"GREAT IS TRUTH AND IT WILL PREVAIL"

A Tribute to the B.B.C.'s Overseas Service by
R. J. F. Boyer, Chairman of the A.B.C.

On December 18th of last year, Radio Australia broadcast a special programme in its European Service to commemorate twenty-one years of overseas broadcasting by the B.B.C. Speaking in this programme the Chairman of the A.B.C., Mr. R. J. F. Boyer, M.A., paid tribute to the B.B.C. and spoke of the power of the shortwave medium, the dangers of its misuse and the role that international broadcasting can play in the cause of permanent world peace.

ON behalf of the Australian Broadcasting Commission I would like to offer my congratulations to the B.B.C. on completing 21 years of international shortwave broadcasting. Particularly I should like to express our appreciation of the manner in which that broadcasting has been done. Perhaps the greatest tragedy of the past quarter-century has been the appalling misuse of the great inventions of science and the extension of our knowledge of the physical secrets of the world about us.

Every new power we have had has reflected as much our hatreds and antagonisms, our deceptions and selfishness, as the good that is inherent in them. This has been particularly true of international broadcasting. When our generation first found that nation could speak to nation across the rigid frontiers, immigration policies and other restrictions, it seemed that the day of international understanding had at last dawned; that we should find the common human denominator that would submerge, or at least modify the age-old antagonisms that have divided the human family.

But the facts are that hitherto the international air has been filled as much with deceptions, hatreds and national bitterness as with matter designed to create the one world of our dreams. It is in this context that the record of the B.B.C. has been so understanding. We in the distant parts of the world have heard its voice devoted to a sober and fair presentation of the facts of the day and to the deficiencies of our common human life in a manner which has been unexcelled from

any other quarter. Here in Australia for many years we were glad to accept the B.B.C. as the most reliable and non-partisan voice on the international air, and its bulletins formed an integral part of our own domestic Australian radio. Indeed, with the development of our own news service in more recent years, we are still happy to rebroadcast to Australia daily the voice of Britain.

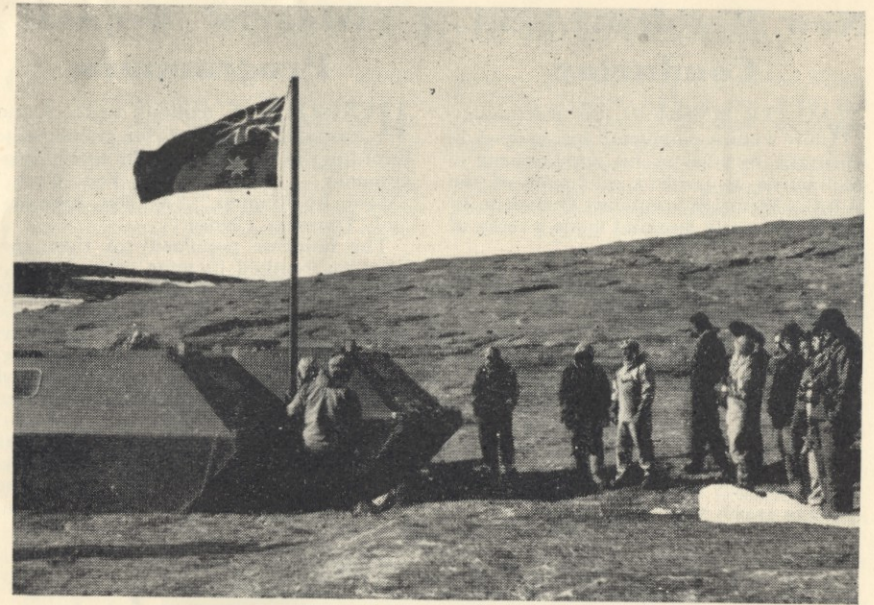
What this has meant not only to us but to a world torn with dissension is beyond one's assessment, but it is fair to say, that the B.B.C. has gone nearer to using the international air for the highest purposes and in the cause of eventual peace than any other agency. For this, all of us the world over, and particularly those who have gone through the deep waters of tribulation in recent years, should be eternally grateful. That the B.B.C. has maintained its faith that a sober and restrained presentation of current affairs was a greater contribution not only to the world but to Britain itself than a course of unceasing propaganda, is a record of which any organisation, or indeed any country might well be proud.

