ETHIOPIA Radio Voice of the Gospel (ETLF) plans a limited expansion of seven hours daily. Tests will begin in September three days a week between 0100 and 0530 on both 100 kW transmitters. The time in the target areas for the broadcasts is mainly between 0600 and 0700 a.m. local time. It will be a year until regular morning broadcasts are scheduled. Reports are invited. (RVOG News via Graham Stott, England.)

GERMANY. (DemRep.) O.P.S., Berlin, run by Radio Berlin International operates nightly 2300-2330 on 1430 and in the 41 and 49 m.b. QSL gives 6080 kc/s as the 49 m.b. frequency. Programmes are aimed for audience amongst US troops in German Federal Republic. Reports are welcomed. (Graham Stott)

GREECE. Hellenic National Broadcasting Institute, P.O. Box 30, Athens, has a new sched. effective from Sept. 5 to Nov. 6 for prgrs. in Greek only: 0700-0815 W. and Sun. 0530-0815, 0900-1000 (exc. Mon), 1030-1300, 1330-1515, 1630-1700 and 1830-1900 on 9505 and 11720, 1730-1800 and 1930-2100 on 15345 and 17745, 2200-2230 and 2300-2330 on 15345 and 11720. (HNBI, Athens)

MONACO. NOREA Radio will commence transmissions in Finnish in October, 1965, according to its Finnish Dept. Will be broadcast over Trans World Radio, Monte Carlo, on Tues. and Fri. at 1630-1645 in the 31 m.b. (Radio Sweden's Sweden Calling DX-ers)

NETH. ANTILLES. Trans World Radio, Bonaire, now has scheduled prgrs. at 1900-2215 each evening. Languages noted are: Russian at 1900-1915, German at 1930-2000 and 2030-2100, Spanish at 2100-2115, English at 2115-2145, Portuguese at 2145-2200 and French at 2200-2215. Frequency given as 15245, on which reports are requested. (Graham Stott, England) Also heard on 15170 to sign off at 0220 (SCDX, Sweden)

POLAND. English language broadcasts from Polskie Radio, Warsaw, are scheduled as follows, effective October, 65 to April, 1966: To the British Isles: 1830-1857 on 7125, 6135, 1930-1900 on 7125, 6135 kc, 2030-2000 on 7145, 5950, 2130-2155 on 7125, 6135, 2230-2300 on 7270, 9540, 1502, 2303-2330 on 227 kc/s. NEW GUINEA. VL9BR, Rabaul, testing irregularly with 250 kW on 2340. (Arthur Cushen, New Zealand)

INDIA. The external Sce. of AIR, New Delhi, to West Africa is on 7125, 9690 and 11740, and the UK Sce. is on 7225, 9915 and 11865 between 1945 and 2045. (Graham Stott)

PAKISTAN The news sce. of Radio Pakistan has been modified. There are newscats in English and Urdu at 1900 and 2000 on 11672//9615. (Graham Stott)

INTERNATIONAL WATERS. Because of interference from European stations Radio Caroline will not be putting into operation the proposed extension of both North and South stations's schedules into the late evening which has been recently announced. The South station now has a regular newsca st (not listed in 771/72) every hour on the hour. (G.Stott) Radio Scotland will start transmissions on 265 meter next month. (SCDX of Radio Sweden)

