, but the barrage is heavy tonight and a bomb last night upset our ink."
"Friendship Bridge" is but one

BROADCASTS FROM THE MEDITERRANEAN AREA

AKE a map and draw a large circle enclosing the Mediterranean Sea and those countries bordering on it or closely adjacent to it and you will have roughly staked out the general war zones which have been furnishing the major portion of the headlines durpast few months. The Greco-Albanian conflict, the Libyan campaign and the diplomatic moves in the Balkans are only side issues, but inasmuch as they do have an important bearing upon the whole problem, Movie-Radio Gume reader-listeners are manifesting a lot of interest in shortwave broadcasts direct from the Mediterranean capitals. Here then is a brief summary of what to listen to and where and when to

Rome may be heard daily with good signal strength. Tune for the "American Hour," broadcast nightly from 7:00 to 9:30 p.m. CST over 2RO19 (7.31), 2RO3 (9.63), 2RO18 (9.76) and 2RO4 (11.81). Of these 2RO18 is best at present. English news bulletins are read at 7:00 and at 9:30 p.m. CST. The balance of the program consists of music (predominantly classical), short talks of a general or of a propaganda nature, and plays. An-nouncements are in English or

Budapest broadcasts to North America daily from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. CST over HAT4 (9.125). The program is heard consistently with fair signal strength, although during summer months static and atmospherics often ruin reception. An English news bulletin is read nightly some time between 6:45 and 7:30 p.m. CST. A good deal of music is included in the Budapest program and almost all of it semiclassical, operatic or of a folk nature. Announcements are in English or Hungarian

Belgrade. This capital has powerful 10,000-watt station, YUG (15.24), that broadcasts to North America regularly from 8:00 to 9:00 p.m. CST. Jugoslav broad-casting authorities have always seemed to display a singular lack of foresight in that this program, while designed for reception in the United States, does not include a single English announcement and is radiated on a frequency suitable for summer reception only.

Tirana (Albania) has a small short-wave station, ZAA (7.85 or 6.085), which has been heard in this country a few times but which

has not been reported for several

Athens has a 10,000-watt transmitter which, installed some months ago for commercial service. is now being used for daily broadcasts. Using the call SVM (9.935), it is on the air daily from 1:40 to 2:00 p.m. CST in English for Great Britain, and from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. CST for North America. The lastnamed transmission was officially inaugurated on March 1, after several days of tests. This program. heard with excellent strength, includes an English news bulletin, propaganda and general talks, variety music and acknowledg-ments of reports received. Reception reports are urgently requested and should be sent to Radio Athens, Athens, Greece

Ankara (Turkey). TAP (9.465) broadcasts daily from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. CST, using an omni-directional aerial. The latter part of this transmission is sometimes heard in eastern North America. Using an aerial beamed on the United States, TAP relays short programs to American networks frequently between 6:00 and 6:30 p.m. CST. These pick-ups are usually made on Sundays, Mondays and Thursdays and the Turkish station is well heard at this

Syria. Two low-power stations are definitely known to be on the air. These are heard only when conditions are favorable and by expert listeners. "Radio Français Libre d'Orient" (9.045) broadcasts an all-French program daily from 11:30 a.m. to 12:10 p.m. CST. "Radio Levant" (8.03), first heard in this country by Norman Kriebel of Ambler, Pennsylvania, is being heard nightly from 11:30 to 11:53 p.m. CST with an all-French pro-

NATIONAL DEFENSE LISTENING-POSTS TO STUDY FOREIGN SHORT-WAVE BROADCASTS

CINCE the beginning of the war I have been continually pointing out the importance of short-wave broadcasting as an instrument of international policy. With the powerful international broadcasters of Europe and Asia filling the ether with propaganda twenty-four hours daily it was inevitable that at least a certain percentage of this intentional and insidious doctrinepreaching should fall upon fertile ground. Thousands of listeners in our own country were gulping down these propaganda messages -disguised as sugar-coated pillswith no understanding of their hidden intent. I felt that we should be more concerned with the importance of international broadcasting; should be paying more attention to what was filling the ether of the whole world; should be listening to and analyzing what the other nations were attempting to sell; should be setting up a coordinated government bureau of short-wave information. Singlehanded, because I could get no official support, I attempted as far back as the fall of 1939 to set up a National Defense Listeners League. The plan was to enlist the services of several hundred expert short-wave listeners who were willing to act as watchdogs over certain specified frequencies each day. Due to lack of interest on the part of both officials and listeners the idea was abandoned. All the while Great Britain, Germany and other leading nations were operating busy and efficient official government monitoring stations (listening-posts) upon a twenty-four-hour basis. In England alone a staff of some two hundred were being employed in the recording, translating and analyzing of some five hundred thousand words of foreign broadcasts received daily from every corner of the earth. Every day other countries were taking down every word of every international broadcast being sent out from the United States, analyzing it and making a permanent record of it. We still were ignoring the situation. Meanwhile, however, some private agencies were establishing their own monitoring stations. Enterprising journalists began to pick up and utilize foreign news and propaganda-casts. NBC

ing services. Princeton University installed a listening-post and began a serious study of propaganda broadcasts. Next the Federal Communications Commission's field monitoring stations - established primarily for checking frequencies of U.S. broadcast stations-began to watch for programs of a subversive nature and for illegal stations. The amateurs assumed the responsibility of policing their own ether lanes. The period of awakening had set in. Inquiries concerning all phases of short-wave broadcasting began to pour into the writer's bureau. From ordinary listeners to leading radio figures, everyone was becoming interested in the vital statistics concerning short-wave stations.

At long last we are awake. The Federal Communications Commission is establishing special national defense listening-posts to record, translate, transcribe and analyze foreign short-wave broadcasts.

A twenty-four-hour watch for subversive and other pertinent radio propaganda from abroad is being set up at primary monitoring stations strategically located throughout the United States and its possessions.

A picked force of 350 technicians. translators, clerks, propaganda analysts and other experts will work in eight-hour shifts to keep abreast of all overseas emissions which may involve propaganda intended for persons in this or neighboring countries. The listeners and analysts will pay particular attention to voice broadcasts, including news, speeches, announcements and playlets, as well as some musical programs.

After being recorded in the field, all this material will be coordinated and studied at Washington. The extent of the work involved is indicated by the fact that it requires an average of seven hours of translation and transcription to fully process one hour of recorded material. It will be necessary to record and analyze matter of which seventy-five percent will be in languages other than English.

This necessary step to deal with vital national defense problems developed by radio is taken on recommendation of the Defense Communications Board, as ap-proved by the President and the Bureau of the Budget.

LONDON'S WORLD SERVICE IN ENGLISH

(from 1:30) New Zealand

REAT BRITAIN has the greatest short-wave center on earth. It all started only a few years ago, back in 1927, with a 12,000-watt experimental station, G5SW, at Chelmsford. In December of 1932 the British Empire Service was officially inaugurated. The total equipment at that time consisted of one 15,000- and one 20,000-watt transmitter located at Daventry, not far from London. Today, on the same site, there are some thirteen transmitters in more or less continuous operation. The power of each transmitter ranges from 10,000 to 50,000 watts. As many as four simultaneous pro-grams are sent out from Daventry These include the BBC World Service in English; two separate BBC services for Europe and the BBC foreign service for outside Europe. Daily programs or news periods are broadcast in some twenty-five different languages. To handle all of this ethereal traffic twenty-seven frequencies are employed. Listeners are familiar with the calls for the older frequencies such as GSA, GSC, GSD and GSF but several new ones have been added recently, namely, GRW (6.145). GRR (6.075), GRS (7.065), GRT (7.15). GRU (9.45) and GRV (12.04). London's complete broadcast

schedule is so complex and detailed that it would be impossible to publish it in its entirety; however, since the BBC broadcasts in English are of such timely importance to numerous Movie-Radio Guide readers, I am giving them in the following table (kindly bear in mind that London schedules are subject to frequent alteration) Time is Central Standard.

ROME EXPANDS ITS SHORT-WAVE SERVICE TO NORTH AMERICA

the SIZE and importance Italian Imperial Short-Wave Center at Rome rates only slightly inferior to those at London and Berlin, respectively. Ten years ago one lone 9,000-watt transmitter at Prato Smeraldo, near Rome, constituted the entire facilities of the Rome radio. From time to time other transmitters were added and the power output boosted, but it was not until December of 1938 that the new Imperial Center was officially inaugurated. The center is said to include at present two 100,000-watt, one 50,000-watt, two 40,000-watt transmitters, and three 1,000-watt experimental stations. The short-wave center, as well as the entire radio broadcasting system of Italy, is operated and controlled by a semi-official organization, the E. I. A. R. (A-yar). The E. I. A. R. is, in many ways, almost a model broadcasting organization. It sends out daily as many as twenty-seven separate programs and in as many as twenty different languages. Before the war the programs of "Radio Roma" included some of the finest music to be heard anywhere on the air. The opera broadcasts from the Imperial Opera House in Rome and from La Scala in Milan were outstandingly popular. Movie-Radio Guide has been carrying details of these programs for years. The operators of "Radio Roma" are friendly bunch and prior Italy's entrance into the war had always shown a sincere desire to conform their programs to the wishes of American listeners. The United States representative of the Italian Broadcasting Corporation is Signor Garabelli, of New York City. The programs of "Radio Roma" are monitored regularly by expert listeners in New York City, Chicago, Phoenix, Los Angeles and other points. Each of these listening-post operators is paid a definite stipulated monthly fee for furnishing these reception reports to Signor Garabelli and to the Italian Broadcasting Corporation. It has

been a source of sincere regret to the writer to see the excellent musical and operatic programs of "Radio Roma" replaced with purely propaganda features. Italian propaganda is neither clever nor subtle. It is crude and obvious and has undoubtedly made a notable contribution toward a further straining of Italo-American relations. However, knowing the past record of the E. I. A. R., I do not think this organization enjoys losing this esteem of the American listener which it has been carefully building up over a period of years. Unfortunately, a nation at war has little choice.

Right or wrong, Rome radio is anxious to get its messages to us and toward that end inaugurated on April 15 a greatly extended service to North America. The new schedule of transmissions follows

ITH Greece defeated and Athens occupied, "Radio Athens" has been added to the ever-growing list of Nazi-controlled short-wave stations. Another station has been made available for Nazi propaganda. Comparatively speaking, Greater Germany already possesses a considerable advantage over Great Britain in the number of transmitters and total power output available for international broadcasting. Short-wave propaganda is much more important in this war than the average person realizes. In fact, future historians will prob-ably record the effects of radio propaganda as one of the decisive factors in determining the outcome of the struggle.

American international broad-casters and government officials have been slow to vision the importance of this phase of international broadcasting, consequently our own international broadcasting facilities have been used only in a disorganized and comparatively ineffective sense. At long last our broadcasters are becoming acutely aware of their responsibilities to properly direct and use these important facilities entrusted to their care. It was with this thought that the operators of all United States short-wave stations recently got together voluntarily and appointed Stanley P. Richardson, veteran foreign correspondent, as International Broadcasting Coordinator for the United States. Mr. Richardson's job will be one of tremendous responsibility, as he will become virtual czar of American international broadcasting at a time when shortwave broadcasting is of critical importance in our national defense program as well as in the promotion of American good-will. It will be up to him to plan for more effective use of the powerful shortwave facilities of the United States. His office will pass on all news items broadcast for international reception. Through the new coordinated policies United States international radio will become what it has not been thus far, the official voice of the United States of America. With our own international broadcasting facilities thus unified and added to those of Great Britain in the cause of democracy

we can more than counteract the total effect of totalitarian propa-

Preparing for this all-out radio effort, United States broadcasters are rushing more transmitters and more powerful transmitters into operation. On March 24, celebrating its tenth anniversary of short-wave broadcasting to Central and South America, the National Broadcasting Company inaugurated two new 50,000-watt transmitters for WNBI and WRCA, respectively. The Columbia Broadcasting System has two new 50,000-watt transmitters under construction at Brentwood, New York. In San Francisco General Electric is constructing a new 50,000-watt transmitter for KGEI.

