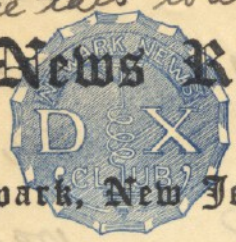

Your report here was qsa 5 r 9 and fb. both on phone es C.W.

The receiver here is a seven tube super built by hallicrafter and wrks. vy fb. but it does not have cristal filter on it, I think it was about a 1935 model it has glass tubes

I will not send this letter for a day or so as I have some S W L cards on the way and as I am all out of them at the present time I will wait until they arrive and enclose one in the letter so you will know why this letter is a few days longer geting there than it should be hi.