Perhaps our appreciation of the B.B.C.'s record is best proven by the fact that we of the A.B.C. have modelled our own international service on the same lines. The Australian Broadcasting Commission, and indeed I am sure all Australians are confident that the B.B.C. will go into the future gathering increasing confidence of all its hearers through its simple belief

AUSTRALIAN FLAG RAISED ON ANTARCTIC CONTINENT

ON February 13, scientists of the Australian National Antarctic Research expedition raised the Australian flag on the Antarctic Continent, and named their new station after the famous Australian polar explorer, Sir Douglas Mawson.

Mawson is on the coast of Australia's 2½ million square mile Antarctic territory, at latitude 67 deg., due south of Karachi; and in their first year there the scientists will concentrate on exploration and mapping, geological surveys and meteorological observation. Their work will supplement that already begun in this region at the other permanent Australian stations on

Heard and Macquarie Islands. At Mawson they have erected huts on the fringe of the plateau ice, on an outcrop of rock sloping up 200 yards to form a natural amphitheatre. There it joins the solid blue sheet ice which rises steeply to 3000 feet in the next ten miles, with great peaks of Antarctic littoral towering over the ice plateau.

Radio Australia transmits a special weekly programme to the bases of the Australian National Antarctic Research Expedition; and talks by the Expedition's leader, Mr. P. G. Law, are broadcast from time to time in the General Overseas Service.

New Resident A.B.C. Conductor

WALTER SUSSKIND, the internationally known conductor has arrived in Australia to take up his appointment in Melbourne as resident conductor of the A.B.C.'s Victorian Symphony Orchestra. In London recently Susskind made a series of gramophone recordings for the privately owned Bartok Company founded by the son of the composer Bela Bartok, to record the works of his late father.

Susskind had also just completed a season of forty concerts in Israeli with the Israeli Philharmonic Orchestra, which is shortly to tour Europe.

In a press interview upon arrival in Australia Susskind said that he had tremendous respect for the musical appreciation of Australian people and was looking forward to his stay. Radio Australia will broadcast many of Susskind's Melbourne concerts during the present winter orchestral season.

PICTURED on the front cover of this edition is talented twenty-one year old Sidonie Goossens, daughter of the distinguished British composer-conductor Eugene Goossens, conductor of the A.B.C. Sydney Symphony Orchestra. For the past three years Sidonie has played second harp in the Sydney orchestra.

She studied in New York for four years with Salzedo and also took harp lessons from her famous aunts, Sidonie and Marie Goossens, her father's sisters. Father has since supervised her music studies.

Listeners' Request Programmes

HUNDREDS of requests reach Radio Australia every week for gramophone recordings to be played in the special programmes — "Music While You Work," "Music by Request," "As You Like It," and "Listeners' Choice."

The immense popularity of these sessions has resulted in some delay in playing listeners' selections. It is not possible to give a firm date for broadcasting the items, but the Radio Australia announcers do inform listeners "on the air" in the respective sessions, one week in advance, of their intention to call the people concerned.

This arrangement appears to work satisfactorily and Radio Australia looks forward with a great deal of pleasure to continue receiving these request items from its overseas listening friends.

Richard Aspinall Gifted Broadcaster

A.B.C. broadcaster and scriptwriter Richard Aspinall is one of the most gifted figures in Australian Radio.

Young, and enterprising, he recently travelled to England by car with his wife, reporting his experiences back to Australian listeners in a series of broadcasts titled "Overland to London."

His journey covered India, Pakistan, Turkey, Afghanistan, Greece, Persia, Yugoslavia, Austria, Germany and France, and in each country he recorded the sights and sounds of the everyday people he met, interviewed the leading national figures, and brought to Australian listeners an understanding of the scene and of the historical background to the countries he visited.

Radio Australia has engaged Richard Aspinall to present a new series of "Travelogue" features. He will draw on the rich store of material he has brought back from his overseas tour to take our listeners on conducted tours of other lands, to see the sights, find out how the people live, and hear examples of their national music.