All of our international broadcasters have been concentrating most of their specially designed programs in the direction of Latin America, although some European programs are produced. KGEI in San Francisco broadcasts to Asia and to Latin America. WLWO in Cincinnati and WBOS in Boston broadcast to Latin America exclusively. CBS stations, WCAB at Philadelphia and WCBX at New York City, beam programs on Europe daily but these programs consist-with the exception of twicedaily newscast in Italian, German, French and Polish-for the most part of relays of regular network features. NBC stations, WRCA and WNBI at New York and WRUL at Boston, deserve mention for the large number of programs especially designed for European listeners that they are broadcasting daily. Two of their programs, "Friendship Bridge" over WRUL and the "English Hours" over WRCA-WNBI, have been dealt with in feature articles in Movie-RADIO GUIDE. Programs in Spanish and Portuguese for Latin America are important but the writer feels that right now it is vital that listeners throughout Europe, particularly in the occupied countries, should be acquainted with the facts of American democracy and our current defense program.

In an early issue of Movie-Radio GUIDE I will list in detail all U. S. international programs designed for foreign listeners that are at present being sent out by our

broadcasters.

THE holy war is on. Starting with more or less local disturbances between Arab and British troops at Habbaniyah, near Bag-dad, Iraq, this latest phase of the war—carefully planned for months by Nazi agents working secretly among the Arabs-threatens to spread throughout the entire Arabic populations of Turkey, Syria, Lebanon, Palestine, Egypt, Saudi-Arabia, Iran and Iraq. To get an accurate picture of just what is going on in this part of the world is not going to be easy. There are a few short-wave stations scattered throughout this vast territory but they are rarely heard in North America, with the exception of the Turkish radio at Ankara, and the British-Marconi commercial station at Cairo, Egypt.

"Radio Ankara," the 20,000-watt station of the Turkish government at Ankara, operates on two frequencies, TAP (9.465) and TAQ (15.195). TAP broadcasts daily from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., occasionally to 5:00 p.m. EDT. These hours are unfavorable for reception in the United States. TAQ, according to reports, is being heard in eastern North America at present from approximately 7:00 to 8:00 a.m. EDT, with news in English given at 7:15 a.m. EDT. TAP is usually employed in the pick-ups for American network programs from Ankara. Ankara" could put excellent signals into North America providing the proper frequencies and hours for transmission were observed.

The Cairo, Egypt, short-wave station is used primarily for telephonic communication with London and other outside points, its broadcasting activities consisting exclusively of an Arabic program for local reception, radiated daily from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. EDT, over SUX (7.865), and an Italian news bulletin radiated from 1:50 to 2:10 p.m. EDT, over SUV (10.05). This newscast is occasionally heard in this country. Using beam aerials directional on North America, SUX and SUV are used for Cairo relays to American networks. Reception is often excellent over SUV.

concerning radio Information facilities in Iraq is somewhat meager. The largest short-wave transmitter in the country is (or was, as it may have been bombed or captured by enemy forces by now) located at the Bagdad airport. According to B. E. Zeki, the engineer in charge of Iraq state broadcasting, the Bagdad programs are (or were) being broadcast daily from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. EDT, on frequencies of 7.08 and 9.78 megs. The latter frequency has been picked up a few times in this country but most of the news from Iraq is received in Egypt or Turkey and then relayed over the stations of those countries.

In Iran there are two short-wave transmitters located at the capital, Teheran. The more powerful of these has a power of 14,000 watts and operates on two frequencies, namely, EQB (6.155) or EQC (9.68). Regular programs are sent out daily from 9:45 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. EDT, over one of the above frequencies. Both EQB and EQC have been heard in this country between the hours of 9:45 and 11:45 a.m. EDT. EQC is probably being used for this transmission at

In the republic of Lebanon a small 2,000-watt station known as "Radio Levant" (8.03) was recently inaugurated by the Service de la Radiodifusion, Haut-Commissariat de la Republique Française, at Beirut. This station broadcasts a French news bulletin nightly from 1:00 to 1:20 a.m. EDT, which has been picked up a number of times in eastern North America. Most of the news concerning Syria and Lebanon published in the newspapers originates over this small

GENERAL NOTES: I recommend that you listen to "Morning in the Mountains," a program that includes Scripture reading, a bit of philosophy, some poetry and a little travel talk thrown in for good measure, which comes over HCJB (12.46), Quito, Ecuador, each morning at 9:00 a.m. EDT. Listeners who report on this program will receive beautiful photographs of the volcanic mountain peaks of Ecuador. The first report brings the album cover and first photo. The other pictures follow at the rate of one each month in return for one report each month. It is refreshing to turn from war and hate to the semi-religious programs of this missionary

station high in the peaks of the Andes Mountains . . . It will be a bitter disappointment to many listeners who tuned in on the amateur or commercial transmitters of the Byrd Expedition while it was in Antarctica and subsequently sent reception reports to the A.R.R.L., in West Hartford, Conn., to learn that Commander Byrd has pointed out that no verifications of reception will be forthcoming since the government made no appropriation for such purpose. Seems a shame when a few dollars for printing and postage would have made so many listeners happy. There is no doubt that these reports furnished a valuable record for technical reference.

Movie-Radio Guide, a blank note-book and a pocketful of pencil stubs, your columnist recently grabbed the Capitol Limited for Washington, D. C., to take a look at new short-wave activities and to chat with leaders in the international broadcasting field.

Readers of this department will know that I have been greatly interested in the development by our government of its own short-wave Monitoring Service. The headquarters of this new service is in an unnamed and neat but unimposing brick building in a quiet residential section of F Street. Its spacious rooms are filled with long rows of desks, which are soon to be occupied by stenographers, translators and propaganda analysts. The foreign broadcasts will actually be picked up at four monitoring stations (listening-posts)—the closest at Laurel, a suburb of Washington, D. C., the farthest on the West Coast, manned by a field force of expert observers who will record all foreign programs of importance. The recordings will then be rushed to Washington for handling at headquarters by the trained translators and analysis experts. Broad-cast material of timely impor-tance will be extracted from the recordings and immediately sent from the field monitoring stations to Washington by teletype. According to Henry Graves, well-known propaganda analyst from Princeton University, now senior administrative officer in the new Government Monitoring Service, the primary objective of his department will be to analyze the propaganda content of all foreign broadcasts, then to pass on the observations and conclusions to various Government officials and to the President.

G. E. Sterling, chief of the National Defense Systems operation of the Federal Communications Commission and a capable radio-engineer with many years of experience in the Government service, has actual control over all FCC monitoring stations, including those in the new foreign monitoring service. His office in the new Post Office Building is in constant touch by teletype, telegraph and telephone with all of the monitoring stations.

In New York City I hied myself down to Radio City to see what was new in NBC international broad-

RMED with several copies of casting. I learned from close friend Van Item, supervisor of Jules NBC's monitoring service, that this service is being definitely expanded and given greater official recogni-tion. The listening-post at NBC is in the news room, not twenty feet from a battery of busily clicking teletype machines from which unroll foot after foot of news dispatches from all parts of the world.

Director Ellwood, in charge of NBC's international division, unfolded tentative plans to put NBC broadcasts from international stations WNBI and WRCA on a possible twenty-four-hour basis. He told me that the service to Europe was being intensified and that a daily transmission in Spanish for Spain and one in Portuguese for Portugal had just been added.

Had luncheon with busy, enthusiastic Walter Lemmon, the guiding genius back of the World Wide Broadcasting Foundation at Boston. Although WRUL and WRUW are now broadcasting with 50,000 watts power each, tentative plans call for an increase in power to 100,000 watts for at least one of the stations. A new aerial beamed on New Zealand and Australia has just been completed and a special daily transmission for this part of the world will soon be inaugurated. WRUL-WRUW, although primarily directed to Europe or South America, are also well heard throughout America.

Over at the New York City headquarters of the British Broadcasting Corporation in the British Empire Building, I had a chance to gather some very important in-formation from my friend, D. G. Rowse; also to talk with W. M. Newton, who had just Clippered in from the BBC in London. Mr. Newton informed me that Broadcasting House, London home of the BBC had been badly torn up by air raids and that several staff members had lost their lives in the explosions. All of the studios are now underground, as are many offices which house thousands of BBC employes.

To summarize my recent flying trip to the East, I might say that everywhere I found a greatly increased interest in all phases of short wave. Almost everyone that I talked to expressed the belief that international broadcasting with its attendant propaganda factor might readily become one of the decisive factors in this war.

Look at your radio, Mr. and Mrs. Listener! Has it a short-wave band? Do you ever use it? Or are you the kind of person to whom short-wave tuning is complicated and difficult?

BY CHARLES A. MORRISON

If you are that type of person, it's time to wake up. All over the world events of signal importance are occurring. A titanic struggle, which may become our own battle in time, is being waged. As the owner of a short-wave radio you are privileged to get firsthand information of that struggle. All you have to do to have a ringside seat in every theater of war is to learn to use the short-wave band on your radio!-The Editors.

ATURALLY foreign stations do broadcast in foreign languages. They also broadcast in English. All leading world stations broadcast regular daily transmissions to North America. If you want to hear Jack Benny, you must know what time he comes on and over what station. By the same token you must learn, for example, that London broadcasts to us nightly from 6:20 p.m. to 12:45 a.m. EDT, that Berlin broadcasts from 5:50 p.m. to 12:00 midnight EDT.

What are called short waves cover a lot of territory and include many types of service other than broadcasting of programs. There are police, aircraft, amateur, telephone, television stations, and many other kinds. Broadcast stations can be found on, and only on, certain little spots on the short-wave band. For sake of easy identification these spots are known as the 16-meter band, the 19-meter band, the 25-meter band, the 31-meter band and the 49-meter band. Your short-wave band, or bands, will be divided off into divisions similar to inch marks on a ruler. The main division marks will bear numbers-6, 7, 8, 9, and so on, probably up to 18 or 20. Each of these numbers indicates the frequency in megs (megacycles); for example, 6 would be 6 megs, 7 would stand for 7 megs, and so on. In MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE the station's frequency is always given in megs, as GSD (11.75), which simply means that GSD is operating on 11.75 megs, or half-way between 11½ and 12 megs on the dial. The 16-meter band will be found near 18 megs on your dial; the 19-meter band will be found near 15 megs; the 25-meter band will be found near 12 megs; the 31-meter band between 9 and 10 megs and the 49-meter band near 6 megs on the dial. These various bands may be indial. These various bands may be indicated as little heavy lines on your dial, indicated as 49 M (49-meter band), 31 M, 25 M, 19 M and 16 M.

When you have turned onto the

grouped in small isolated bands, you will want to know what band to turn to for best reception. This will depend entirely upon the time of day and upon the season of the year. For this time of year use this guide:

Assume that you are on short wave and have now selected the proper band, depending upon the time of day. Next refer to the chart on this page which is a "Guide for Tuning in Leading War Stations." Refer in the chart to the band you are on and then plunge right in and try your luck by tuning slowly across the band and picking out the loudest station that is broadcasting in English. Hold onto it until you have definitely identified it. It will probably be one of the stations given in the chart, but if it isn't, re-member its location and try again. You will soon find one of the leading stations given in the chart. Suppose you are on the 25-meter band and you find that your station is GSD (11.75), London. This is in the chart and you will note that DJD (11.77), Berlin, is slightly above in frequency. Move your dial just a hair and you will have DJD, Berlin; just a little move in the same direction. more in the same direction and you will have 2RO4 (11.81), Rome. See how easy it is!

There are also certain peculiarities about each foreign station that help in identifying it. For example, the Rome stations use a twittering bird signal before each program starts and sometimes between items in the program. The German stations use a distinctive music-box melody, which is repeated over and over.

If you don't feel wholly satisfied with your first session on short waves, don't give up in disgust. You may have been unlucky enough to have picked out one of those rare periods when foreign recention is near Open. when foreign reception is poor. Once you have tasted the first thrills of foreign reception, however, you will want to try for other and more dis-tant stations. Follow the short-wave department in Movie-Radio Guide and soon you will be expertly twirling the dial from Berlin to Tokyo, and from Havana to London, with ease!

Government radio orders are taxing the facilities of all radio plants and they are necessarily given priority. Sponsors in turn will hesitate to expend large sums of money backing the new service if they cannot be assured a reasonably large audience of televiewers. Thus it would seem television may be due for another in its long series of setbacks.

Anti-Nazi Station in Norway

WRUL Airs Spanish Lessons



BLANKET coverage within all of the United States' twenty neighbor republics is now assured by CBS' new long-wave network to Latin America with the addition of affiliates in Haiti and Honduras. The sixty-six stations in the CBS Latin network will receive by short wave programs especially created for them in New York and in return will transmit programs to the United States for broadcast on the CBS Coast-to-Coast network.