- + CUBA. New schedule of Radio Habana Cuba, effective Sept. 6: English: To No. Europe at 2010-2140 on 11735, to No. America at 0300-0430 & 0500-0600 on 6135, to So. America at 2050-2150 on 11760. (W. Dickerman) In Spanish to the Med. Zone (So. Europe): 1900-2030 on 11705, 0630-0700 & 0830-0900 & 1030-1045 on 11705. In portuguese to So. America at 2300-0000 on 15340. (Francis A. Duran, New York, USA)
- + FINLAND. From Nov. 5 the fortnightly DX-prgr., produced by DX-Alliansen, over Radio Finland will be entirely in English in order to reach DX-ers outside Scandinavia. The new prgr. will be called SweDX and aired as follows: Fri. 1645-1700 on 9555/11805/15185 and 2145-2200 on 6120. Sat. 1300-1315 on 9555/11805/15185. Remember that the prgr. will only be broadcast fortnightly, commencing on Nov. 5. Reception reports and suggestions are welcome to SweDX, Fack, Bromma 1, Sweden. If one IRC is enclosed reports will be confirmed by 3 QSL-cards. (Allians News)
- + GHANA. Ghana Broadcasting Sces. heard lately on 9545, replacing former 9760, at 0800 in English, announcing as General Sces. Not heard for some time on 17910 nor 11800. (August Balbi, Los Angeles, Calif., USA)
- + GREAT BRITAIN. BBC-2 extends its coverage from Sept. 12 with the opening of channel 51 (UHF) TV transmitter at Wenvoe. (Graham Stott)
- + GUIANA (French). Radio Cayenne on 6170 now opens at 0913 with guitar identification. (Bob Hill, Boston, Mass., USA)
- + JAPAN. (cf. bull. 775) According to Radio Japan News, 6140 is also to replace 11940 at 2200 and 2300 in the General Services. (W.O. Dickerman)
- + LEBANON. The second prgr. of LBS in Arabic/English/French is now on 7380. English: 1500-1700 and French at 1700-2000. (Graham Stott, UK)
- + MALAYA. Radio Kuala Lumpur moved to 5035 from 5060 kc/s. Heard with ID at 1400. (August Balbi, Los Angeles, USA)
- + NETH. ANTILLES. Trans World Radio, Bonaire, announces that they will be broadcasting in English on 15245 to Gt. Britain. At present test prgrs. are being broadcast, but will be followed by regular prgrs. at 2115-2145, followed by Portuguese prgrs. (Malcolm R. Peddar, England) Heard testing in English 1800-1900 on 15180, announcing //another 15 mc freq. on Aug. 30. Heard irregularly at 1430 on 11820 in English. (August Balbi, USA)
- + SINGAPORE. Heard on new freq. of 5050 (previously 5035). ID at 1400 as Singapore with commercial & English lang. news. Also noted on 11940 sign on, return 0930 on Weekdays only. (August Balbi)
- + TURKEY. Radio Ankara can now be heard as follows: German 1830, French 1900-1930, English 2200-2230 s/off on 15160. (August Balbi, USA)
- + WINDWARD ISLANDS. Windwards Isl. Television is expected to start operating by Nov. 1966, one year after the WIBS is expected to go commercial (in Nov. 1965). WIBS is supposed to begin commercial operations in time to cash in on Christmas broadcasting. (West Indian DX-ers Ass.) WIBS now on 15130 (formerly 15100) with s/on at 1950 local news. BBC News Relay at 2000. (August Balbi, USA)
- + INTERNATIONAL WATERS. The sched. given in bull. 771/72 for Radio City gives times in BST. Please deduct 1 hour in Summer for GMT times. (Graham Stott) - Radio City has left 1615 kc/s, and is now putting out 13 kW on 1033 kc/s daily at 0500-1800, but has been noted until s/off at 2300 on a Sat. Station expected to move from the fort to a recently bought 162 foot schooner. (SCDX of Radio Sweden) Radio Caroline South has occasionally hourly time checks and station identification in Dutch and sometimes also ann. in French (G. Stott)
- + CLUB NEWS Scandinavia DX-Contest 1965 open to all DX-ers in No. Europe will take place during October 1-3, 1965. Further details available from The DX-Companions, Box 35, Hellestad, Sweden. (SCDX of R. Sweden)