"Calling Asia"

New Series of Programmes

THE "Calling Asia" programme now takes in two additional talk features designed primarily for Asian listeners. None of the former, well tried, features has been removed in consequence, but a certain rearrangement of the schedule has been found necessary.

In the Monday programme the two regular Asian commentators continue their surveys of the Australian scene in "My Life in Australia" (Minda Feliciano) and "Diary of an Asian Student" (Laksira Jayasuriya).

The other Monday talks are contributed by Asian, Australian and other speakers commenting on matters of Asian interest, under the title "Report to Asia."

Tuesday brings (in alternate weeks) a revival of "Students' Talking," which attracted much attention in 1953.

The other Tuesday Feature is "Australian News Letter," hitherto heard on alternate Fridays. This session of brief reports giving news of the activities of Asian visitors and comments on Australian events, provides opportunities for families in Asia to hear the voices of sons and daughters speaking from Australia.

"Introducing the Australians"

FOR Wednesday we have a new series of talks, "Introducing the Australians," written and presented by Frederick Howard, a leading Australian journalist and author.

There are twelve talks in this series — divided broadly into two groups. The first deals mainly with money, and the things it will buy. The second group of talks will deal broadly with social and community life courtship and marriage divi-

sion of household duties, domestic architecture in town and country, education, the political and legal system and so on.

Frederick Howard is leader writer for "The Herald," one of Melbourne's largest daily newspapers. He served with the Australian forces in the Middle East and New Guinea, and was Liaison Officer Allied GH.Q., EWPA 1943-44. He has contributed numerous short stories in British, American and Australian magazines and has published five novels, the last of which was selected as English Book Society choice.

International Student News Bulletin

THE national unions of students of all the nations represented at the Fourth International Student Conference at Istanbul, Turkey, in January of this year, resolved to support a "Centre of Documentation."

One project agreed upon for the centre was the organisation of broadcasts on a regional basis in various countries.

The National Union of Australian University Students undertook to launch this project in the "Austral-Asian" region and engaged the interest of Radio Australia.

Hence "International Student News Bulletin," the second of the two new "Calling Asia" features, broadcast on alternate Fridays. It includes items of interest arising from the activities of the N.U.A.U.S. such as the Annual Congress and Debating Tournament, the Art Exhibition and the working of Travel, Exchange and Faculty Bureau.

The Bulletin highlights one or two items each fortnight and contains as well brief news items of international student interest. It is planned to turn the spotlight as often as possible on news items direct from Asian universities, and the N.U.A.U.S. invites contributions from national student bodies in Asian countries.

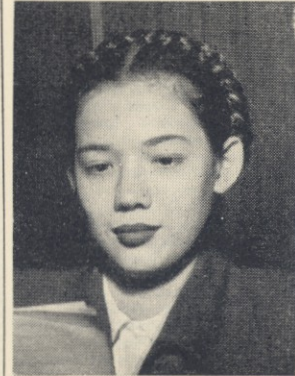



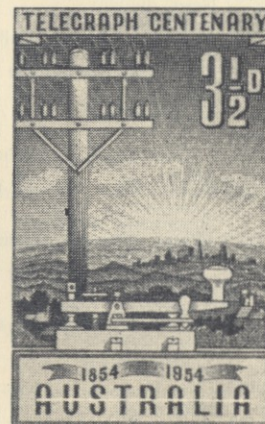

Telegraph Centenary Stamp

A SPECIAL 3½d. postage stamp was issued at all Australian post offices on April 7, 1954, to commemorate the centenary of the Telegraph in Australia.

The Australian Postmaster-General (Mr. Anthony) said that the first telegraph line erected in Australia, between Melbourne and Williamstown Victoria, was in operation in March, 1854, just one hundred years ago. Since this historic event the Australian telegraph network has steadily developed until today there are more than 904,000 miles of telegraph channels which extend to all parts of the Commonwealth.

The design of the commemorative stamp symbolises the function of the telegraph system in providing communications over the great distances of the Australian continent.