Programs for rebroadcast in South and Central America are now sent out on an irregular basis over CBS international stations WCBX and WCAB.
The CBS Latin chain will swing into full operation next fall when the two powerful new transmitters now under construction at Brentwood, Long Is-

land, are completed. The two new CBS stations will be used exclusively for Latin-American broadcasting.

The newly signed CBS affiliate in Honduras is HRN (5.835), "La Voz de Honduras," power 4,000 watts, located at Tegucigalpa. The new CBS outlets in Haiti are HHW (1230 kc) and HH3W (10.13). Both stations are owned and operated by G. Ricardo Widmaier, Jr., who has long been interested in the creation of Pan-American good-will through broadcasting. Both HRN and HH3W are well known to short-wave listeners.

WRUL Teaches Spanish

One of the best-received educational features of station WRUL at Boston is its lessons in Spanish broadcast each Friday evening at 7:30 p.m. EDT on frequencies of 11.73 and 6.04 megs. Senor Jose A. Godoy, director of Latin-American research; Miss Nancy Blunt of the WRUL staff, announcer and commentator, and William W. Harris, coordinator of Latin-American programs as well as WRUL's "Vagabond Traveler," conduct these Spanish courses. Their presentation is in a clear and simple manner, affording one an excellent foundation in this romance language. The course follows a series of short lessons as presented in the little book, "Elements of Span-ish Conversation," by Professor C. E. Kany. Lists of vocabulary and basic rules of Spanish grammar also accompany the course. Exact pronunciation and usage is carried to the listener by means of simple yet effective conversation. All of the printed material is supplied by station WRUL, University Club, Boston, Mass., at one dollar for the complete course. The charge is purely to cover the cost of printing and postage, as WRUL is a non-profit organization. So clear and useful is this course that reports from Latin Americans show they are using it to learn English.

Brazil Increases Short-Wave Outlets

According to an official list received by Stephen A. Mann of Lakewood, Ohio, the following short-wave stations are at present active in Brazil: PRC5 (4.865), 2,000 watts, Belem, Para; PRF6 (4.895), 100 watts, Manaus, Amazonas; PRA8 (6.01), 5,000 watts, Recife, Pernambuco; PRE9 (6.105, 15.165), 5,000 watts, Fortaleza, Ceara; PRF5 (6.105, 9.500, 9.600, 10.22, 15.19), 12,000 watts, Rio de Janeiro, and PRE8 (9.505, 11.72, 17.85), 50,000 watts, Rio de Janeiro. The 50,000watt transmitter is not yet in operation. Actually being heard by United States listeners are: PRC5 (4.865), PRA8 (6.01), PRF5 (10.22).

Norwegian Mystery Station Blasts Hitler

Robert Skyten of East Brookfield, Mass., writes that an anti-Nazi station, located somewhere in Norway and operating on 10.07 megs, is blasting away at Hitler every day from 5:30 to 6:10 p.m. EDT. At times the station is almost completely blotted out by deliberately imposed inter-ference. Reception from Norway is ordinarily none too good in this country, but LLH (9.65), located at Oslo, is being heard afternoons with fair signal strength up to the station's signoff at 6:00 p.m. EDT. All stations in Norway are Nazi-controlled with the exception of this mystery voice.

General Notes

SBU (9.535), Motala, Sweden, is being heard with strong signals from 5:17 to 5:35 p.m. EDT only, with the news in Italian and French. The station comes on the air with a music-box tune . . . XIRS (11.98), a new Italian-controlled station in Shanghai,

China, broadcasts daily from 8:00 to 8:45 a.m. EDT. The program includes news in Italian and English . . . HH3W, Port-au-Prince, Haiti, has shifted in frequency to 10.13 megs . . . WNBI, New York City, has been authorized to add a new frequency of 15.15 megs. WNBI operates at present on 17.78 and 11.89 megs . . . John F. Wilson of Wilmington, Delaware, reports that the following English news bulletins are now being broadcast from Berlin during the daytime: 8:30 a.m. over DJL (15.11) and DXT (15.23); 10:30 a.m. over DJL; 12:30 p.m. over DJB (15.20), DJA (9.56) and DXJ (7.24); 1:30 p.m. over DJB and DJA; 3:30 p.m. over DJA (9.56); 4:30 and 6:30 p.m. EDT over DZD (10.543) . . . The new Canadian short-wave station at Montreal has been testing evenings on 11.705 megs, using the call CBFY. The broadcaster ordinarily operates on 6.16 megs, using the call CBFW. Other authorized calls and frequencies are: CBFX (9.63) and CBFZ (15.19).

Peeks at Short-Wave Personalities

Many listeners wondered why Cairo couldn't be raised recently on one of NBC's Sunday evening news roundups. The answer is contained in the following radiogram received at the NBC newsroom; ALARM FAILED TO AWAKEN ME FOR THE FIRST TIME MY LIFE. WILL NEVER RISK THIS AGAIN. RE-GRET FULLEST. PARR . . . Among notables at the luncheon on June 2 when William S. Paley, president of CBS, awarded a trophy to Marshall H. Ensor of Olathe, Kansas, the outstanding radio amateur operator for 1940, were Buddy Rogers, Rear Admiral Waesche, Commandant of the U.S. Coast Guard, Rear Admiral Hooper of the U. S. Navy, and officers of the American Radio Relay League . . . Peter Grant, senior announcer over WLW-WLWO, Cincinnati, began his career as a lawyer but did not try his first "case" until he was cast as defense attorney in the "Famous Jury Trials" broadcast over those stations in 1935.

POWER OF G-E INTERNATIONAL STATIONS BOOSTED Amateurs Have News Room of

Field Day the Air

Lowdown on Berlin Propagandists

ENERAL ELECTRIC'S three short-wave stations, already among the most powerful in the world, will be made even more effective by new transmitting equipment now being installed in Schenectady and San Francisco.

WGEA, Schenectady, and KGEI, San Francisco, formerly operating at 25,000 and 20,000 watts respectively, are both being increased to 50,000-watt power. WGEO, Schenectady, New York, licensed for 100,000 watts and long famous as the most powerful shortwave broadcasting station in the western hemisphere, is also receiving new equipment to increase further its effectiveness.

It is expected that the new WGEA transmitter in South Schenectady will



be put into operation about July 1, after devoting the month of June to the testing of equipment. KGEI's new equipment is also expected to begin operating on July 1. New offices and studios for this station, which has been broadcasting since early in 1939 from Treasure Island, are located in San Francisco's Fairmont Hotel, occupying three thousand square feet of floor space. The new 100,000-watt WGEO is scheduled to open late in August.

Amateurs Have Field Day

On June 7-8 amateur radio oper-ators celebrated their annual Field Day. Out in open fields and vacant lots all over the country amateurs set up portable, self-powered transmitters and established contacts with each other by phone and c.w. (code). Operators working in shifts kept the equipment in constant use during the entire twenty-seven-hour period. Equipment in use ranged all the way from crude, hastily put together, temporary apparatus with a power of only one or two watts to elaborate 500- or 1,000-watt gasoline-generator-powered outfits. There was keen competition both in local groups and on a national basis to see which operator could during the specified period work (establish two-way contact with) the largest number of stations.

While ostensibly Field Day is an outing where hams (amateurs) gather to "chew the rag" (engage in friendly discussion or argument) and test out portable or experimental equipment, there is really a much deeper under-lying significance to the occasion, for it is this very same equipment which

may be called into use any day for emergency communication during flood, fire or hurricane. This year as never before there is a grimmer note to somewhat dampen the ardor of the festivities, since amateurs are pondering the national situation and speculating as to whether before another Field Day rolls around these portable transmitters may be in use for military purposes.

News Room Has Distinguished Speakers

The WBOS News Room of the Air program, a radio newspaper, inaugurated on June 1, may now be heard Sundays from 7:00 to 7:30 p.m. EDT over WBOS (11.87), Boston.

Included in this unique program each week are: The latest bulletins of the hour; the news of the week in review; the news of tomorrow; the human-interest story of the week, and the feature page interview. For the feature page interview, a leading authority on the international situation is invited to give his views. Thus far, William Elliot, Professor of Government at Harvard University, and Roland Hall Sharp of the Christian Science Monitor have been guest speakers on the program.

Goebbels Gabblers to Be Exposed

Goebbels' staff of trained propagandists, heard nightly over the Berlin short-wave station, has been augmented by the addition of two women commentators, Jane Anderson and Ray Beveridge. Regular listeners are familiar with the usual crew of Goebbels gabblers, consisting of Lord Haw Haw, Paul Revere, E. D. Ward, Fred Kalten-bach and Prof. Otto Koischwitz. Nazi propagandists are intensifying their efforts day by day as America moves ever closer to the brink of war. These Berlin speakers are wily and clever agents who are definitely trying to influence and mold American public opinion now as never before. Movie-RADIO GUIDE will soon start a series of frank and lucid articles, each one dealing with one of these commenta-

tors, giving the lowdown on his or her background, explaining their methods of operation and the falsity in the seeming logic that each presents.

Xavier Cugat's orchestra, heard Thursdays at 10:15 p.m. EDT over WRCA (9.67), is now featuring a new young vocalist, Lina Romay, daughter of a Mexican consular official and hailed as the "Girl With the Petty Legs" . . . New: American News in Review, a review of news of the western hemisphere in its relation to the United States and a presentation of the progress of American defense industries, is now beamed to England, Fri. at 1:45 p.m. EDT, WNBI (11.89).

James Lansdale Hodson, a regular speaker on London's program, "Britain Speaks," aired daily at 8:30 p.m. EDT over GSD (11.75), is the son of a Lancashire cotton-mill manager. A talent for writing dialect verses was his passport to Fleet Street. He joined the staff of the London Daily Mail in his early twenties.

But his journalistic career was interrupted by the outbreak of the last war. He joined up in September, 1914; after serving with the King's Liverpool Regiment, he was eventually seconded to the Ministry of Munitions as a special intelligence officer,

Hodson returned to the newspaper world immediately after the war. For eleven years he was Manchester news editor of the Daily Mail. Later he joined the Daily News and was sent to investigate and report unemployment conditions in Europe during the great depression. More recently his name has become widely known as a writer on social problems. He is also the author of many successful novels and plays.

He is at present an accredited war correspondent with the British Army. In his capacity he has already been twice evacuated from France. He may be recalled for duty at any time.



Cable Stunt Commercial Television Manila Defense Aids Fifth Column Debuts July 1

Station Takes Air

HE program, "America Asks, Germany Answers," is broadcast to North America nightly at 9:15 p.m. EDT over Berlin stations DJB (15.20) and DJD (11.77). It consists almost wholly of a dialog between two fictitious characters, Democ and Nazi. The discussion takes the form of answers to cablegrams supposedly sent in to the German short-wave station by American listeners. Nazi, of course, takes the Hitler side of the argument while Democ tries to plead the cause of his "American friends." Democ is a rough, hearty and rather simpleminded fellow whose arguments in behalf of the democratic cause naturally lose to Nazi, a half humorous, half cynical, Hitler-minded propa-

gandist who continually pokes fun at the feeble arguments put up by his

supposedly American antagonist.

This program, "America Asks, Germany Answers," now about four months old, was originated primarily to purportedly answer queries cabled in by some 4,500 American listeners during the week of February 14-21; at this time the German short-wave station solicited collect cables (limited to twenty-five words) from the United States listening-audience. Listeners could ask questions, make comments or even make abusive remarks about the German programs in par-ticular and about the Nazi regime in general. Although this offer cost the German Ministry of Information some \$10,000 (in American dollars), it was about the cheapest imaginable form of advertising for the station, since the whole proposition was widely publicized in the American press and thousands of listeners who were only dimly aware of even the existence of a German short-wave station found themselves listening to it nightly, at first to see if their cables would be answered over the air, subsequently because, once the habit of listening to a certain program is formed, it is not easily discarded. Thus by a clever artifice the German short-wave station gained thousands of new listeners not only to the comparatively innocent program, "America Asks, Germany Answers," but to the more deadly blasts from Goebbels' master propagandists in their nightly bombardments on the democratic way of life.

The free cable stunt also served a more treacherous purpose, for, while the majority of cables were derisive

or denunciatory in tone-for example, one listener expressed a desire to hear a word-by-word description of Hitler's funeral—a certain percentage came from listeners who were mildly or even strongly sympathetic with the Nazi cause. Quite likely, the names and addresses of these pro-Nazis were promptly garnered by the secret police, who in turn passed them along to the American Nazi organization for investigation so that eventually the fifth column in this country will receive additional recruits.

