The 'Down Under' DX Circle (DUDXC), newly established in April 1975, hopes to add an extra dimension to DX listening as now practised in Australia and the southern hemisphere. If you take a look at the pages which follow, you will see that we are especially catering for the Asian area. In fact, our aim is to particularly cover these regions:

Indonesia

China

USSR

Out-of-band.

In general, we will concentrate on:

The tropical bands, plus high frequency regional broadcasters;

Logging schedules of stations from which up-to-date information is hard to come by;

Band surveys.

Up until recently, Australian DXers have relegated to a poor third their listening to Asia, preferring the more distant fields of Africa and Latin America. However, the keen interest in Asia shown by DXers in other parts of the world puts us at an advantage, since we are favourably placed geographically to closely note most Asian changes occurring on the shortwave bands.

DUDXC makes no apology for being a specialised DX group. We have few members, and intend to keep it that way. "Shortwave listeners" will probably find little interesting in the information provided here. On the other hand, DXers all over the world (and not just 'Down Under') will be able to pick out useful items to supplement their own DX listening. That is the whole purpose of a DX bulletin.

Ideally, it would be preferable that DUDXC produce a newsletter each month. Unfortunately, those running DUDXC are tertiary students, and cannot permanently afford the time to study, DX, and operate a DX organisation, without something giving way. Therefore, the 'Down Under' DX Survey will appear only every three months or so, inbetween exams and essays. Despite this disadvantage, we believe we can provide a valuable and current information service concerning Asian DX.

MEMBERSHIP. If any readers wish to participate in this new venture, please write to the above address. We would appreciate a few more members in Australia and New Zealand. Consider joining DUDXC only if you are prepared to contribute in a substantial way every couple of newsletters (i.e. once every 6 months), or even for each newsletter, if possible. Membership of DUDXC will be free. If you just want more information about DUDXC, we will be happy to pass it along. Return postage is always helpful for enquiries, as we are operating to a broken shoe-string budget.

THIS EDITION OF DUDXS - contains two band surveys. The first, from 3400-4000 kHz, includes a comprehensive list of out-of-band Indonesian stations (mostly Radio Pemerintah Daerah) which have been logged over the past month or two. Although several remain to be identified, it is still a useful guide for future identification efforts. The second survey, from 6200-7100 kHz, is exclusively out-of-band, and focuses on broadcasts from the People's Republic of China. Monitoring of Radio Peking and the PLA has been carried out since the beginning of April, when those stations revised their schedules. Apart from the surveys, there is a list of addresses for Radio Pemerintah Daerah stations, and a list of verification signers for all types of Indonesian broadcasters. On top of all this, a resume of Asian DX happenings!

Finally, many thanks to those Australian and New Zealand DXers who have encouraged us so much. Your enthusiasm is truly welcome.

As far as most DXers are concerned, the most interesting part of this survey is the Indonesians. Only about one third of them in the area 3400-3900 have been identified, which shows just how much work remains. According to a list of Radio Pemerintah Daerah stations received by David Foster, there are nearly 30 RFD's from 3400-3900.

Identifying them is none too easy. Firstly, overall reception is irregular, with perhaps only one or two nights a week which can be called satisfactory. Then stations are not on the air every night, or some might be heard only once anyway. How is one to know whether a station on one night might not be the same one the next night 20 kHz or more away?

Several RFD stations have been identifying in a slightly different manner over the past few months. For example, Pasuruan ID's as: Inilah Radio Khusus Pemerintah Daerah Tingkat Dua Kabupaten Pasuruan. Tingkat Dua means Level Two, and refers to the status of kabupaten's (districts), which are placed at the second level in government structure. Variations occur within ID's as well, e.g. Radio Daerah Kabupaten Bandung (2505). On top of all that, some stations use a slogan which is entirely different from the official station name.

If you want a good reply rate from Indonesian broadcasters, one good method is to write to particular members of the station personnel. This list includes verifications signers as advised by Robert Yeo, David Foster, Geoff Cosier, and Michael Willis. The station location or name is given first, then the signer's name, his status at the station, and the year(s) in which he signed QSL letters. First, RRI's:

Several Indonesian stations have either replied to English reports or answered in English. These include: RRI's Ambon, Banjarmasin, Jakarta, Jayapura, Manokwari, Manado, Palembang, Pontianak, Surabaya, Ujung Pandang; and also Suara Gama and Radio Khusus Informasi Pertanian.

However, most Indonesian stations will in general answer only reports in Indonesian. If you would like to purchase a useful Indonesian report form, then write to the Australian Radio DX Club, P.O. Box 227, Box Hill, Victoria, Australia 3128, for details of prices. This form was compiled by David Foster, in cooperation with Geoff Cosier and Robert Yeo (all members of DUDXC). Also available from ARDXC is a very informative article by Robert Yeo entitled 'Indonesia - DXing the Unknown', describing the types of stations in Indonesia, what to listen for, and how to go about reporting.

Therefore, the survey has details of what was the situation the day before the Lon Nol government fell, and additional material appears in the statement at the end of this survey, relating to changes thereafter.  - * On the 17 April- reports had indicated the fall of Phnom-Penh by 0300, Hanoi HS appeared on 4930-4931. at 1000-1700 // 10056, 7012, 6450.
 - * On the 17th Me a vietnam on 7085 still, with the regular Saigon outlets on the air.
 - * On the 17th the clandestine (black one). on 6990, Radio Destiny of the Motherland; the Beloved Voice of Peace, was STILL ON THE AIR, AFTER Phnom Penh had definitely fallen. Heard 1300- 1530. Khmer, light mx, not the usual fare one would expect if the station had been taken over. So,... it must be not in Cambodia, but perhaps in Vietnam
 - * The Voice of the United Front of Kampuchea was still operating after the fall , but the schedule was changed. Heard 1230 - past 1500, ie extended TXion. This format has continued up to the 19 April.
 - * Liberation Radio made no changes, but earlier in month the external service had been heard on 7490 (x 7470), and 10020 // 10010. It is now back on 7470, and 10020, not there.
 - * Black clandestine Radio Liberate the Southern Part 6320, has not been heard at all after the 17/April. The VoNUTK:4675,7015,9989,10079,etc.