- + AUSTRALIA. The DX-prgr. "The World at Your Fingertips" is now broadcast at 1235 on Sun. over m.w. station 3NE, Wangaratta, Vict. on 1600 kc/s. (Padula, N.Z. DX Radio Ass., Victorian Branch)
- + CAMEROON(Fed.Rep.) Radio Garoura is now broadcasting Mon.-Sat. at 1645-2200 & Sun. 1100-2200 on 500. Languages used: French/Hausa/Foulfouldé. (N.Z. DX Radio Ass, Victorian Branch, Australia)
- + CAPE VERDE ISL. CR4AC, Radio Berlavento, Sao Vincente, now fades in around 2200 on 3930. Has news in Portuguese 2230-2245; presumably still signs off at 2400. (Bob Hill, Boston, Mass., USA)
- + DAHOMY. La Voix de la Revolution, Cotonou, noted on the new and rather odd freq. of 7365 on 6/IX from 1925 past 2045. Was dual 9650 after 2015. Not heard on 7365 when checked 10/IX; maybe only test.(Hill)
- + ECUADOR. During the last week a change has been noted in the European sched. of HCJB. The German prgr. has been replaced(at 2100-2130) by an English prgr., and the German prgr. is now being aired at 2000. NJJ says that freq. are 11755/15115, whereas MRP reports them to be 15115/11915. NJJ freqs. are announced freqs. Changes may apply to other lang. broadcasts also. Further details requested. (N.J.Jensen, Frederikshavn, Denmark and Malcolm R. Peddar, England)
- + INDIA. The Arab Sce. of AIR, New Delhi, at 0500-0530, was noted on 8/IX on 15225, but later checks on 13 & 15/IX shows freq. to be approx. 15200-15205. Probably replaces 15170. (N.J.Jensen)
- + JAPAN. A new freq. in Radio Japan's General Sce., viz. 9560 is being used at 1200-2030, replacing 9740, although not scheduled until October, 65. Has been used since the beginning of Sept.(N.J.Jensen)
- + LEBANON. According to R. Australia, Radio Beyrouth can now be heard in English to No. America at 0230-0300 on 9710. (H.P. Stumvoll, Austria)
- + PORTUGAL. (cf. bull. 777) The planned German lang. transmission is not mentioned in the Oct. edition of R. Portugal Radio Magazine. It was only in a circular the stations stated 2145 without mentioning GMT or CET. Apparently explains the different times. (H.P. Stumvoll)
- + REUNION. RTF, St. Denis, listed incorrectly in WRTH65 as 2246. Should read 2446. Can be heard in parallel with 3250. (The Victorian DX-Listener, Vict. Branch of the N.Z.DX Radio Ass., Australia)
- + SYRIAN ARAB REP. Syrian Broadcasting and TV has placed an order with Telefunken in Germany for two new medium wave transmitters of 100 kW each. Are to be placed in Saboura and Sarakeb. (Kirsche & Rundfunk)
- + UNITED ARAB REP. (EGYPT) Also Radio Cairo is supposed to have started using a new short wave transmitter of 250 kW, according to East European sources. (Kirsche und Rundfunk, Germany of Sept.11)
- + USSR. Radio Dushanbé, Tadshik SSR, operates on 4635, rather than on 4640 as listed in WRTH. Heard repeatedly around 0030-0045 in Russian. (Bob Hill, Boston, Massachusetts, USA)
- + YEMEN. Radio Sanaa is closing at 2115 instead of scheduled 2200. Also heard at 0315 or thereabouts. (Bob Hill, USA)
- + VENEZUELA. YMRW, Radio Boconó listed on 500 at 2340-2358. At 2358 ID for YVRW on 500, YVOW on 1360 (both the call signals and freqs. are different from WRTH), and 93.7 mc FM (9/IX) Prgrs. in Spanish. Says that it is affiliated with Radio Valera also. (Bob Hill)
- + INTERNATIONAL WATERS. A new pirate station, Radio Ceaser, with 500 watts, has been reported testing on 196 meters. (Roy Patrick, England via Radio New York Worldwide's DX-ing Worldwide, USA)