Questions asked (supposedly at least) by American listeners and discussed over the air on "America Asks, Germany Answers" range from the ridiculous to fairly intelligent queries. For example, Democ said the other evening, "Here we have a cable from Harry Hoffman of Brooklyn, He asks, 'How do you like your diet of horse meat and dog meat in Berlin these days?'" To which Nazi answered, "My dear Hoffman: We like our diet just fine. It's excellent. In fact, it's good. Since we can no longer get giraffe tails or nightingale tongues, we must now be content with veal cutlets, lamb chops or T-bone steaks"; then, to finish off Mr. Hoffman once and for all, he added, "I suppose you also believe German tanks are made of paper." Democ picks up another cable. "This one," he says, "is from Mr. Fletcher of New York, who wants to know what plans Germany has for hemispheric expansion in the western hemisphere." Without batting an eye, Nazi says, "Germany has NO plans whatsoever against any part of South, Central or North America. Our campaign is directed solely against England. Watch for July 1, which will bring a new phase of the war." Another American cables, "Congratulations to Hitler on being the biggest heel in the world," Here Nazi becomes almost paternal, pitying the childishness of the listener and suggesting that he be soundly spanked with the broad side of a bayonet for being such a rude boy. Now we come to the last radiogram for tonight. It

comes from Mr. Lehe of New York, who says, "Neither England nor Germany but America will win the war." This one evidently rings the gong, for Nazi now forgets his fake humor and bitterly replies, "This is England's war, not yours. It's absolutely none of your business and America should keep its nose out of affairs that do not concern it in the least." And so with a couple of fanfares on a trumpet, a couple of toots on a peanut whistle and a few bars from a Nazi marching tune, "America Asks, Germany Answers" winds up for another

The moral: Be amused (if this type of tripe amuses you); laugh if you wish, but do not be misled by the propaganda pills that this program projects into the United States under the seemingly harmless guise of answering cables from American lis-

Manila Defense Station Takes Air

The first government-owned station under the American flag, short-wave station KZND (8.79), power 1,000 watts, went on the air in Manila, Philippines, on May 26, according to James Halsema of Baguio, P. I. This station, operated by the committee on publicity of the Department of National Defense for acquainting the people of the Philippines with the details of civil defense and for giving orders in case of emergency, broadcasts test programs daily from 7:30 to 8:30 a.m. EDT.

FEW broadcasts have caused more tear-filled eyes and choked-up throats than those halting, awkward conversations between British refugee children in the United States and their parents at home in England. (Listen this Sunday, 1 p.m. EDT, NBC.) And if listeners who have come away from the radio with tears in their eyes could enter the NBC studio in New York, where a little band of children like those shown here, who haven't seen home in many months, lean eagerly toward a microphone, with earphones clamped over their heads, they would feel more deeply still.

Yet, they would also understand that for these children and their parents the brief meeting is not tragedy and pathos; for them it is a wonderful bit of magic which brings them together. As announcer Ben Grauer shepherds his flock one by one to the mike in New York, an announcer is in BBC's London studio with a group of parents. Let Fred Bate, NBC's representative in London, describe them. "They are invited to dinner together before the program. Factory worker, industrialist, farmer—all sit down to-gether. At first there is stiffness and embarrassment. Class distinctions are sharp in England, you know. Then, shyly, they begin talking. By broadcast time, they are united by a warm bond, eager to hear the voices of their loved ones." Thus nearly two hundred children and two hundred parents overseas have trooped to the microphone for one magic moment together. Some of the conversations are lighthearted queries and answers about toys, playmates and report cards. Beneath the surface, always, there is an undercurrent of longing and home-sickness—and bravery—which leaves everybody with a lump in his throat. Here are examples of conversations.

Son: Daddy, you might send my bat over, because there is a cricket club in New York and I am going to have a knock at the net sometime.

Father: My dear boy, of course, I will send your bat over as soon as I jolly-well can.

Mother: Are you a good girl?
Daughter: I don't know; I try to be.
Mother: Darling, you have an
American accent!

Daughter: I haven't.

Mother: Margaret, do you still sleep with seventeen combs in your hair? Margaret: No, I've had a permanent.

Margaret: No, I've had a permanent. And Mummy, you are terrible in saying that; everybody will know now. I kept it a secret.





KOISCHWITZ' COCKEYED "COLLEGE HOUR"

Movie-Radio Guide exposes another Nazi broadblaster-he's a former U. S. college professor

ACH Thursday night at 9:45 p.m. EDT, Dr. Otto Koischwitz conducts his "College Hour" over Berlin short-wave stations DJB (15.20) and DJD (11.77). This program is especially directed to American college students and the so-called intellectual listeners of North America.

Dr. Koischwitz may also be heard as Mr. O. Kay in the Berlin program, "O. K. Speaking," and as Fritz in the skit, "Fritz and Fred, the Friendly Quarrelers." Dispenser of intellectual discourse, professional mudslinger or slapstick comedian, Koischwitz plays his part well. However, it is on the "College Hour" that the true Koischwitz emerges as the highly educated,

artistic and slightly mystical character that he really is.

Otto Koischwitz was born in Germany in 1902. After graduating from secondary school, he studied modern philology and philosophy at the universities of Halle and Berlin and received from the latter institution in 1924 the Ph. D. degree, his field of specialization having been German literature. Dr. Koischwitz came to the United States in 1925. He taught in the extension division of Columbia University in the fall term of 1925-26, and at New York University in the spring term of 1926. In 1928 he was appointed assistant professor in the German department at Hunter College in New York City and he remained in this rank until his resignation in January, 1940.

It is believed that Dr. Koischwitz fell under the influence of national socialist philosophy during his oneyear stay in Germany in 1935-36. During his subsequent years of teaching at Hunter College he often stated that he was violently opposed to the anti-Semitic and racial program of the Nazis. In the summer of 1939 Dr. Koischwitz took his vacation in Germany. The beginning of the war found him in Denmark. A few months later he returned to Germany and in midwinter he became attached to the staff of the German short-wave station, where he called himself Dr. Anders (Dr. Otherwise) up until June, 1940, when he revealed his true identity as Dr. Koischwitz.

In the "College Hour" Dr. Koischwitz has endeavored to put the Nazi doctrine over in a highbrow method. In the language of the classroom he often speaks on philosophical themes

or gives chats on German folklore,

culture and literature.
On the "College Hour" period of Thursday, May 22, Dr. Koischwitz began new tactics, taking up the whole program to personally address via the ether waves the famous American playwright, Eugene O'Neill. Since that date he has personally addressed, in turn, the dancer, Martha Graham, and

the author, Upton Sinclair.

To put his audience at ease and to waylay any suspicions that this was just another pretext for putting over Nazi propaganda, his first talk addressed to Eugene O'Neill was very mild and eulogistic in nature. One might easily be led to believe that Dr. Koischwitz had no other motive than to discuss and comment on the famous plays of this playwright. New and novel in form, the new program was seemingly on the level and no doubt many listeners waited with some anticipation to see to whom Dr. Koischwitz would devote his next program.

The next program opened with "Dr. Koischwitz now addressing the fa-mous American dancer, Martha Graham. Now, I don't wish to embarrass you, Miss Graham, by this personal call from the German short-wave station. I rather wish to take this opportunity to express my great admiration for your art." He continued at some great length to give an elaborate dossier on the dancer, interspersing it with several more or less personal anecdotes, also attempting to point out in what way the dancing of Miss Graham was unique and entirely original. Then he asked, "Is it really true, Miss Graham, that you like so much Nietzsche's 'Birth of Tragedy'?" He then launched into a long harangue about Nietzsche and threw in several totally irrelevant remarks about Roosevelt having moved our frontiers to the Rhine and the Danube, but that long after Roosevelt's frontiers were forgotten the famous "Frontier" dance of Miss Graham would live on and on as a work of art.

The next week it was "Good evening, Upton Sinclair. Don't be offended at being eulogized by the German short-wave station." Then followed some general remarks commenting upon Mr. Sinclair and his works. As the broadcast wore on Doc Koischwitz began to really hit his propaganda stride and ripped our good Mr. Sinclair up one side and down the other, the main peeve apparently being a book having to do with the German scholastic system which the author had written several years ago. Koischwitz continued, "If you find goose-step methods anywhere you will find them in American universities. Here we have no class cuts, no exams and no roll call." He ended by saying, "You are a pioneer, all right, Upton Sinclair, a pioneer in the field of American propaganda."

MOSCOW-BERLIN WORD BATTLE IS ON AGAIN

Berlin Reverses Democ and Nazi Hear Wodehouse Propaganda Machine On Vacation Edited by Berlin

O COMPLETELY reverse the direction of a propaganda campaign overnight is as difficult as to stop a steamroller running down-hill and then make it immediately back up the slope. This is, in effect, just what Berlin and Moscow radio propagandists had to do when Hitler suddenly gave the word that sent his panzer divisions scurrying against Red Russia—his former ally. A period of spluttering, evasion and general nonsense prevailed before Lord Haw Haw, Kaltenbach, Ward and company could get their bearings. Democ and Nazi, creators of "America Asks, Germany Answers," wisely choose this time for their vacation. Jane Anderson, Catholic fireball, didn't mention the invasion of Russia which had then started, but

did tell England that they would be better off with Capone in the saddle than Churchill, for at least Capone didn't try to preach from the pulpit. "America," she said, "is young, fine and clean, but not its government. Better for America to be sold into slavery than become a gem in a British harem." Lord Haw Haw read Hitler's declaration of war against Russia but made no comments.

Russia wasted no time in reversing its propaganda machine: "War has been thrust upon us. We must thrust this insatiable Hitler and his gangster invaders from our country Churchill in his speech called Hitler a monster of wickedness, insatiable for blood . . . Lord Haw Haw countered with, "Churchill has the impudence to pick those he once described as bloody vassals for his new allies"
. . . Berlin's Fred Kaltenbach said, "Toughie (Duff) Cooper, Grand Mogul of Churchill's Department of 'Misinformation,' has hitched his wagon to a Soviet star. England is not choosey. 'Come be our ally,' she says to Comrade Stalin, 'and all will be forgiven and no questions asked'"... "We have no enmity against the Russian people," the German propagandists state, "we only wish to destroy this nest of Jewish rulers in Moscow"...
Moscow parries with, "Hitler, like a vicious jackal, is insatiable in his desire for conquest and war." Moscow, never one to mince words or to sweeten up a horror story, recently introduced a man who had just escaped from Warsaw. His purpose, he said, was to tell the world about true conditions in that city of terror

and disease. "The people are starving; Polish residents are persecuted; the Jews are in complete degradation. Rickshaws loaded down with German soldiers are being pulled by emaciated Polish and Jewish youths; bread crumbs are being licked up from the streets; women are made to disrobe for refusing to obey minor orders. In front of my eyes, a small child was kicked to death. The world will never know peace until Hitler and his bandits are driven from the earth" . . Ian Finlay, broadcasting from London in "Britain Speaks," stated, "You are not facing Germans, you are facing Nazis. Hitler is without scruple or thought. If he wins, Germany too will be in the wilderness where all starve; where men with dripping chops will snarl at each other like beasts and twilight will descend upon civilization" . . . Moscow prom-ises, "Hitler will never lay his filthy hands on the land of Russia. His greedy brain has become feverish with the thoughts of Russia's great wealth."

So at last the bars are down and radio propagandists are baring their fangs and hurling such a barrage of naked fury in words at each other as has never been known in the history of man.

Wodehouse Joins Goebbels' Gabblers

Goebbels' bag of propaganda tricks is apparently inexhaustible. In the form of a surprise announcement, the Berlin announcer introduced a new speaker on Friday evening, June 27, with these words: "You are now about to listen to the famous writer and humorist, P. G. Wodehouse, who up to now has been in a German internment camp. Mr. Wodehouse has just completed a new novel which we understand is on its way to a publisher in the United States. He will tell you about his experiences and give you some of his impressions of Nazi Germany."

Mr. Wodehouse's little talk was quite humorous, but oh, so carefully edited by Nazi censors! He gave the impression that life in a German prison camp was not at all a bad experience; that the guards were only big, gruff boys who on the way to the camp actually allowed them to stop and buy cigarettes and to drink a couple of bottles of red wine. The writer opened his talk by saying that if he sounded a bit goofy he was actually screwy enough to stick straws in his ears because he had just been released from forty-nine weeks in a German camp—the "local lunatic asylum in northern Silesia." "There is an advantage in being in a prison camp," he said; "it keeps you out of local saloons and allows one to catch

up on one's reading . . ."

The private life of "Lord Haw Haw" exposed! Also: Cuban contest; important time changes

With the number of short-wave listeners in the United States growing as fast as sets can be installed, with more and more European broadcasters tailoring their verbal tidbits for American consumption, Movie-Radio Guide believes all short-wave listeners should know something about the personalities to whom they are listening. With that thought in mind, this revealing series of articles has been prepared to bring many of these characters from behind the mike into a spotlight most of them would rather dodge.—The

VERY Sunday, Tuesday and Friday evening at 9:30 p.m. EDT American listeners to the German Shortwave Station hear these words, "You will now be permitted to eavesdrop on a talk to England made earlier today by the world-famous Berlin commentator, Lord Haw Haw." Without further ado Lord Haw Haw, first and best known of the Berlin propagandists, begins his tirade against Churchill, capitalism and the Jews.

Lord Haw Haw speaks with a correct and cultured Oxonian accent that one might well imagine denotes a highly sophisticated and academic individual. Actually he looks like the hoodlum that he really is. Squarejawed and tough, his face bears a sinister scar cutting clear across one cheek-relic of a street brawl.

Lord Haw Haw, actually William Joyce, was born in New York in 1906. His father was an Irishman; his mother a Briton. When quite young he was taken back to Ireland by his folks and educated there by Jesuits. At the age of seventeen young Joyce became a convert to the fascist cause. He studied English literature, history and psychology at London University, where he was known as a brilliant but er-ratic student. In 1933 he joined Sir Oswald Mosley's black-shirted Fascist Union, later became its propaganda director. While in the fascist ranks he devoted most of his time to stirring up hatred of Jews. He and old comicstrip dictator Mosley didn't get along so well, however, and in 1937 he left him (it was rumored there was also a little matter of "doctored accounts") to found the British National Socialist Party, becoming its "fuehrer." During the next two years Joyce was arrested twice for being involved in political brawls. On August 25, 1939, on the eve of the war, he fled from England, taking with him all of his organization's funds and a Manchester showgirl, whom it is said he married without bothering to even divorce his former wife, an attractive ballet-dancer whom he deserted, leaving her also to support their two children. Arriving in

Berlin, Joyce became a German citizen, changed his name to "Froehlich" (meaning joyous in German), and was hired almost immediately by the German Ministry of Propaganda at a salary of \$60 a week.

During the fall of 1939 Joyce became a staff member of the German Shortwave Station and began his now famous series of talks addressed to the people of England. No one in England at that time recognized the new unidentified Berlin commentator as the renegade traitor Joyce, and his broadcasts-because of their witty, informal nature, making fun of Nazi life and of himself as well-enjoyed great popularity with the British. It was Jonah Barrington Ward, radio editor of the London Daily Express, who christened the Berlin speaker 'Lord Haw Haw." The title took on and Lord Haw Haw became a familiar by-word in England. (The first Berlin speaker to direct talks to England actually was first heard in April, 1939. Who this first "Lord Haw Haw" was no one has ever discovered, but Joyce, the present Lord Haw Haw, replaced him in the fall of 1939.) Meanwhile Haw Haw's ridiculous sketches, satires, puns and jokes were being followed on more than nine million British receiving-sets. Lord Haw Haw had fully established his listeners' confidence.

A few months later the tone of Lord Haw Haw's talks began to be imperceptibly altered. The jokes became less frequent. Politics crept into the dis-courses. Insidiously he began to un-dermine the confidence of the British people in the age-old traditions and institutions of their country.

It was about this time that Lord Haw Haw was identified as William Joyce by his deserted wife in England, who, hearing his voice over the radio, screamed, "That is my husband."

In April of 1940, Lord Haw Haw was first introduced to the American listening audience in the Berlin transmission for North America. But lacking the humor and punch of his earlier efforts, Lord Haw Haw's talks today are of little interest.

Knowing what we now do of this Goebbels mouthpiece, Americans are refusing to be taken in by his seeming logic; are not confused by his twisted interpretations of facts; are not scared by his predictions.

Rush New Radio Novelist Reports for Denmark Has Secret Links to Europe CBS from Moscow Freedom Station

S WE move ever closer to actual participation in the war, our American international broadcasters are bending every effort to strengthen and intensify their radio Links between this country and Europe. WBOS, Boston, now operating with its full power of 50,000 watts, inaugurated its new European beam antenna on July 1. The station has been broadcasting to Latin America regularly since January 1 of this year, when the station was moved to Boston from Pittsburgh, Pa. Operating on a frequency of 11.87 megs, WBOS now broadcasts daily from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. EST to Europe in French, and from 4:00 to 11:00 p.m. EST to Latin America. Further programs to Europe, in French, Portuguese and

English, will be added soon . July 4, NBC international stations WNBI and WRCA with a combined power of 100,000 watts inaugurated a regular service beamed particularly to France and England. The new antenna used on station WNBI will operate on 11.89 megs, while WRCA will continue to operate on 17.78 megs. These two antennae beamed to Europe will increase the signal strength to Europe at least four times . . . CBS is rushing two new 50,000-watt transmitters and several new directional antennae to completion at Brentwood, L. I. . . . WRUL at Boston is already providing a splendid daily program service to Europe . . . This columnist predicts that direct government operation and control of United States international stations is very near.

London's "Answering You" Program

Patterned along the lines of Berlin's well-known program, "America Asks, Germany Answers," the London radio is now broadcasting a quiz type of program, offering "audience partici-pation" to the United States. Aired on Sundays at 9:00 p.m. EST over London stations GSD (11.75) and GSC (9.58), this program consists of answers to every sort of question Americans may feel like asking about Britain and the war. Readers of MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE are invited to send in their queries (must be of an answerable nature) to the British Broadcasting Corporation, 620 Fifth Avenue, New York City. To help in identifying your letter, please put "Answering You" on the upper lefthand corner of the envelope. Specific,

friendly and authoritative answers to your questions will be given over the air by a distinguished panel of experts, which, varying from week to week, includes cabinet ministers, government officials, famous writers, foreign correspondents, as well as representatives of the common people of Britain.

General Notes

On Wednesday evening, July 9, at 9:30 p.m. EST, listeners to the German Shortwave Station were surprised to hear a broadcast of a vaudeville show put on by internees of the German concentration camp at Sanbarstal. The program had been arranged in its entirety by Henry Mollison, husband of movie actress Lina Basquette of Hollywood . . . The CBS radio commentator in Moscow is Erskine Caldwell, novelist and playwright. He and his wife were visiting a summer resort on the Black Sea when the Germans attacked the Russian frontier. There had been no radio broadcasts from Moscow prior to the outbreak of the Russo-German war since the opening of the World's Fair in New York . . . Soviet broadcasts to North America, in English, are best heard at present from 10:00 to 10:52 a.m. over RV96 (15.18); from 7:30 to 8:00 p.m. over RNE (12.00), and from 9:30 to 10:00 p.m. EST over RAN (9.60) RFL (6.83), Khabarovsk, transmits press messages, in Russian, from approximately 4:00 to 6:00 a.m. The Far East division of the Soviet network with headquarters at Khabarovsk is broadcasting pep talks and propaganda fare to Russian workers nightly from about 1:15 a.m. EST on. According to Ashley Walcott of San Francisco, these programs, some of which are relays from Moscow, are best heard over transmitters operating on 9.565 and 9.545 megs, respectively . . . HER4 (9.535), the Swiss government station at Berne, is now broadcasting daily, except Thursdays, from 7:00 to 9:15

p.m. EST . . . At the time of writing, TAP (9.465) at Ankara, Turkey, is transmitting a special press bulletin to the New York Times daily, starting at 6:00 p.m. EST. The dispatches, which vary in length from 400 to 3,000 words, are read by Ray Brock or C. L. Sulzberger, war correspondents for the New York paper . . . Of special interest to amateurs is the decree of the FCC on July 9 which makes an additional 400 kilocycles available for voice communication on the ten-meter band. Radiotelephony is now authorized on the amateur band 28.1 to 30 megs instead of the 28.5 to 30 megs as heretofore. Almost immediately, should the United States enter the war amateur operators will be ordered to dismantle their equipment, but it is believed the government has secret plans under way to permit certain picked amateur stations to remain on the air for defense activities . "Radio Denmark" (9.71), a secret "Radio Denmark" (9.71), a secret freedom station somewhere in Denmark, may be heard broadcasting daily from 12:30 to 12:45 a.m. EST. Before signing off, "Long Live the King, Long Live Denmark," is repeated in English . . . "Freedom Forum," a new London program, consisting of a discussion of archivete. sisting of a discussion of subjects vitally concerning both the peoples of the U. S. A. and Britain, may now be heard Wednesdays at 9:00 p.m. EST over GSD (11.75) and GSC (9.58) . . . In answer to numerous requests, the Irish short-wave station operates as follows: On 6.19 megs, 7:30 to 8:00 a.m. and 3:45 to 4:30 p.m.; on 17.84 megs, 8:00 to 8:30 a.m., 12:30 to 3:45 p.m. and 4:30 to 5:00 p.m. EST.

EX-HAM ACTOR, BURLESQUE BARKER-

Here's the lowdown on Goebbels' "gagman" E. D. Ward! Also: Important changes in transmissions

N TUESDAY and Thursday evenings at 10:20 p.m. EDT, E. D. Ward (alias Edward Leopold Delaney), Berlin's "gagman," is introduced as follows: "The facilities of the German Shortwave Station have been extended to E. D. Ward. His opinions and views are his own, not necessarily those of the station." (If you believe this you'll believe anything.) Ward's dry, harsh style of speech-reminiscent of Ned Sparkswas probably acquired when he was a Manhattan burlesque barker. His lingo, strictly American, is full of slang and the kind of racy wisecracks that are considered snappy along Broadway. Example: "Roosevelt and Knox are determined to make Communism as innocent as Shirley

Temple," or, "Millions of people in the United States are no more anxious to ally themselves with Communism than the southern Democrats are to ally themselves with the Negroes."

E. D. Ward, a handsome man now in his late fifties, his once coal-black hair tinged with gray at the temples, has always been very reticent about his private life, and he tried hard to preserve his incognito at the Berlin Shortwave Station. He might well have been successful had he not inadvertently mentioned at Christmas time that he was happy to have re-ceived a postal card from his old friends, "Hal and Olive," of Glenview (a small town near Chicago), Illinois. American reporters discovered that Hal and Olive were actually Harold and Olive Kennicott, once fellow troupers of an Edward Leopold Delaney, whom they finally admitted was the E. D. Ward of the German Shortwave Station. A little judicious pumping and some subsequent sleuthing revealed most of the facts about Delaney's life.

Little is known concerning Delaney's early youth, but it is believed that he was born of a poor Irish family in southern Illinois. His acting career started in 1910 when he became Blackie in a road-show edition of "Get Rich Quick Wallingford." Mrs. Olive Kennicott-now fifty-two, still attractive—played opposite him in this road show. He left the troupe in 1915 to travel to Australia, where he became the killer in the thriller-diller drama, "Seven Keys to Baldpate." The year 1920 found Delaney back in the U.S. A., this time managing a road tour for the "Our Gang" kids. In the years that followed, Delaney held various jobs—Broadway press-agent, movie advance man and barker for a burlesque show. Although he was away from America several times, the bright lights of Broadway always drew him back to New York like a

In 1934 Delaney decided to try his hand at fiction, wrote "The Lady by Degrees," later "The Charm Girl," both racy and rather tawdry books.

DELANEY was in Europe when war broke out in 1939 and returned to the United States aboard the same ship that carried the survivors of the ill-fated Athenia. Almost immediately he scurried off to Germany, where he obtained a job working for Goebbels.

In January, 1940, Delaney (still unidentified but now calling himself E. D. Ward) first appeared on the programs of the German Shortwave Station. As a roving reporter Ward marched with the German army as it

went into Denmark, Norway, the Lowlands, France, making "supposedly" independent observations which were recorded and later broadcast over the German Shortwave Station. After the fall of France, Ward, presumably so instructed by Herr Goebbels, began to turn the major share of his attention to the United States. It was hoped that his American slang and wisecracks would appeal to his fellow countrymen. His talks thus became thrice-weekly features of the German transmissions to North America. He also doubles frequently as an actor, doing risque lines in the Berlin "Cabaret" broadcasts.

E. D. WARD is the right-hand man of Fred Kaltenbach (whom we will discuss later). Kaltenbach is the chief of the staff of Berlin propagandists who broadcast to North America. Ward's talks are simple and homely, often coarse and blunt. He calls a spade a spade (even though he usually calls the wrong spade).

In listening to Ward, remember that he is not a military expert, not a statesman, not even a keen student of international affairs but an ex-ham actor, burlesque barker and writer of tawdry fiction now employed as a clerk in Papa Goebbels' propaganda warehouse who, by catch-phrases, wisecracks and Americanisms would like to sway American public opinion.



MEET LORD HEE HAW, AN IOWA TRAITOR

Fred Kaltenbach, born in Dubuque, reviles the radio waves in behalf of Nazi Germany

RED W. KALTENBACH, chief of Goebbels' radio ravers, is a man who assumes many different roles at the German Shortwave Station. On Mondays at 9:45 p.m. he gives the "Dear Harry" broadcasts; on Tuesdays at 11:50 p.m. Fred turns historian to deliver the series "German Contributions to Making America"; on Thursdays at 11:50 p.m. he assumes the role of "Jim, the Know-It-All Canadian," in the program "Jim and Johnny"; on Saturdays at 9:50 p.m. Kaltenbach edits the "Military Review," finishing up his week's activities at 10:20 p.m. EDT the same evening with the part of "Honest American Fred" in the broadcast "Fritz and Fred."

hop, but Kaltenbach did just that. Fred was born in Dubuque, Iowa, of German-American parents. His father was a butcher. Most of his life having been spent in this country, Fred has a genuine Midwestern accent. During World War I, Kaltenbach served in the United States Coast Artillery Service, rose to the rank of lieutenant but never saw active service. In 1936 he went to Germany to do graduate work at Berlin University, subsequently receiving his Ph. D. from this institution. While in school Fred met a German girl, Dorothea Peters, who was a secretary on the editorial staff of one of Herr Goering's aeronautical magazines. After a short engagement they were married and Fred went to work in the German Propaganda Office. Assigned to the staff of the German Shortwave Station, Kaltenbach began his propaganda broadcasts before the outbreak of the present war. In May, 1939, he returned to the United States to visit his dying father, then in Waterloo, Iowa. While there he made twenty-five dollars by giving an address to the local Rotary Club. In his presentation he extolled the Nazi cause to such an extent that one of the members suggested that if he didn't like this country he should go back to Germany, to which Kaltenbach replied, "I will."

Back in Berlin he plunged into his activities at the German Shortwave Station with doubled vigor, becoming so prominent that British listeners dubbed him "Lord Hee Haw," thus putting him on the pedestal with the then popular "Lord Haw Haw." Hoping to become as popular with North American listeners as Lord Haw Haw (William Joyce) had become with British listeners, Kaltenbach accepted the title and used it in connection with most of his broadcasts. For several reasons the Lord Hee Haw business never caught on in this country, so it is seldom mentioned any more.

Kaltenbach speaks in an unemotional and clear style. Bold and blunt in his statements, he has been the author of many of the most audacious and sensational propaganda ideas that have been released from the German Shortwave Station. In his talks he tries to maintain an informal and intimate contact with his listeners, often interrupting a talk with "Don't you think?" Fred is addicted to namecalling, jingles and gag-lines. Thus, Lord Halifax becomes "St. Hooeyfax"; Churchill is "Roly-poly Windsy," and Duff Cooper is "Toughie Cooper." Kaltenbach's London is always outsmarted by "Socker Berlin."

Kaltenbach's "Dear Harry" broadcasts, the oldest and best known of his propaganda efforts, are directed to a real person, Harry Aayerman, once a schoolmate of his but now a lawyer in Waverly, Iowa. Aayerman, it is said, does not appreciate the publicity and, in fact, has been considerably embarrassed by this unwanted attention from a foreign short-wave station. At one time these one-sided conversations with "Dear Harry" back in Iowa were quite clever and witty. Now they have become pure propaganda with the pretext of talking to "Dear Harry" usually relegated to an introductory and closing line.

closing line.

The "Jim and Johnny" broadcast is especially for Canadian listeners. Jim, the Know-It-All Canadian, acted by Kaltenbach, is supported by Johnny, who is known to British audiences as "Sinister Sam." The "Fritz and Fred" program is a similar effort with Kaltenbach taking the role of Fred and old Doc Koischwitz as Fritz. These dialog programs give the two participants a chance to discuss timely subjects presumably on a debate status. Actually the opposition is so weak as to be practically non-existent while the defense has all the cards stacked in his favor.

Kaltenbach's propaganda is really no different than that of Ward, Koischwitz or Lord Haw Haw. He just gives it a slightly different slant, seeking to gain your confidence through informal, intimate presentations. Remember that actually Kaltenbach is an experienced and wily propagandist paid by the German government to make you believe things that you do not want to believe.

For some of the facts concerning Kaltenbach I am indebted to the BBC Press Service, to CBS, Time, Current History and Forum and the New Yorker.



Soviets Change Vichy Has Powerful

Ray Brock New Transmitter Speaks from Ankara

SHANGHAI short-wave listener, writing to the New Zealand DX Club, gives some interesting and little-known facts concerning radio activities in present-day Shanghai:

"Politically, Shanghai is divided into three sections: (1) The French concession under the control of the French consul; (2) the International Settlement controlled by a court of the consuls of the various nationalities making up its population but usually referred to as 'English Town'; (3) the 'Chinese area,' now largely a mass of ruins. Of course there are also subdivisions: Hongkew, a part of the International Settlement but now called 'Little Tokyo' and run by the Japanese army; and the famous 'Badlands,' a district now controlled chiefly by organized gangsters and

the gendarmerie and devoted to gambling, opium-smoking, also murder and other equally innocent amuse-

"There are approximately forty radio stations in this city of five million people-more than there are in most countries. Four of the radio stations have short-wave outlets, namely, XMHA (11.855), American-owned and operated; XGRS (12.04), a Nazi propaganda broadcaster; XIRS (11.98), an Italian-controlled station, and FFZ (12.09), run by the French. Most of the broadcast band stations are

"The American and most of the Chinese stations depend entirely on advertising for their living. Some of the stations are subsidized and thus able to put on better programs, that is, buy better records. The problem of revenue is not the only one worrying the Chinese station owner. Japanese and Chinese forces are in the field of struggle for the control of means of propaganda promotion in the International Settlement. Approached by the opposing forces the station owner is asked to cooperate, or else! If he falls in with one party, the agents of the other will shoot him on the way to the studio. If he resists and re-mains neutral, both sides are likely to go gunning after him. Some of the most prominent owners and station managers have already been killed. Even the life of a foreign radio announcer is not too dull. The one man to whom everyone in Shanghai listens -to applaud or curse-goes about his

work in a bullet-proof vest and has five bodyguards. He is Carrol Alcott, the Dakota-born newscaster who thrice daily comments over XMHA (11.855) on the political situation and the excellence of Maxwell House and U. S. Draught Ale (often heard in the United States at 8:00 a.m. EDT). His outspoken adherence to democracy in general and the Chinese cause in particular has earned him the combined hatred of the Germans, Italians, Japanese and the Chinese 'puppets.'

The different warring factions go in for malicious interference or jamming of displeasing programs. The Alcott newscasts were interrupted for several weeks last spring. A very strong ICW note came on the air when he did and stopped when his broadcast was over. About the same time a small missionary-owned station, XMHD, was jammed continuously, nobody seemed to know why. The XMHA short-wave station authorities traced the interference to a Japanese warship tied up in the river. Retaliation by jamming the two local Jap stations was threatened and a quiet statement was made to the effect that the local station had enough power to interfere seriously with short-wave broadcasting in Japan itself. The jamming has been absent to date."

All four of the Shanghai shortwave stations are being heard with fair regularity in the United States according to the following schedules: FFZ (12.04), daily to 10:00 a.m. EDT; XGRS (12.04), daily to 11:00 a.m. EDT (Nazi-dictated English news at 6:45 and 10:15 a.m.); XIRS (11.98), daily from 6:00 to 8:45 a.m. EDT, and XMHA (11.855), daily from 5:00 to 11:00 a.m. EDT.

N SUNDAYS and Thursdays at 10 p.m. EDT Berlin's human word-geyser gushes forth. In a harsh, nasal voice but with an astounding vocabulary of words, Jane Anderson, female Goebbels minion, shrieks her denunciations of communism, weaves a gory spell around her listeners. Her dramatic and oratorical outbursts—presumably aimed at the intelligentsia—are frequently illustrated with incidents so bloody, so nauseating that they make the worst episodes in such a book as "Out of the Night" sound like experiences at a Sunday-school picnic.

Like other traitors on the North

American staff of the Berlin Shortwave Station Jane Anderson was born in the United States. Little is known of her life prior to the Spanish civil war. At this time she emerged as a violent champion of the Fascist cause. Her activities in Spain became notorious. Twice she was sentenced to death, escaped both times. As the Marquesa de Cienfuegos - she had married a Spanish aristocrat-she returned to the United States. Here she stumped the country in behalf of the Franco cause, her violent attacks on the Spanish republican government being applauded by Hearst publications. Her articles appeared in Century, Harper's and Colliers. According to the magazine Friday she addressed a pro-Franco meeting in May, 1938, which was sponsored by Anne Morgan, sister of J. P., and James W. Gerard, former ambassador to Germany. Later denounced as a Fascist agent she was actually defended by certain individuals in the Department of State. As things got a bit too hot for her in this country she departed in 1939 on a "mission" to Spain.

The next that was heard of Jane Anderson was her first propaganda broadcast from Berlin, made in the spring of 1941. Hitler was her new sponsor. Always introduced as the "famous Catholic orator who was twice sentenced to death during the Spanish conflict," she presumably is independent in her utterances, does not always sympathize with the Nazi view on religion. Her sentences are long and involved, her words clipped. As she reaches the climax of her presentations she gradually works herself into a white heat, her words now tumbling over one another like logs shooting over a waterfall.

She says, "The consecrated sword

of Catholicism has been delivered to me; the Catholic church will support me in my crusade against the com-munistic menace to the world." The Hitler legions she likens to "Christian soldiers marching against the forces of anti-Christ." Continuing in the same vein she holds that "the sacred Vatican is the only voice against Soviet Russia—the universal enemy of mankind. Only one man now stands out against the red bludgeoned, mad beast of Moscow - this Stalin - at whose instance Trotsky was strangled, hung on meat-hooks and left to die as a symbol to his comrades. That man who stands out in the image of God is Adolf Hitler." Speaking of the Spanish civil war she claims that Britain, through the Rothschilds, financed the communistic campaign; claims that a Soviet commissar told her Russia has key sabotage men in every newspaper office, in every radio

station in the United States.

Jane Anderson's broadcasts are degrading and unwarranted even in the interests of international propaganda. While I do not question her personal sincerity to her cause, her methods are so revolting that I doubt if sincere religious individuals of any faith would sanction her ravings.

For some of the facts concerning Jane Anderson's life I am indebted to Friday, the CBS and the BBC Press.

With this article we conclude the series of stories about the Berlin propagandists in the North American service. I hope that we have been able to expose their—in most cases—questionable backgrounds; their traitorous attacks on their native country; their tricks and insincerity; their insistent but unsuccessful attempts to sell us the doctrines of Nazism.

The Canadian Listening Post

Canada's listening post is a war baby. The Canadian Broadcasting Corporation's news service of which the listening post forms a part was born January 1, 1941. Italy, Germany, Greece (when it was the Voice of Greece at war), Moscow, Brazzaville, Australia are regularly monitored. Sweden, Portugal, Turkey, Mozambique, Algiers, Budapest, Tokyo occasionally. At 7:30 a.m. the "waydown-under" voice gives news and talks of Australia's war effort.

The listening post is located at the CBC Shortwave Station, five miles out of Ottawa. A gray building, it squats amid grassy lawns surrounded by tall red-and-white masts. In the listening post the monitors have their own receiving-sets and operate them themselves-at least when it's fair sailing. At other times they have the help of the efficient engineers of the station. Here, seventeen hours a day, waves of news and billows of sound and fury roll in. It is the listeners' job-incidentally, they are all women-to sort out the wheat from the tares, separate the live news from the viscid mass of Goebbels' effusions.





JAPS TRAIN PROPAGANDA GUNS ON U. S. LISTENERS

Cairo Now Lutherans Broadcast BBC's Major Heard in U. S. to Occupied Countries Murray Is Composer

"RADIO TOKYO" seems to be unusually anxious for reports on reception of its transmissions in North America. Hardly a night goes by but what the announcer requests communications from its United States listeners asking that these letters be sent to the Foreign Department, Nippon Hoso Kyokai (Broadcasting Corporation of Japan), Tokyo, Japan.

"Radio Tokyo's" many super-power transmitters are quite busy these days. Twelve separate transmissions, representing a total of thirty-four hours, in sixteen different languages are radiated daily. Of this total, four and a half hours daily are devoted to propaganda broadcasts for North America. The transmission to eastern United States is sent out daily from 8:00 to 10:00 p.m. over JLG4 (15.105) and



JLU4 (17.795); the one to western United States is radiated daily from 10:30 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. over JZK (15.16) and JZJ (11.80).

Advance program announcements do not arrive in time for us to give details as to specific program features, but in general the following procedure is followed in the broadcasts for North America: 8:00 p.m., opening announcements and news in English; 8:25 p.m. (Sun., Tues., Thurs.), English report; (Mon., Wed., Fri.), English topical talk; 8:35 p.m., music; 9:25 p.m., news in Japanese; 9:45 p.m., report or talk in English; 10:00 p.m., close down; 10:30 p.m., opening announcement in English; 10:35 p.m., report and talk in Japanese; 10:55 p.m., music; 11:25 p.m., letters from home or music; 11:35 p.m., news in Japanese; 11:55 p.m., English news; 12:15 a.m. (Mon., Wed., Fri.), English talk; (Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday), English report; 12:25 a.m. (Wednesday), Let's-Tune-In Hour; (Saturday), Children's Hour; (Sunday), Japanese history series; 12:35 a.m. (Sunday), lessons on practical Japanese; 1:00 a.m. EST, close down.

Cairo Now Heard in North America

SUX (7.865), at Cairo, has been broadcasting an all-Arabic program for domestic reception for the past several years. Due to the unfavorable frequency this station was seldom heard in this country. Now, however, "Radio Cairo" has switched its transmissions to SUV, which operates on 10.055 megs. The new channel is favorable for reception in North Amer-

ica and almost the whole program from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. EST may now be heard. The broadcast begins with clock chimes; news in Egyptian is given at 3:45 p.m. EST. The station signs off with the national anthem at 4:00 p.m. EST.

General Notes

A station believed to be DXH2 (15.12), Warsaw, Poland, is being heard from approximately 6:00 to 11:00 a.m. EST . . . August Balbi of Los Angeles, Calif., writes HVJ (11.74), 'Radio Vaticano," Vatican City, broadcasts a special program for Australia, early Monday mornings from 1:00 to 1:30 a.m. EST . . . ZBW3 (9.52), Hongkong, Hongkong, is being heard with good signal strength on the West Coast from 5:00 to 9:15 a.m. EST . . . According to Roger Legge of Binghamton, N. Y., news in English is transmitted simultaneously by Finnish stations OFD (9.50), OFE (11.78) and OIE (15.19) daily at 3:50 and 7:55 p.m. EST. These news bulletins are intended primarily for reception in North America . . . LeRoy Waite, Ballston Spa, N. Y., reports reception of an air-mail registered letter of verification from "Radio Dakar" at Dakar, Senegal, West Africa. According to information given in this communication the station broadcasts daily at 7:15 a.m. EST on 6.435 and 13.355 megs, and at 2:15 p.m. EST on 6.435 and 9.41 megs. The latter frequency is the only one that has been heard in the United States. Programs from "Radio Dakar" open with the hymn "L'Infanterie de Marine" and close with "La Marseillaise" . . . The Rev. K. J. Touch, broadcasting from the Y. M. C. A. in Iceland in describing the arrival of the American convoy, stated that he and the other padres and soldiers on duty (they were only five) went down to the quay and handed out cups of British tea to the American marines. Many of them hadn't tasted tea before and found it took a bit of getting-used-to.

One soldier emptied several mugs over the quay before he acquired the taste. By dawn he had got the tea habit thoroughly, having drunk twenty-five cups.

Peeks at Personalities

Terig Tucci, Argentine conductor and composer, has been named music director of CBS' new Latin-American network . . . According to "London Calling," BBC news commentators are men of varied talents. One of them composed the national anthem of Iraq, which was first sung some eighteen years ago. He is Major Alan Murray, news commentator in the eastern service of the BBC, and it must have given him rather a thrill to read in the papers that when the regent, Emir Abdul Ilah, reentered Bagdad the strains of his composition were the signal for the cutting of a sheep's throat. Major Murray is also the composer of many popular songs, including the favorite "I'll Walk Beside You" . . . Maurice English, war correspondent recently returned from Paris, France, has joined the staff of NBC's international division and is responsible for checking news and comment for factual and objective content so that its uniformity will be assured when broadcast in six lan-



London Shuffles World Broadcasts

Experts Watch Radio Dutch East Indies Martinique's News Gets Short Wave Only

N THE first letter received from the Netherlands East Indies (commonly known as the Dutch East Indies) since the mother country was invaded by Nazis, J. J. Kolibonso of Batavia, Java, gives the following interesting facts concerning broadcast activities in those islands. All local reception is by short wave, since static renders ordinary broadcast reception impossi-ble. The following network of lowpower stations furnishes domestic reception for the native population: YDA2 (2.475), YDA3 (1.64), YDA4 (1.55), YDA5 (2.415), YDA6 (2.335), YDA7 (2.38), YDB2 (2.45), YDB3 (1.66), YDB4 (1.615), YDB5 (1.595), YDB6 (1.57), YDB7 (1.53), YDB8 (1.68). In addition, the Netherlands East Indies boasts six interna-tional transmitters—power ranges

from 1,000 to 80,000 watts for each station-for broadcasts to the outside world. They are YDA (3.04 and 7.25), YDB (9.55 and 15.31), YDC (15.15), PLP (11.00), PLS (10.365) and PMA (19.345). These stations usually operate in a network, and the approximate schedule of operation is 3:40 to 9:40 a.m., 4:40 to 6:40 p.m. and 8:10 p.m. to 1:10 a.m. CST. PMA (19.345), Bandoeng, Java, broadcasts a special program to North America daily from 6:25 to 7:25 a.m. CST.

Lozovsky-the Soviet Goebbels

According to London Calling, Alexander Lozovsky commands a larger listening audience than Lord Haw Haw or Raymond Gram Swing. Not that Lozovsky always does his own broadcasting. He has his depu-ties. Lozovsky is an old Bolshevik who has spent more years in jail than any storm trooper and for a much better purpose, He went there for his opinions in the old czerist days. He is now Soviet Vice-Commissar for Foreign Affairs. Lozovsky used to be a blacksmith; is a tall, handsome fel-low of about sixty; po:sesses a keen sense of humor of a rather grim type.

When Hitler was boasting that he would be in Moscow like Napoleon, Lozovsky said: "The difference between Hitler and Napoleon is that Napoleon reached Moscow, but Hitler must content himself with photographs of the Kremlin." Lozovsky plays tricks with Berlin. The Russian interrupter of German broadcasts is the finest radio joke of all time.

The last of Lozovsky's tricks is to drop communiques in German, Hungartan, Slovak and Roumanian over



Berlin Blasts

Fake British Station Jap Broadcasters Over 30 Stations Operated by Nazis Abuse U. S.

UR government officials have at last awakened to the fact that our international broadcast service to the Orient and to Australasia is wofully inadequate. Although we have about a dozen international broadcast stations now operating in this country, only one, KGEI, licensed to General Electric, is on the West Coast. The other stations, located in the eastern part of the country, cannot serve the Orient. Distance is too great and the path through the north polar regions plays hob with transmission. It all boils down to this, that KGEI at San Francisco is virtually our only means of reaching the vast listening audiences across the Pacific, of counteracting vigorous Japanese propaganda.

In view of the present critical situa-

tion in the Pacific it has been found absolutely essential that the United States augment its facilities for broadcasting to Asia. In answer to this problem a new international broadcast station to serve the Far East has been initiated through the cooperation of various broadcasters, the Defense Communications Board, the Coordinator of Information, and the Federal Communications Commission. The latter has authorized The Associated Broadcasters, Inc., licensee of standard broadcast station KSFO at San Francisco, to construct an international station there to broadcast to the Orient and Australia. For sixteen to twenty hours a day news and enter-tainment will be sent in English, French, Dutch, Spanish, Japanese, and possibly Chinese, Thai, Russian and Korean. Frequencies of 6.060, 9.570, 11.870, 15.350, 17.760 and 21.510 megs will be used. In some instances this will mean sharing time with other domestic international broadcast stations, such as CBS' WCBX and WCRC, New York; Westinghouse station WBOS at Hull, Mass., and World Wide Broadcasting Corporation stations WRUL and WRUW, Boston. The Costations ordinator of Information has arranged for delivery of a 100,000-watt transmitter from the General Electric Company to speed this new service.

Only a few days ago the wheels were also set in motion for adding were also set in motion for adding another 100,000-watt international sta-tion in castern United States. The World Wide Broadcasting group of Boston, operators of WRUL and WRUW, will control the new station's destinies.

Japanese Militarists Blast America

Japanese propaganda blasts aimed at this country by the Nipponese short-wave broadcasters, always blunt and undiplomatic in tone, have become increasingly abusive and threatening in trend as tension in the Pacific rises to the danger line. Tokyo's broadcasts to North America are di-rected to East Coast listeners daily from 6:00 to 9:30 p.m. over JLG4 (15.105) and JZJ (11.80); to West Coast listeners daily from 10:25 p.m. to 1:25 a.m. EST over JZK (15.16) and JZJ (11.80). In the Pacific transmission English news periods are broadcast at 10:30 p.m. and 12:30 a.m. EST. Also anti-democracy in tone are the English newscasts from "Radio Saigon" (11.775), Saigon, French Indo-China, radiated daily at 6:30 and 10:30 a.m. EST.

Anti-Axis are the English news broadcasts made over the Chinese National Station at Chungking. Tune to XGOY (9.635) at 9:00 or at 10:00 a.m. EST. Australia, quite pro-American in sentiment, broadcasts to this country three times daily: 7:20 to 8:05 a.m. over VLG2 (9.54) and VLQ5 (9.615), for eastern United States; 10:25 to 11:10 a.m. over VLG (9.58) and 12:55 to 1:40 a.m. EST over VLG6 (15.23) and VLQ2 (11.87), for western United States.

Nazis Seek to Blanket World

There is no use trying to kid ourselves. Nazi propaganda is very alive, very comprehensive and misses no bets in trying to influence world opinion. Whether or not it has missed the target in this country, don't think for a minute it hasn't done tremendous damage in some parts of the world. Keep pouring millions upon millions of words into listeners' ears and by force of repetition alone some seeds are bound to fall upon fertile ground. This is the theory which has prompted the German Propaganda Ministry, under the almost fiendishly clever gui-dance of Herr Goebbels, to build up the greatest network of international

broadcast stations the world has ever known. These stations include not only the regular Berlin transmitters but those of France, Holland, Bohemia, Poland and Belgium. I made up a huge chart last night. On it I listed all those international stations that are being used regularly by the Berlin propaganda agents. I was amazed to learn that thirty stations are being operated directly by the Germans. This is exclusive of the international stations of the other Axis partners, Italy and Japan. These thirty stations with directional an-tennae and powerful transmitters are sending out propaganda night and day to all corners of the earth and in every language you could imagine. That Berlin is particularly anxious to thrust its barbs into us is evident from the fact that eight different transmit-American service alone. These are in operation as follows: From 4:50 to 8:00 p.m. over DJB (15.20); from 8:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. over DXP (6.03); from 4:50 to 11:00 p.m. over DJD (11.77), DZD (10.543), Y (9.52) and DHE4C (11.83); from 4:50 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. EST over DXJ (7.24) and DXZ (9.57).

The mysterious station known as "The New British Broadcasting Station" (11.99, 9.75, 7.305), supposed to be operated from Great Britain by discontented British subjects, actually controlled by the German Ministry of Propaganda, probably operating from France or perhaps Berlin, can still be heard week-days from 2:30 to 3:00 p.m., from 3:30 to 4:00, 4:30 to 5:00 p.m. and on Sundays from 11:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon, 2:30 to 3:00 p.m. and from 3:30 to 4:00 p.m. EST. Quality is poor. The station signs off with "God Save the King" . . . Spook voices that break right into the middle of both British and German short-wave programs to heckle the speakers and argue with them are causing no end of annoyance in London and Berlin.



Latins Hear Moscow Station Vanished?

THERE are numerous short-wave stations in China. There are large stations and small stations; stations operated by Chinese, Japanese, French, Italian, German, British and even American interests. There is only one official broadcasting station. This is international station XGOY-XGOX, "The Voice of China," located in bomb-riddled Chungking, West China. Although its equipment has reportedly been damaged several times dur-ing air raids, this station has never been forced completely off the air and despite tremendous odds it maintains the following extensive schedule of transmissions each day (EST):

5:00 to 5:55 a.m.—To Asia on 11.90 megs (English news at 5:15 a.m.) 6:00 to 6:45 a.m.—To Japan on 11.90 megs 6:45 to 7:20 a.m.—To eastern Asia on 11.90 megs 7:20 to 8:55 a.m.—To South Seas on 5.95 megs (English news at 7:30 a.m.)

The most powerful of the independent short-wave stations in China is a newcomer, XGDN (11.93), "The Voice of Democracy," whose trans-mitter is located atop the North China Daily News Building in Shanghai. This station—extremely pro-democracy in sympathy—is supported by voluntary subscriptions from Britishers in Shanghai. XGDN is a welcome ers in Shanghai, XGDN is a welcome reply to the German Club-owned short-wave station XGRS and the Italian-supported station XIRS, both in Shanghai, XGDN operates daily from 3:30 to 10:00 a.m. EST. The BBC's English news bulletin is rebroadcast at 6:00 a.m. EST. Popular David Conway reads additional English news bulletins at 7:00, 9:00 and 0:40 a.m. EST. XGDN is heard with 9:40 a.m. EST. XGDN is heard with loud signals in western United States and with fair regularity throughout the rest of the country.

"Radio Maroc"

Letters from North Africa have been received only at very infrequent intervals since the beginning of the war. This week I received a com-munication from L'Inspecteur Princi-

pal Charge de l'Exploitation de la Radio-Diffusion, Rabat, Morocco, which includes interesting details concerning international station "Ra-dio Maroe." This station consists of two transmitters-each powered with from 15,000 to 25,000 watts-which transmit on 8.03 and 11.94 megs, respectively. The two transmitters can be used either simultaneously or separately. At the present time only the 8.03 megs frequency is being heard in the United States. The studios, transmitters and aerial towers of "Radio Maroc" are situated in an unbelievably green and beautiful tropical oasis, the dazzling white stucco buildings showing up vividly above the small palms and ornamental hedges, the whole plot surrounded by the the whole plot surrounded by the barren, shifting sands of the desert, "Radio Maroc" (8.03) operates at present from 2:15 to 2:45 a.m.; from 7:00 to 8:00 a.m.; from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m.; from 12:30 to 4:30 p.m. and from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. EST. French, Spanish and Arabic are the three languages normally employed over the station, although an English transmission is made on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays from 1:00 to 1:30 p.m. EST. News in French is broadcast daily at 2:30 a.m., 7:30 a.m., 1:30 p.m. and 3:00 p.m., with the official communique broadcast at 6:30 p.m. EST.

The other important station in North Africa, namely, TPZ (12.12), Alger, Algeria, continues to be heard daily from 1:30 to 6:00 p.m. EST, with the best reception afforded during the latter two hours of the

New CBS Latin-American Network Nearing Readiness

CBS' new inter-American network will be functioning by the first of the year, according to Edmund A. Chester, CBS director of short-wave broad-casting and Latin-American relations. Affiliation contracts have been successfully negotiated with seventy-two stations to date and deals with additional stations below the U. S. borders are now under way. Construction has already passed the eighty-five percent mark on the two 50,000-watt transmitters CBS is building for its Latin-American network. The two new transmitters-WCBX and WCRC-are located on a big tract at Brentwood, Long Island: Their eight directional antennae are designed exclusively for transmissions south of the United



FM Network Planned

Hitler's Worthless Promises Bared on U.S. Short Waves

R. A. F. Gets Girl Friend

AT4 (9.125) has been providing an interesting program service to North America for several years. Two factors have kept this program from being as valuable as it otherwise might have been. It came on at too early an hour and the English features-including English news bulletins-weren't scheduled at any regular set times. Over a year ago I mentioned these two facts to one of the Hungarian consular officials in this country. Starting November 1, these two faults of the Budapest programs were remedied. On that date the timing for the transmissions was changed and regular set program features were inaugurated. Under HAT4's (9.125) new streamline policy the transmissions for North America are broadcast nightly from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. CST.



Nightly features are now as follows: 7:03 p.m., news in Hungarian; 7:20 p.m., news in English; 8:10 p.m., review of the press and details of the following day's programs, in Hungarian; 8:25 p.m., "Spotlight on the News" and details of the next day's broadcast, in English; 8:40 p.m., news in Slovak and Ruthenian. In addition, regular weekly features will include: Sundays, 7:40 p.m., "Messages to Overseas Hungarians," in Hungarian; 7:50 p.m., in English; Mondays and Fridays, 8:35 p.m., news in Esperanto; Wednesdays and Saturdays, 7:40 p.m., Hungarian newsletter, in Hungarian; 7:50 p.m. CST in English. The programs from Budapest also include some very fine musical features, such as Hungarian folk-songs, operatic arias, symphonic renditions

"Hitler Betrayed by Himself"

"Hitler Betrayed by Himself" is the title of a new series of very interesting programs offered by NBC Sundays at 11:30 a.m. over WNBI (15.15) and WRCA (17.78) and at 9:30 p.m. CST over WRCA (9.67).

The program is based on Hitler's own writings and speeches since the publication of his "Mein Kampf," written by Count Roussy de Sales, outstanding American journalist, and Fernand Auberjonois. One voice presents Hitler's promises and the other voice recalls his performances, so that listeners throughout the world may evaluate for themselves Hitler's propaganda strategy in relationship to his actions.

Such subjects as the following are dealt with: Hitler and Stalin, Hitler and Chamberlain, promises to France,

Hitler and Norway, Hitler and representative government, etc.

American FM Network Planned

Few readers will realize that FM radio, which a couple of years ago was totally unknown, has already progressed to the point where plans are being pushed for a Coast-to-Coast web which will have outlets in more than forty principal cities, with approximately seventy-five percent of the national population living within the proposed service areas.

The American network, FM's first chain organization, has filed its application for a key outlet in New York City. The new station, if approved by the FCC, will be located in the Lincoln Building, with transmitter and

radiating antenna at the same site.

Already operating are two of the network's stations in New England—W43B and W39B—which have a combined coverage capable of reaching ninety-three percent of the population in those six states. W53PH, Philadelphia, another outlet of the American network, will soon make its debut.

Other stations of the chain already on the air with daily schedules but not as yet linked up for program exchange, are W47V, Nashville; W55M, Milwaukee; W45D, Detroit; W51R, Rochester, and W45CM, Columbus. In addition, W41MM, on the summit of Clingman's Peak in western North Carolina, will be operating shortly.

Meet Robert Harris, Announcer

How many of you when listening to the news bulletins from London have recognized the voice of one of the announcers? You are right, it is none other than Robert Harris, the man who played opposite Jane Cowl in New York in Noel Coward's "Easy Virtue," opposite Peggy O'Neil in Barrie's "Little Minister" and as Oberon in "A Midsummer Night's

Robert Harris is slight, quiet, has aquiline good looks. Born in Somerset in 1900, he went to Sherborne and Oxford, where he took English literature. He did some bits in the Oxford Dramatic Society productions, liked it, went on to the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art, got his first important part in one of the early Clemence Dane plays.

Too young for the last war—too old for this one, Harris wanted to do his share, joined up with the BBC as a news reader in 1940. Harris has been in America several times; has played in Washington, Philadelphia, Chicago, Boston and New York.





Cecil Brown Defies Death on Battleship "Repulse"

CBS correspondent Cecil Brown's eye-witness description of the sinking of H. M. S. Repulse?

Aboard the Repulse during the actual attack, himself one of the rescued survivors, Brown kept a minuteby-minute diary of the terrible event from the time the ship's loudspeakers first bawled out a warning of approaching Japanese bombers until he found himself swimming around in the suffocating, oil-coated waters of the South China Sea.

Brown scribbled furiously away while wave after wave of high-level and torpedo bombers alternately flew over and attacked the valiant vessel, while great gaping wounds opened in her funnels, then in one side, then the other. Calmly he made a record for posterity while bombs burst on every side, while every gun on the great ship blazed away, while the loudspeakers warned, "Blow up your life-belts." Only when the loudspeakers uttered, "Abandon ship—God be with you," did he snap shut his notebook and, after throwing off his shoes, calmly slide into the murky, oilcovered waters.

Picked up later in an exhausted and semi-conscious state, Brown laconi-cally remarked that his most bitter regret was leaving his new portable typewriter aboard the doomed ship, also, he wondered why not a single British fighter-plane showed up to give succor to the brave ship as she battled unsuccessfully for her life against overwhelming odds.

Not Scared-Just Out of Breath!

Then there was NBC's scoop pick-up from Manila during an actual bombing attack on the city. The scene was de-scribed from the top of the building that houses the studios of KZRH, NBC's affiliate in Manila. The gasping breathlessness of the announcer was not due to terror or alarm but to the fact that the elevator-boy had run out on them and he had been forced to run up eight flights of fire-escape. Got quite a kick out of hearing the balance of the raid-story direct from Manila after the network had cut it

Heard "Dr. Fu Manchu" Hitler's war-declaration speech over the Berlin radio, also that of his "echo" over the Rome radio. What capped the climax was London's word-for-word rebroadcast of both Hitler's and Mussolini's speeches for domestic reception. The average Englishman thinks that any language that he can't understand is funny, but this, coupled with Herr Hitler's screaming and Mussolini's blustering, actually "rolled them in the aisles."

About Face, Goebbels!

German propaganda has made a right-about-face. Up to America's entry into the war, Great Britain was solely to blame for everything, and, according to Berlin, warmonger

Churchill's one aim was to make the United States a part of the British Empire. But now the story is so different. Today Roosevelt is the deepdyed rascal that is solely responsible for the world plight. For England they have composed a song entitled, "It Is Now Just State Number Forty-Nine." Our one aim is to make England state number forty-nine. "Are you Britishers or forty-niners?" they ask the British. They even pulled a story out of the hat to the effect that in the Near East the Australian and English soldiers were fighting among them-selves, the "Aussies" claiming that the British have sold out to America, that they are "forty-niners."

International broadcasters, rising splendidly to the emergency, are broadcasting twenty-four hours daily. breaking into regular programs whenever news flashes come in. News room at almost any hour of the day or night resembles the editorial room of a metropolitan daily just before deadline. Short-wave listening-posts have added extra shifts and are doing yeoman duty in bringing latest news direct from the trouble spots of the world. Busy program-directors are rushing additional foreign broadcasts into their upset schedules.

Pacific Short-Wave Stations Gird for Action

rently XGOY broadcasts to the United States from 6:00 to 7:00 a.m. on 5.95 megs (heard poorly) and from 7:05 7:25 a.m. PST on approximately 9.495 megs (receives interference from XEWW, Mexico City) . . . Strategi-cally located between the Manila and the Singapore fronts, news from Saigon, French Indo-China—even Saigon, French Indo-China — even though Axis-dictated—is of considerable importance. The press bulle-tin broadcast over "Radio Saigon" (11.775) daily at 7:45 a.m. PST comes through with surprising strength. Station signs off at 8:00 a.m. with the "Marseillaise."

European Broadcasting Front

Simultaneously with Russia's astonishing swing from defeats to victories on the military front also came a decided improvement in reception from the U. S. S. R. The English period, 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. PST, now announced as Kuibyshev Calling, instead of the former Moscow Calling, is at the time of writing being heard on 15.23 megs. My belief is that the broadcasts are again originating from Moscow trans-mitters, repair of the damage done by Nazi bombs presumably having been made. Confirming this improvement in signal strength, CBS recently picked up Kuibyshev for the first time in two weeks.

Iowa, notifies me that mail service to that country has been suspended, his registered report to SVM sent last April 2 having been returned after inspection by a German censor, whose swastika emblem appears on the envelope.
